

Thank you for submitting the Five-Year Update to the Jefferson County MSW Region's Ten-Year Solid Waste Plan. The plan's update has been reviewed and, while most of the information provided is complete and adequate, there are some items requiring additional information or clarification. The following comments are based upon this review and other relevant documents and requirements:

**General Information**

- Chapter 2.2 requires the total population of the Region be listed by county as well as the source of the information. The population figure is included, however the source is absent. **Please submit the source and date of the population numbers given in the update.**

**Waste Stream**

- Chapter 3.3 requires comparison and commentary of the Update estimates to the 10 Year Plan. The percentages were submitted but there was no comparison or commentary. **Please provide this comparison and commentary.**
- Chapter 3.4 requires comparison and commentary of the total generated waste with the projected Total waste generation values in the 10 Year Plan. **Please provide this comparison and commentary.**
- Chapter 3 should contain a proportional flow diagram. **Please submit this diagram.**
- Chapter 3.7 Where there only four (4) primary contributors (five are required)? **If this is in error please submit the fifth source or state that there are only four primary sources.**







The Solid Waste Management Act of 1991 [T.C.A. 68-211-814 (2)] requires that these reports be revised every five years after the plan's initial approval. The Jefferson County report was due to the Division of Community Assistance on August 18, 2000.

The Region must submit the required report within 30 days of receipt of this letter. Otherwise, the region and jurisdiction(s) within the region may lose eligibility for grants from the Solid Waste Management Fund. If non-compliance continues, additional sanctions may follow [T.C.A. 68-211-816].

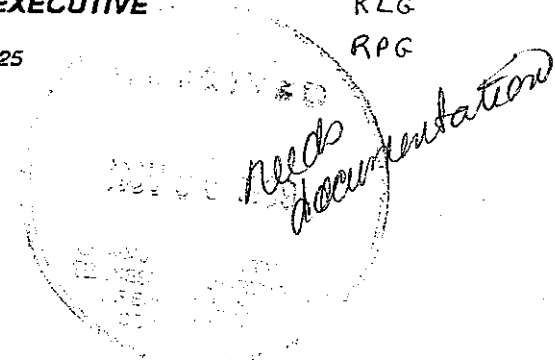

On behalf of Jefferson County Commission and the Jefferson County Solid Waste Board, I would like to request that Jefferson County Solid Waste receive 1995 base year credit for its recycling and diversion efforts.

Based on our figures for 1995 the base year per capita will change from .6190 to .8245. The per capita change coming from the following: 20,914 tons of Class I waste + 964.94 tons of recyclable materials + 5961 tons of class IV waste = 27,839.94 tons of waste.

Dear Mr. Snodgrass:

The Division of Community Assistance has received inquiries about our letter dated August 24, 1999, regarding the 1995 Base Year tons of solid waste disposed in Class 1 landfills or incinerated. This letter provides confirmation and clarification of the previous letter, and extends the deadline for submitting documentation to December 1, 1999.

DCA will refer to the 1995 Annual Progress Report to determine Base Year tons disposed at Class 1 landfills or incinerated. The Base Year tons will be used to calculate progress toward waste reduction in each municipal solid waste region.

As described in the previous letter, the law states that a county or region may receive credit toward the waste reduction and diversion goal for documented reductions from recycling and source reduction programs prior to 1995.

To receive credit for recycling, diversion and source reduction programs in 1995, you must provide documentation for tons recycled, diverted, and reduced at the source, **during calendar year 1995**. Indicate, with documentation, how many tons were not disposed in 1995 because of the programs in place. Examples of documentation include scale tickets, bills of lading, and certified statements from persons in responsible authority that the tonnage figures provided are good faith accurate reflections of amounts recycled, diverted, or reduced at the source, in 1995. We will verify documented diversion reported with the Division of Solid Waste Management.

To receive review of your request, you must provide complete information and documentation to DCA by **December 1, 1999**. In the absence of requests, DCA will use information in the 1995 Annual Progress Reports. Dear Mr. Snodgrass:

As you are aware, the General Assembly of the State of Tennessee recently amended the Solid Waste Management Act of 1991. One of the significant aspects of this legislation is that the base year from which each region will measure its reduction in solid waste is now 1995.

