- Helps fleets with triple bottom line of profit, people & planet by reducing petroleum use








# What is Clean Cities?

# What is Tennessee Green Fleets?

- Certification Program Assess fleet changes in recent years
- Any size fleet can be reviewed
- Must meet certain base score (40 points)
- ✓ 1-, 2- and 3-star certification levels
  - <u>1-star = min. of 40 pts</u>
  - <u>2-star = min. of 80 pts</u>
  - <u>3-star = min. of 120 pts</u>



• 3-star fleets must receive certain "Criteria" points



## **TNGreenFleets Points System**

- <u>Achievement Points (200)</u> Reductions in CO2 emissions & petroleum use; Increases in # of advanced or alternative fuel vehicles in fleet
- <u>Criteria Points (19)</u> Strategic plan, Leadership support, Communications plan & outreach, Partnerships, Infrastructure



# **Greater Dickson Gas Authority**

- ✓ 24% of fleet 16 vehicles run on CNG or propane
- Operate a public CNG station in Dickson
- Partnered for numerous events and educational opportunities, including for the nationwide 2017 NGV Rally for which they were a stop!

### WeGo Public Transit | Downtown Service

- ✓ 9 electric Proterra buses are in use in the downtown area to provide busing services; one bus serves as a backup as needed
- ✓ In the buses that serve the downtown area, roughly 1/4<sup>th</sup> of those buses energy need is electricity; generates almost 500 short tons of
- ✓ Highly visible; can't miss them in downtown Nashville

# Athens Utilities Board | NG Div.

- ✓ 9 of 21 vehicles in the gas division are NGVs 43%
- Maintain one of the longest-serving public CNG stations in the East Tennessee area, that is right on I-75!
- Have assisted in outreach efforts multiple times throughout Tennessee





- ✓ Started using biodiesel as B20 in 2004
- Began propane program in 2014; now have 6 propane work trucks and 5 propane zero-turn mowers
- Long-time partner on education to promote action for emissions reduction

## NET Trans | Carter County Fleet

- Through partnership with Alliance AutoGas, have developed plans to transition many of their vehicles across their service area in NE Tennessee; partner with AAG on Greene County's first public propane refueling station, a first of its kind in Tennessee!
- Utilize propane autogas in six Ford Transits that serve several counties out of their Elizabethton domicile site
- Helping drive education on propane opportunities in NE Tennessee





### City of Knoxville | Mower Fleet

 Began work in 2014-2015 learning about use of propane mowers in the area



- 89.1 pts
- Converted first two mowers in 2015; added 9 more Kubota OEM propane mowers in 2016, and another 6 more Ferris mowers in 2017
- ✓ 19—exactly half—of the zero-turn fleet runs on propane
