This position has a variety of responsibilities, including the requirement of a candidate to have a flexible work schedule to work weekends and holidays. The preferred candidate will be a self-starter, possess good communication skills, and can work without constant direct supervision. Highlighted Responsibilities:

- Assists Park Rangers and Maintenance Staff with controlled burns. Remove brush for fire prevention and safety.
- Performs grounds maintenance work, including cutting & trimming grass and tree limbs, patch holes in roads & sidewalks, and inspect grounds for trash and safety hazards.
- Performs routine preventive maintenance and repair of buildings and facilities, including general repairs, air filter replacement, painting, carpentry work, electrical repair, and plumbing repair.
- Operates a variety of equipment, including commercial grade mowers, trimmers, trucks, tractors; and a variety of hand tools, such as plungers, sewer rods, drills, skill saws, chain saws, etc.
- Performs a variety of physical labor tasks, including unloading truck shipments, moving large objects and other physical tasks as needed.
- Operate Park two-way radio.
