Cambridge International Examinations is part of the University of Cambridge and is the world's largest provider of international education programs, serving over 160 countries and used by over 10,000 schools worldwide. The popularity of Cambridge is growing in the U.S., with the total number of exams taken this year up 20 percent from a year ago. Cambridge schools are in 31 states and the District of Columbia.


The Cambridge Pathway program provides:


- An aligned international curriculum, pedagogy and assessment system backed by over 150 years of leading research and assessment practices