The Jefferson County Solid Waste Planning Region's Annual Progress Report for the year of 1995 reported a disposal rate of **0.619** tons per capita. This will be the region's base year rate, unless the region can clearly demonstrate that the 1995 data is in error.

These recent amendments also allow a region to receive credit for recycling and source reduction activity between 1985 and 1995. If the region can adequately document and quantify waste reduction and diversion efforts during this period, credit will be given for those efforts in calculating the new waste reduction base year rate.

If the region intends to request an adjustment of its base year numbers, the Division of Community Assistance (DCA) **must receive an official written request by November 1, 1999**. With the request, the region must provide a statement of justification for the proposed adjustment and appropriate supporting documentation that establishes the proposed figure to be credited. Appropriate supporting documentation includes landfill or incinerator disposal records with a statement of accuracy assurance signed by the current county executive or mayor as appropriate.

If DCA does not receive a written request for credit and all appropriate supporting documentation by **November 1, 1999**, then the 1995 per capita figure shown above will be used, and your 2003 waste reduction goal will be **0.465** tons per capita.

As you are aware, the Solid Waste Management Act of 1991 requires the Solid Waste Regions to plan, monitor, and report on solid waste activities. One of the requirements of this legislation was for each region to prepare a Ten-year Solid Waste Management Plan. The legislation also requires that Five-year updates to those plans be prepared and submitted to the state for review. The Jefferson County Region's Ten-year plan was approved on 8/18/1995; therefore, your Five-year Update is due to this office by 8/18/2000. Please note that the Update is expected to consider the next 10-year planning horizon, and will become your current Ten-Year Plan upon approval by this office.

Also required by the Solid Waste Act is submittal of a Needs Assessment report for all of the counties within each Development District. The initial Assessment was due by September 30, 1992; with revisions due by April 1, 1999 and every five years after that. The SW Needs Assessment(s) for the counties and municipalities within your region was (were) received on 4/19/1999. **OR** The Needs Assessment(s) for your region have not been received. Please contact Mr. Mitch Loomis with the East TN Development District to determine the status of your Region's Needs Assessment report. The Needs Assessment(s) will provide much of the information necessary for the preparation of the Five-year Update to your Ten-year Plan.

We have reviewed the submittal requesting credits and adjustments to the Jefferson County Region 1995 base year tonnage, along with the information we have from the 1995 Annual Solid Waste Progress Reports. This number, along with consideration of waste reduction program efforts, will be used to gauge the Region's progress toward reducing solid waste disposal between Base Year 1995 and Goal Year 2003.

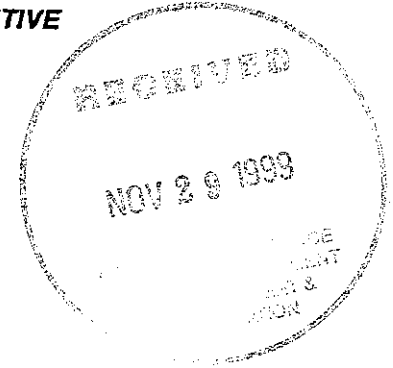



Executive Summary



The Jefferson County Region was established as a single county region in 1996 and has continued to operate as a single county region. The region is made up of one county, Jefferson and five cities, Dandridge, New Market, Baneberry, Jefferson City and White Pine. The region encompasses 273.8 square miles with a population of 44,294. The region has rural characteristics which features Bays Mountain, Shields Ridge; French Broad River, Holston River, Douglas Lake and Cherokee Lake. The City of Dandridge is the County seat with a population of 2,078. The City of Jefferson City is home to Carson-Newman College, a four year institute.

The Jefferson County Region is represented by a five member solid waste board. The board was established under the guidelines of the Solid Waste Management Act of 1991. The Board meets the first Tuesday of each month to discuss solid waste issues and set solid waste policies. In addition, Jefferson County has a solid waste director that oversees the day to day operation within the County and carries out policies set by the solid waste board and the County Commission.

It should be noted that the many of the activities established in the original ten year plan have been implemented within the first five years. The next five years will see a lot of the same activities going on with some fine tuning taking place.

