

OSHA 10-Hour General Industry

Description

The OSHA 10-Hour General Industry certification allows students to increase their value as entry-level workers by demonstrating mastery of the recognition, avoidance, abatement, and prevention of safety and health hazards in the general industry workplace. The program also provides information regarding workers' rights and employer responsibilities. OSHA 10 training and certification ensures that workers are more knowledgeable about workplace hazards and their rights. Students who obtain the OSHA 10-Hour General Industry certification will develop a safety mindset and acquire marketable skills for a competitive edge.

Note: Although the card students receive from OSHA will indicate General Industry, online and in-person training courses may be customized to align with specific content areas by including required core content and industry-specific modules related to Agriculture and Advanced Manufacturing.

Materials, Resources, and Implementation

For OSHA recognition, the training and testing of students **must** be carried out in one of the following three ways:

1. Students use an approved online [OSHA training test owner](#) for training and test administration.

The Volunteer State Community College OSHA Training Center is the only OSHA approved training site in Tennessee.
