








Emissions by Sector


Total U.S. Greenhouse Gas Emissions by Economic Sector in 2021



Overview of Climate Pollution Reduction Grant

EPA's Climate Pollution Reduction Grant Program (CPRG)



 Grants to government entities to develop and implement plans for reducing greenhouse gas emissions and other harmful air pollution

PHASE I:


 Non-competitive planning grants to develop climate pollution reduction strategies: \$250 Million

PHASE II:

 Competitive implementation grants to fund strategies in plans: \$4.6 Billion



Phase I: Planning Grant (current focus)



- State of Tennessee: \$3 million
- Nashville Metropolitan Statistical Area: \$1 million
- Memphis Metropolitan Statistical Area: \$1 million
- Knoxville Metropolitan Statistical Area: \$1 million



Phase I Timeline

March 31, 2023

• Lead organization for each state submit a Notice of Intent to Participate to the US Environmental Protection Agency (EPA)

April 28, 2023

Lead organization submit a complete application (workplan and budget)

July 1, 2023 – Beginning of Grant Award Period

• EPA Regional Office awarded funds to administer the planning grant

March 1, 2024

• Deliverable 1 (Priority Climate Action Plan) due

Summer 2025

• Deliverable 2 (Comprehensive Climate Action Plan) due

Summer 2027 - End of Grant Award Period

• Deliverable 3 (Status Report) due



Phase II: Implementation Funding

- Competitive funding to states, counties, local governments or other eligible entities covered by a plan to implement measures in the Priority Climate Action Plan (PCAP)
- All measures included in the PCAP should be eligible for funding (awaiting final language from the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) which will oversee these grants)
- EPA expects to award grants between \$2 million and \$500 million
 - EPA has indicated that applications will compete against other applications with a similar budget
- EPA expects to announce details in September 2023, with applications due April 2024



Planning Grant Deliverables





Priority Climate
Action Plan (PCAP)

- Due March 1, 2024
- Near-term, implementationready, priority greenhouse gas (GHG) reduction measures
- Prerequisite for implementation grant

Deliverable 2



Comprehensive Climate Action Plan (CCAP)

- Due in 2025 (later for tribes and territories)
- All sectors / significant GHG sources and sinks
- Near- and long-term GHG emission reduction goals and strategies

Deliverable 3



Status Report

- Due in 2027 (N/A for tribes or territories)
- Updated analyses and plans
- Progress and next steps for key metrics

TDEC's Approach to Phase I



Tennessee Volunteer Emission Reduction Strategy

The Tennessee Volunteer Emission Reduction Strategy (TVERS) is an emissions reduction plan currently being developed by the Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation (TDEC) with support from various partners. This plan is funded through the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) Climate Pollution Reduction Grant (CPRG) program, which was established in the Inflation Reduction Act of 2022 (IRA). Through this program, funding is being provided to states, local governments, air pollution control agencies, tribes, and territories to develop and implement plans for reducing greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions and other harmful air pollutants. Tennessee is one of 47 states that accepted <u>allocated funding</u> to participate in this federally funded initiative, with TDEC as the state grant recipient. As part of this program, TDEC will work closely with the three municipalities in Tennessee who also received funding: Nashville, Memphis, and Knoxville.

About the Tennessee Volunteer Emission Reduction Strategy (TVERS)

Phase I: Planning (current)

During the first phase of TVERS, TDEC is developing statewide action plans that prioritize actions to reduce GHG emisssions and harmful air pollution. These plans are being developed in consultation with relevant stakeholder groups, including state agencies, local governments, private industry, nonprofit organizations, and the public.
