

Unarmed Security Guard

Aligned Program of Study: Criminal Justice and Correction Services

Description

With this license, students will be legally prepared to fulfill the duties of an unarmed security guard/officer as required by the State of Tennessee. Licensed students will be eligible for positions such as patrol security, event security, and other guarding services.

Fingerprinting Process

Each Unarmed Security Guard candidate must be fingerprinted by Idemia, the state contracted fingerprinting company. Some districts may already have financial arrangements with the company. Preparing to offer the certification

Required Instructor Qualification

To become certified to prepare students for the Unarmed Security Guard certification, the instructor candidate will submit an application that includes step-by-step instructions for attaching requested documents. Click [here](#) for additional information.

Exam Details

Students are required to achieve a 70% on the Unarmed Security Guard exam.
