The 1,126-acre park is situated on the western shore of Kentucky Lake and includes a 91 room Lodge with a conference space, a restaurant, and cabins.

This position has a variety of responsibilities, including the requirement of a candidate to have a flexible work schedule and the ability to work weekends and holidays. Under general supervision, this position is responsible for custodial work of average difficulty in common areas and guest rooms. ### Highlighted Responsibilities:

- Cleans and stocks lodge rooms and cabin facilities by making beds, dusting furniture, vacuuming, emptying trash, and straightening work areas. Periodically performs deep cleaning activities, including shampooing carpets, and washing walls and windows.
- Performs or leads others in performing duties such as sweeping, mopping, scrubbing, stripping, waxing, and buffing floors. Uses appropriate cleaning chemicals on appropriate surfaces to ensure proper sanitation without damaging surfaces.
- Communicates clean rooms that are back in inventory to front desk personnel so they are aware of when early check-in can occur.
- Maintain appearance of public spaces by keeping hallways and lobbies uncluttered and neat looking and policing grounds to pick up trash and check for any other needed maintenance.
- Provide customer service by responding to all lodge guests efficiently and in an appropriately friendly manner.
