### Overview

In conjunction with the 2018 Institute for CTE Educators, the department will offer a two-day mini-conference structured around postsecondary-going culture guide [A Path of Choice](#). The purpose of this mini-conference is to support district- and school-based teams in focusing on school culture as a major factor in students' postsecondary readiness and success. Educators across all content areas and grade bands are invited and encouraged to attend.

### Expected Outcomes

- Participants will articulate the role of college-going culture in supporting positive student outcomes in postsecondary education and careers.
- Participants will develop their ideal vision for strengthening the college-going culture in their school or district to better support students and families.
- Participants will use proven tools and strategies to develop customized action plans aimed at increasing the percentage of students who become Ready Graduates.
- Participants will use [A Path of Choice](#) as a key organizing principle for collaborative work between middle and high school personnel across a variety of roles to ensure that all students are on an aligned pathway for postsecondary success.
