

I-CAR Refinish Technician ProLevel 1

Aligned Program of Study: Automotive Collision Repair

Description

The I-CAR Refinish Technician ProLevel 1 certification is obtainable through an end of program exam for students who complete study through the I-CAR curriculum, Professional Development Program- Education Edition (PDP-EE). I-CAR curriculum is commonly used in the industry to train the auto body and related repairers. After completing the I-CAR ProLevel 1 curriculum and passing the aligned I-CAR end of the program exam, students receive the Platinum designation. The exam for Refinish Technician ProLevel 1 includes content on hazardous materials, personal safety, and refinish safety; trim and hardware; corrosion protection; refinish supplement; detailing; waterborne products, systems, and application; hazardous airborne pollutant reduction; and liquid and solid hazardous waste storage and disposal overview.

Testing Sites/Centers:

Tests are taken online at the school and must be given by a proctor following local and state testing requirements.

Registration Procedures:

Schools begin by purchasing the PDP-EE curriculum package. Students establish individual accounts and progress through the curriculum beginning with the Intro to Collision Repair series and followed by Non-Structural and/or Painting and Refinishing ProLevel 1 content. As students complete the program, another form must be completed and turned in to I-CAR to purchase the end of program exams.

Preparing to offer the certification

Required Instructor Qualification:

The instructor must attend a free I-CAR Overview Webinar and complete an Instructor Technical Evaluation (ITE) for each class taught.