In the Year 2000, the region of Jefferson County generated 30,708 tons of refuse of which 74% or 22,698 tons were disposed of in a Class I landfill, 20% or 5,944 tons of waste was diverted to a Class IV landfill, 6% or 2,066 tons of waste was recycled through a variety of industrial, commercial, county and city activities. Some of the recycling activities includes the county providing nine drop off sites at the convenience centers that allowed for the collection of newspaper, cardboard, aluminum cans, newspaper and aluminum scraps. All of the recyclable materials our transported to an end user by way of a private hauler. A private company, Lakeway Recycling also provides a recycling drop off point for the public to bring their recyclable materials. Future plans call for the County to add additional materials that will be collected, such as plastic, glass, etc. The Town of Dandridge picks-up recyclables door to door and transports them to the Jefferson County recycling center. The City of Baneberry currently does not have a recycling program. The City of New Market residents tend to use the public drop off site at Lakeway Recycling. The Town of White Pine recycles their municipal sludge through farm land spraying. The City of Jefferson City provides door to door recycling by way of Lakeway Recycling. No changes within the next five years is planned for the Cities. Tire collection is done at the landfill with the placement of the tires into trailers that are hauled when full to an end user by way of a private hauler. Unless the State discontinues the State Tire grant, the region will continue the same method of tire handling for the next ten years.

The Jefferson County region collects refuse from their citizens in two distinct ways. The Cities provide door to door collection through a private hauler and the waste is taken to the Jefferson County landfill for proper disposal. The County provides nine convenience centers that provide for refuse drop off and the waste is hauled by the county to the Jefferson County landfill for proper disposal. The Cities will continue with their door to door collection and the County will continue using the convenience centers for collection of solid waste for the next ten years.

The Jefferson County region will continue to operate its landfill and plan to begin construction of a new cell by 2005. In addition, the county is looking at making a capital expenditure of \$127,000, which will allow the county to purchase new landfill equipment. The County has at least 25 years left at their current landfill site.

The Jefferson County Region will continue to operate at least one Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) event per year over the next 10 years. The collection of HHW at the convenience centers has been discussed, but would need changes in the current law before such action can take place. Paint and land chemicals will still be the most prominent waste taken in at the HHW events. Waste tires that were discussed under the recycling section will continue to be handled the same way over the next 10 years.

The Jefferson County Region currently allows the school system to handle the bulk of the education of solid waste to the youth. The landfill director's staff handles some of the education to adults by way of organizational meetings. The region will look at funding an education coordinator position in 2005 that will be able to better coordinate the solid waste education program.



Currently, the Region of Jefferson County makes no attempts to provide flow control and has no intentions to attempt flow control within the next 10 years.

The regional implementation schedule and flow chart on are shown in the appendix. The regional 10 year solid waste budget total is shown in the following chart on the next page.

