Commissioner

I have received your waiver request of Tenn. Code Ann. § 49-6-3004 as it pertains to the required 180 days of classroom instruction. Union County Schools were closed on September 27, 2024, due to the impact of Hurricane Helene and January 10, 13, 14, and 15, 2025 due to the Level 3-State of Emergency. You are requesting a waiver for these days.

Under Tenn. Code Ann. § 49-6-3004(a)(6), the commissioner has the authority to waive the 180 days for classroom instruction requirement in the event of a natural disaster or serious outbreaks of illness affecting or endangering students or staff. Pursuant to this authority and given the fact that Union County Schools have exhausted all stockpile days, there was a natural disaster on September 27, 2024 and a Level-3 State of Emergency was effect on January 10, 13, 14, and 15, 2025, the waiver request for these days is hereby granted.
