I am writing on behalf of the Tennessee Department of Education to request a waiver on the definition of persistently lowest achieving (PLA) in the approved School Improvement Grant application for fiscal year (FY) 2010 funds. As a result of the approval by the U.S. Department of Education (ED) of the Elementary and Secondary Act (ESEA) flexibility waiver submitted by the Tennessee Department of Education, the Tennessee Department of Education requests to modify its definition of persistently-lowest achieving (PLA) schools and replace the list of eligible schools with Title I Priority Schools. If the waiver is approved, we request that these attachments become amendments to Tennessee's School Improvement Grant application. The following attachments are submitted:
