Underground Storage Tanks and Solid Waste Disposal Control Board October 2, 2024

ENFORCEMENT OVERVIEW

The Division issued 97 orders between April 1, 2024, and June 30, 2024

 13 were Fund Deductible Orders. 7 were Fund Denial Orders. 77 were Operational Compliance orders.

 4 have been closed, 17 were Appealed, 14 are in Final status, 4 are in Final-Probation status and 55 are in Signed status.



Enforcement Overview (cont'd)

In the State's fourth quarter (April 1, 2024, through June 30, 2024)

• The Division assessed \$1,796,012 in civil penalties.

The Division collected \$361,877 in civil penalties.
