

Underground Storage Tank Proposed Rulemaking

Summary

- All fund eligible releases will be entitled to reimbursement from the fund; however, an owner or operator's compliance history will now determine the amount of the fund deductible.
- Annual tank fees will be suspended from July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2026.
- General cleanup revisions to Rules 0400-18-01-.09 and .10 and modification of Rule 0400-18-01-.07(1)(a) to properly reflect EPA's interpretation of the similar, federal language.



Fund Eligibility

- <u>Under the current rules</u>:
 - All the tanks at a site must be registered prior to the release occurring.
 - Fund eligibility application must be submitted within 60/90 days depending on whether it was a suspected release or a confirmed release.
- <u>Proposed rules</u>:
 - These requirements remain the same.



Fund Coverage

- <u>Under the current rules</u>:
 - Fund coverage for a fund eligible release is dependent upon an owner or operator's compliance history with certain rules.

– Deductible = \$20,000

- Proposed rules page 10:
 - An owner or operator's compliance history will now determine the amount of the fund deductible.
 - Deductible = \$5,000
 - Increased to \$10,000, \$20,000, or \$30,000 depending on compliance history



Annual Tank Fees

- <u>Under the current rules</u>:
 - \$125 per tank compartment / per year
- Proposed rules page 30:
 - July 1, 2021 to June 30, 2026 = fees suspended
 - July 1, 2026 forward = \$125 per tank compartment / per year



TOS Tanks

- Question regarding spill and overfill for temporarily out-of-service (TOS) tanks
- EPA stated that TOS tanks must have operable spill and overfill equipment
 - But owners and/or operators are not required to test and inspect that equipment if the TOS tank is empty
- Rule was modified to more accurately reflect EPA's interpretation page 3
