I have received your waiver request of Tenn. Code Ann. § 49-6-3004 as it pertains to the required 180 days of classroom instruction. Weakley County Schools were closed on January 26, 27, 28, 29, and 30, due to the impact of the winter ice storm. You are requesting a waiver for these five days:

Under Tenn. Code Ann. § 49-6-3004(a)(6), the commissioner has the authority to waive the 180 days for classroom instruction requirement in the event of a natural disaster or serious outbreaks of illness affecting or endangering students or staff. Pursuant to this authority, and because your district has exhausted all stockpile days, the waiver request for January 26, 27, 28, 29, and 30, is hereby granted.