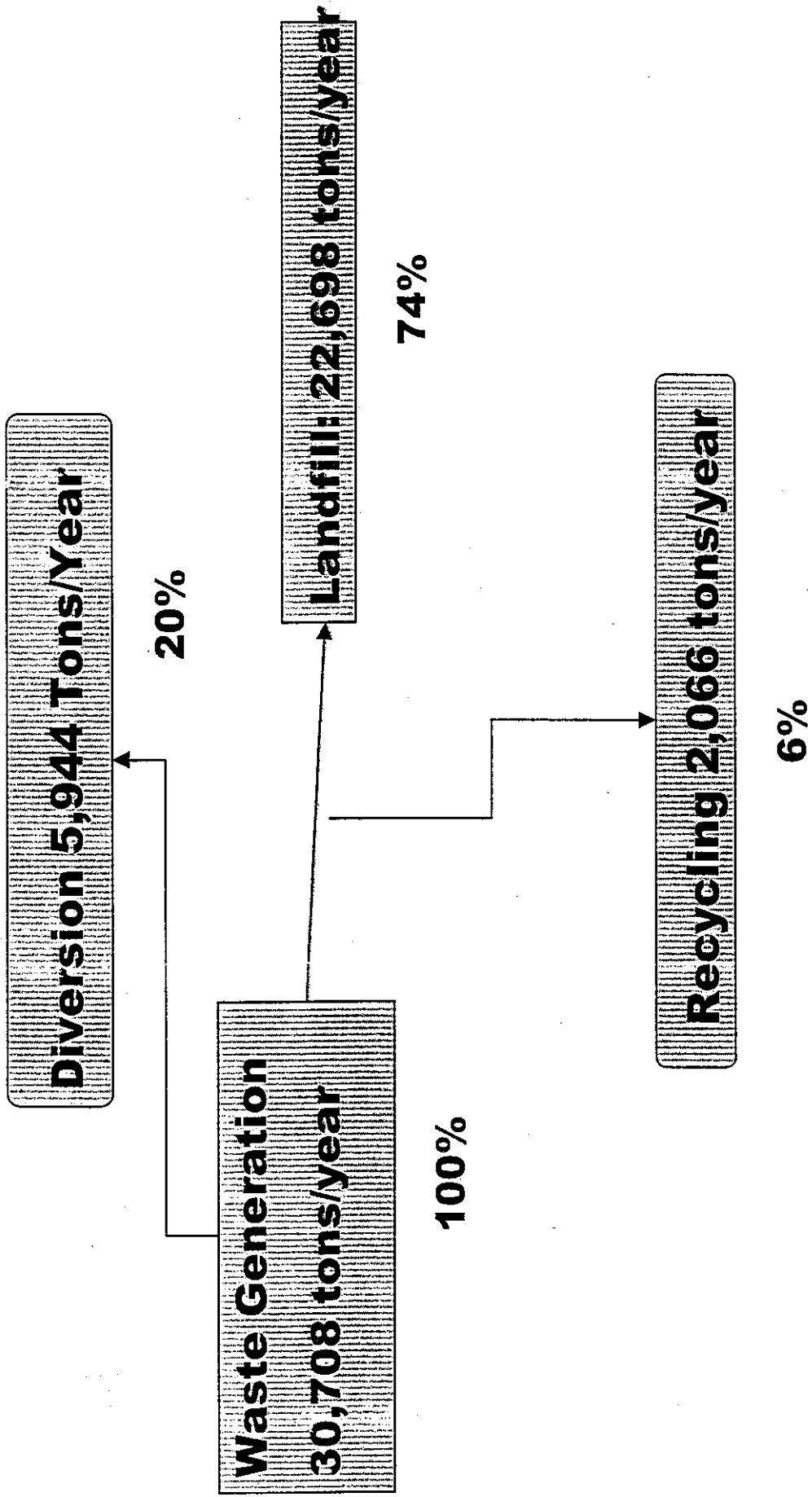

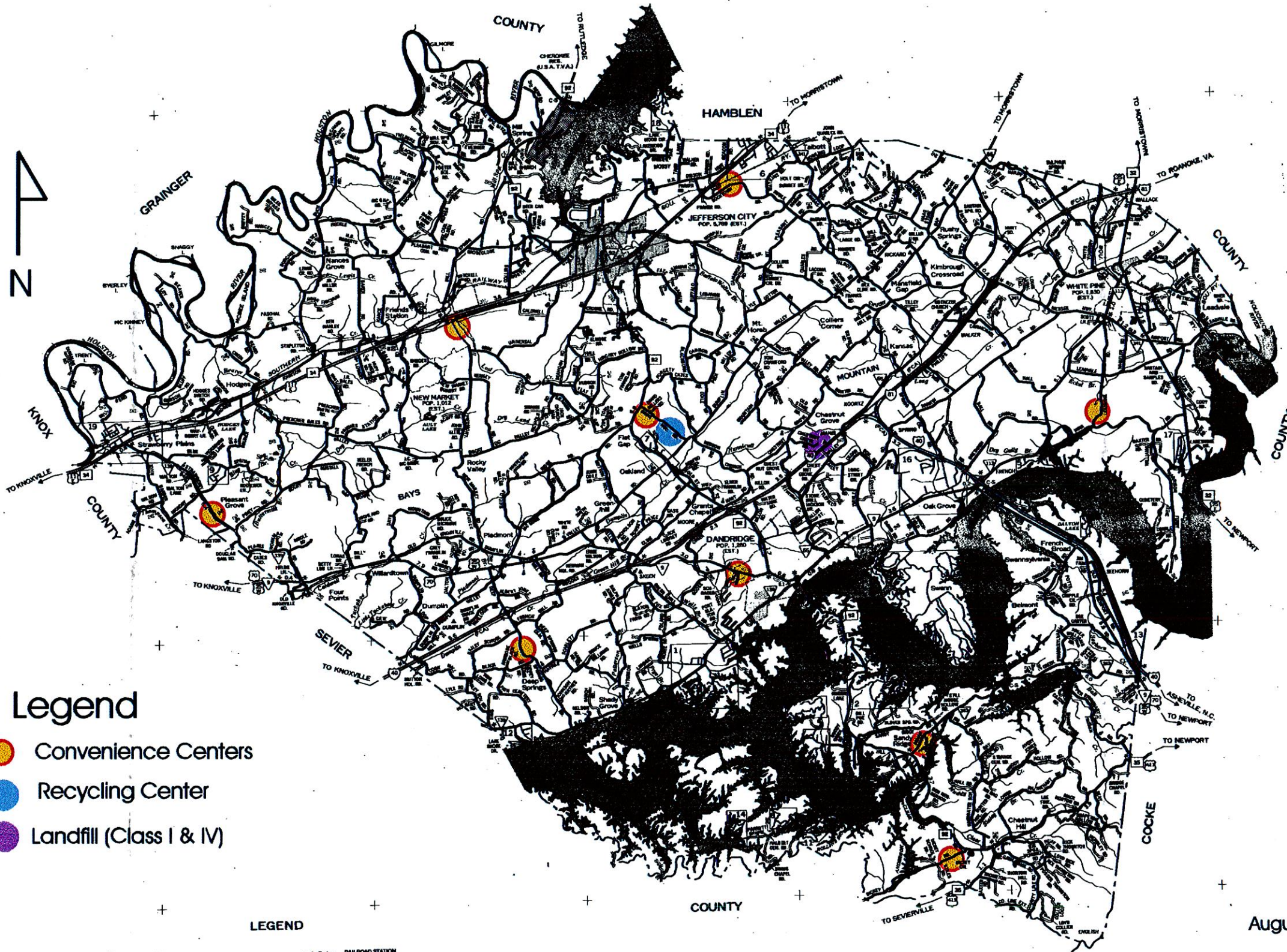

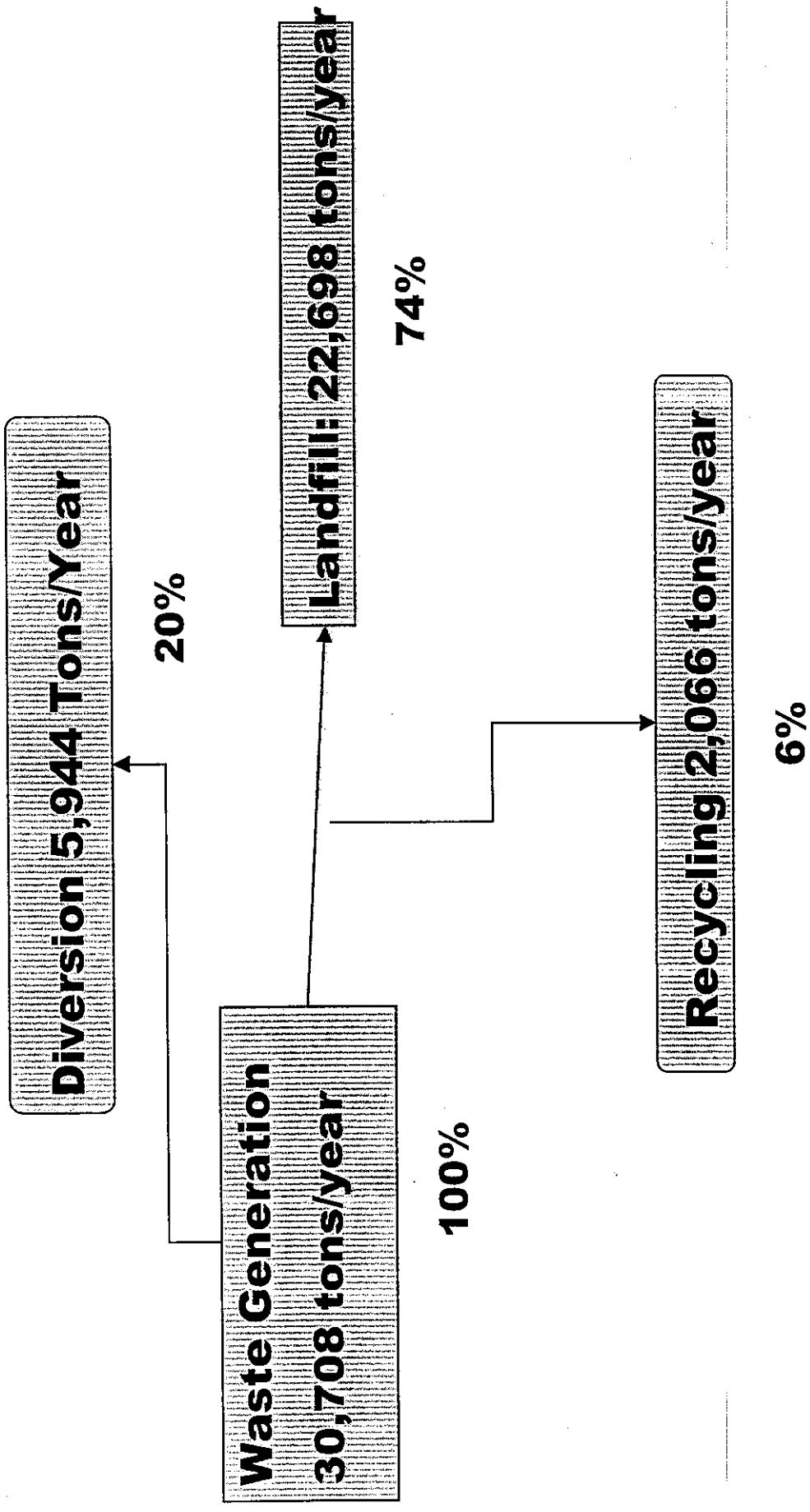

The Division of Community Assistance has received inquiries about our letter dated August 24, 1999, regarding the 1995 Base Year tons of solid waste disposed in Class 1 landfills or incinerated. This letter provides confirmation and clarification of the previous letter, and extends the deadline for submitting documentation to December 1, 1999.

DCA will refer to the 1995 Annual Progress Report to determine Base Year tons disposed at Class 1 landfills or incinerated. The Base Year tons will be used to calculate progress toward waste reduction in each municipal solid waste region.

As described in the previous letter, the law states that a county or region may receive credit toward the waste reduction and diversion goal for documented reductions from recycling and source reduction programs prior to 1995.

To receive credit for recycling, diversion and source reduction programs in 1995, you must provide documentation for tons recycled, diverted, and reduced at the source, **during calendar year 1995**. Indicate, with documentation, how