Are you interested in working with Tennessee State Parks (TSP)? Our parks are known for their natural beauty and are among the most stunning in the United States. We have an excellent opportunity in an enjoyable working environment at Tims Ford State Park in Winchester, TN. Located on Tims Ford Reservoir, the 3,546-acre Tims Ford State Park sits in the shadows of the Cumberland Plateau in south-central Tennessee and contains cabins, campgrounds, bathhouses, picnic shelters/pavilions, an event space, miles of hiking and biking trails, a golf course, boating, fishing, and various other outdoor recreation activities.

This position is responsible for custodial work of average difficulty and may require the ability to work some weekends and holidays. We are seeking someone who enjoys cleaning and is comfortable interacting with park guests and providing quick responses to their custodial needs. To be eligible, candidates must possess one year of custodial work. Candidates must meet the minimum qualifications (MQs) for this position. Highlighted Responsibilities:

- Clean and sanitize cabins, recreation hall, park office, campground bathhouses and public restrooms.
- Operate a variety of custodial equipment, including washing machines, dryers, vacuums, and moving furniture as needed for cleaning.
- Utilize cleaning supplies, including but not limited to bleach, disinfectants, and polishers.
- Remove trash from the grounds surrounding the facilities.
- Report repairs or supplies needed in the facilities. Perform light maintenance of the equipment utilized.
