We have outstanding opportunities to work in a beautiful work environment. This position is located at Pickwick Landing State Park in Counce, TN. The facilities include two campgrounds, a marina, three boat ramps, restroom facilities, picnic shelters, a dog park, visitors center, lodge, and golf course.

We are seeking candidates who have experience in marina operation or a similar field. Preferred candidates will be skilled in communication, customer service, organization, and will be comfortable working in a fast-paced environment. Additional knowledge and experience associated with boating and water safety is desirable. Experience equivalent to three years of increasingly responsible and skilled full-time labor is desired. General Responsibilities:

- Provide customer service to marina customers by answering questions about the park, the lake, and the area.
- Communicate with lease holders as necessary.
- Rent pontoon boats and paddle sport equipment to park visitors.
- Provide safety orientations to customers renting park equipment.
- Complete transactions in the Ship Store and on the fuel dock. Document daily fuel sales.
- Assist in inventory controls and management.
- Conduct dock walks to verify boats in slips.
- Read electrical meters for billing purposes.
- Maintain grounds around Marina by mowing, trimming, and removing litter.
- Daily clean and maintain facilities including restrooms.
