Tennessee was awarded \$27.5 million from the federal Comprehensive Literacy State Development (CLSD) grant to support adolescent literacy for 54 Tennessee school districts. This grant is designed to support high-quality instructional materials and evidence-based literacy practices to support all students in grades 5-12 and was made available to all districts through a competitive application process.
