General Waiver Request

Explanation of how the statute(s) or SBE rule(s) inhibits or hinders the LEA's/public charter school's ability to meet its goals or comply with its mission (attach additional pages if more space is needed). We respectfully request a waiver of the maximum allowable time in transit rule for student transportation for the 2025–2026 school year, in accordance with Tennessee Department of Education waiver provisions. Our district continues to face significant challenges related to school bus driver shortages, which are compounded by the geographic realities of our large, rural coverage area. Despite active recruitment efforts and route optimization strategies, the limited availability of qualified school bus drivers has made it operationally unfeasible to maintain route times within the statutory maximums without compromising service to all eligible students. The current statutory and/or State Board rules governing maximum time in transit were designed to protect student well-being goals that we fully support. However, under current conditions, strict adherence to these limits is hindering our ability to meet our mission of providing safe, equitable, and timely access to education for every student. In some cases, students may be at risk of losing transportation access altogether if a waiver is not granted. We respectfully request approval of a waiver for the 2025–2026 school year to allow us temporary flexibility in route length and student time in transit, while we continue working toward long-term staffing and routing solutions. We appreciate your consideration and your continued support of Tennessee's public-school systems.
