 <b>TNReady Math</b> TNReady is a set of statewide assessments given in Tennessee to measure students' knowledge, skills and progress. This shows the percentage of students who scored in the top two tiers of the TNReady Math assessment. 12.2%	 <b>TVAAS Literacy*</b> TVAAS is a statistical analysis that measures student growth. Level 4 or 5 means that students tended to grow more in literacy than their peers across the state, Level 3 means they grew at about the same rate, and Level 1 or 2 means they tended to grow less. Level 5	 <b>TVAAS Numeracy*</b> TVAAS is a statistical analysis that measures student growth. Level 4 or 5 means that students tended to grow more in literacy than their peers across the state, Level 3 means they grew at about the same rate, and Level 1 or 2 means they tended to grow less.