many tons were not disposed in 1995 because of the programs in place. Examples of documentation include scale tickets, bills of lading, and certified statements from persons in responsible authority that the tonnage figures provided are good faith accurate reflections of amounts recycled, diverted, or reduced at the source, in 1995. We will verify documented diversion reported with the Division of Solid Waste Management.

To receive review of your request, you must provide complete information and documentation to DCA by **December 1, 1999**. In the absence of requests, DCA will use information in the 1995 Annual Progress Reports. Dear Mr. Snodgrass:

As you are aware, the General Assembly of the State of Tennessee recently amended the Solid Waste Management Act of 1991. One of the significant aspects of this legislation is that the base year from which each region will measure its reduction in solid waste is now 1995.

The Jefferson County Solid Waste Planning Region's Annual Progress Report for the year of 1995 reported a disposal rate of **0.619** tons per capita. This will be the region's base year rate, unless the region can clearly demonstrate that the 1995 data is in error.

These recent amendments also allow a region to receive credit for recycling and source reduction activity between 1985 and 1995. If the region can adequately document and quantify waste reduction and diversion efforts during this period, credit will be given for those efforts in calculating the new waste reduction base year rate.

If the region intends to request an adjustment of its base year numbers, the Division of Community Assistance (DCA) **must receive an official written request by November 1, 1999**. With the request, the region must provide a statement of justification for the proposed adjustment and appropriate supporting documentation that establishes the proposed figure to be credited. Appropriate supporting documentation includes landfill or incinerator disposal records with a statement of accuracy assurance signed by the current county executive or mayor as appropriate.

If DCA does not receive a written request for credit and all appropriate supporting documentation by **November 1, 1999**, then the 1995 per capita figure shown above will be used, and your 2003 waste reduction goal will be **0.465** tons per capita.
