The department's total operating budget for Fiscal Year 2023 was \$1,330,019,600. Cost increases for this operating budget totaled \$105,206,400 for Medical Contract, Behavioral Health Contract, Food Services Contract, Private Prison Contract, Pharmaceuticals, Salary Increases for Correctional State Officers, Private Prison Correctional Salaries, Re-Entry Success Act of 2021 -Year 2, Re-Entry Success - Identification Documents, Re-Entry Housing, Correctional Education Investment, Medication-Assisted Treatment, Substance Abuse Treatment, Sex Offender Treatment Program, Evidence-Based Programming, Hepatitis C Treatment Standards, Static Risk Offender Needs Guide (STRONG-R), Hi-Set, Special Agents, Electronic Security Systems Specialists, Body Scanners, Radios, Protective Vests, Technology Replacement, Analysis Software, Automated External Defibrillators, Center for Employment Opportunities Memphis -Re-Entry Job Training, Dismas House-Men's Re-Entry Program, LIFEline to Success - Re-Entry Support Services, Lipscomb University LIFE Program - Correctional Higher Education, Men of Valor -Re-Entry Support Services, Persevere -Coding in Corrections, Project Return - Re-Entry Job Training and The Next Door - Environmental Upgrades for Correctional Release Center.



FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS (FAQ)

Q: How is the felon recidivism calculated?

A: The felon recidivism rate is based upon the # of unique felons released from incarceration and the number of those unique felons who subsequently return to incarceration within three years of release.

Reincarceration is considered recidivism and is tracked in the Tennessee Offender Management Information System (TOMIS). Please note that reincarceration counts both offenders who are arrested and placed in jail who have not been found guilty of a crime, as well as offenders who are convicted of committing a new crime.

For instance, 16,558 unique offenders were released statewide from incarceration during calendar year 2014. A total of 7,827 of those unique offenders released from incarceration in calendar year 2014 returned to incarceration by the end of calendar year 2017. Therefore, the recidivism rate for unique offenders released from incarceration in 2014 is 47.27%.

Q: What does unique offender mean?

A: Unique offender refers to a single person and measures recidivism for the three-year period following the unique offender's release from incarceration. A unique offender is considered a recidivist upon their first re-incarceration after release.


So, multiple re-incarcerations during the three-year period following release would not create a "new" unique offender or create a different recidivism outcome.

Q: How is the prison recidivism rate different from the jail recidivism rate?


A: The prison recidivism rate is based upon felons released from incarceration at one of the 14 state prisons. The jail recidivism rate is based upon felons released from county jails in Tennessee.

Q: When a felon is released from prison or jail after completing their sentence (and therefore they are not released to any type of probation or parole), then is that person tracked for recidivism purposes through TOMIS upon their release?

A: Yes. Offenders are tracked for re-incarceration whether they were released to community supervision or expired their sentence.

Causes of Death may change after the death certificate is received.


Please note that most incidents reported in the monthly summary may include more than one participant or infraction while other incidents are by definition about a single participant (ex: death or suicide).



Percent Positive Drug Tests for Prison Substance Use Program Participants by Quarter






