As you are aware, the Solid Waste Management Act of 1991 requires the Solid Waste Regions to plan, monitor, and report on solid waste activities. One of the requirements of this legislation was for each region to prepare a Ten-year Solid Waste Management Plan. The legislation also requires that Five-year updates to those plans be prepared and submitted to the state for review. The Perry County Region's Ten-year plan was approved on September 26, 1996; therefore, your Five-year Update is due to this office by **September 26, 2001**. Please note that the Update is expected to consider the next Ten-year planning horizon, and will become your current Ten-year Plan upon approval by this office.

Also required by the Solid Waste Act is submittal of a Needs Assessment report for all of the counties within each Development District. The initial Assessment was due by September 30, 1992; with revisions due by April 1, 1999 and every five years after that. The SW Needs Assessment for the counties and municipalities within your region was received on September 1, 1999. Please contact Ms. Sara Brown with the South Central TN Development District to determine the status of your Region's Needs Assessment report. The Needs Assessment will provide much of the information necessary for the preparation of the Five-year Update to your Ten-year Plan.

The Five-Year Update to Perry County's Municipal Solid Waste Plan has been reviewed by division staff. We find that, while most of the information is complete and adequate, the following sections require additional information or further clarification:

#### CHAPTER 2-GENERAL INFORMATION

Section 2.3. TCA §68-211-813 (b.1) provides that a municipal solid waste planning region's board membership shall consist of an odd number, not less than five (5) nor more than fifteen (15), **with terms of six (6) years** (except for the initial board where approximately one-third of the members are appointed for two (2) years; one-third for four (4); and one-third for six (6) years, staggered so that approximately one-third of the terms are up for renewal every two (2) years. **Please note the six (6) year term requirements set forth in the statutes.**

#### CHAPTER 3-WASTE STREAM

Section 3.4. **Unmanaged waste must be included in the total generated waste stream. Discuss the region's reasons for each category estimate.**

Section 3.6. **List the region's major employers. Is unemployment high or low?**

#### CHAPTER 6-DISPOSAL



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



In response to your letter dated October 11, 2001 regarding the Perry County Five Year Update, the following information is submitted for further clarification of the items found in question.


1. ✓ Please see enclosed letter that should set terms to correct sequence.





# **Perry County Five-Year Update to Municipal Solid Waste Regional Plans**

## **Chapter 1: Summary**

### **INFORMATION ABOUT THE REGION**

The Solid Waste Management Act of 1991 required that all counties form a single or multi-county solid waste planning region. Perry County initially joined with Lewis, Hickman, and Humphreys Counties to form a multi-county region. However, in 1994 these counties found that single county regions would best serve their interests and the multi-county region was dissolved. (See attachment #1 for documentation of dissolution.) Perry County has been able to negotiate a solid waste disposal contract with Waste Services of Decatur County/Decatur County Landfill. This contract has been very successful to date. The landfill has a life expectancy of approximately twenty five years. This will ensure a stable future for Perry County's Solid Waste program for many years to come. The Perry County Municipal Solid Waste Planning Board includes all respective municipalities. The Perry County Municipal Solid Waste Planning Board works hard to find ways to reduce its solid waste disposal capacity by 25%. The Perry County Municipal Solid Waste Planning Board is made up of nine members from throughout the county.

### **SUMMARY OF REGIONAL NEEDS**

Regional needs to be met by the implementation of this plan include: (1) improving recycling and diversion rates, (2) educating the public on the available facilities and programs within their region, and (3) improving the collection and management of problem wastes.

### **GOALS AND OBJECTIVES**

The goals of the Perry County Municipal Solid Waste Planning Region are continue education programs within the community. The Region would like for the public to become more aware of the availability of solid waste facilities. In addition, the Region would like to continue encouraging community involvement in recycling efforts. All of these goals are essential to meeting the 25 % reduction goal.

## **CURRENT AND PROPOSED SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT**

Included in this section is the proposed implementation schedule illustrating current and planned facilities and programs. (See attachment #2).

The Perry County Municipal Solid Waste Planning Board in conjunction with Perry County has contracted with Waste Services of Decatur County for their solid waste disposal needs.

## **COLLECTION AND TRANSPORTATION**

Currently, all municipalities in the region provide door-to-door pickup at least once a week. There are two convenience centers available for collection in Perry County. There is also a transfer station located on Leon Daly Drive. Perry County has green boxes available throughout the county for all residents use. (See attachment #3 for locations of green boxes.) Waste is transported from the green boxes to Decatur County after collection. (See attachment # 4 for flow diagram).

## **WASTE REDUCTION**

There are several waste reduction programs in the region. The county provides drop-off recycling facilities at all convenience centers. Perry County also operates a Class III/IV landfill that is available to all county residents.

## **DISPOSAL CAPACITY**

Decatur County Landfill is a private landfill owned by Waste Services and is located in Parsons, Tennessee. This facility has a life capacity of 25 years.

Perry County operates a Class III/IV landfill which helps reduce Class III/IV waste in the community. This facility has a life capacity of 15 years.

## **PUBLIC INFORMATION AND EDUCATION**

Perry County has continued to develop public education programs to educate the public about waste reduction and recycling. Perry County has a variety of education and awareness programs available to the community. Benny Howard conducts education programs at area schools.

## **PROBLEM WASTES**

Problem Waste includes waste tires, automotive fluids, and lead acid batteries. Currently, the convenience centers located at Hwy 13 North, Linden, TN 37096 and Crooked Creek Rd., Lobelville, TN 37097, provide collection for automotive fluids and lead acid

batteries. Tires are collected at the transfer station. Perry County also regularly participates in the Household Hazardous Waste Day.

The Perry County Municipal Solid Waste Planning Region meets once a year to approve the Annual Progress Report. In addition the board meets whenever necessary to meet the responsibility it has for permit review and to discuss the concerns of entities and planning decisions. The Annual Progress Report is processed and submitted to the State when it is due.

Originally, Perry County was a member of a multi county region. However, upon dissolution of this region, Perry County formed a single county region. The current structure is satisfactory.

9. **Describe the region, generally, geographically, and demographically.**

The region comprises 417 square miles/266,880 acres in the western portion of Tennessee. It is bounded on the north by Humphreys County, on the south by Wayne County, on the east by Lewis and Hickman Counties, and on the west by the Tennessee River, which separates it from Benton and Decatur Counties. Linden, the county seat, is 70 miles southwest of Nashville and 130 miles northeast of Memphis. The majority of the commercial and industrial activity centers on the county seat, Linden. The Region is comprised of 39,926 people and according to the 2000 U.S. Census has seen growth of 13.1 % over the last ten years. Much of the land throughout the county is used for agriculture and recreational use. (See attachment #7 for map of region.)

10. **Does the Region (or Part 9 Authority, city or other jurisdiction within) charge a fee for solid waste services?**

No, the Region does not charge a fee for solid waste services.

11. **Describe the cost and revenues involved in public funding for solid waste programs and expenses in the Region. Be sure to include capital cost considerations, staffing requirements, and operating expenses. It may be best to go jurisdiction by jurisdiction (cities, counties, Part 9 authorities). Is the current system satisfactory? Are revenues meeting costs? What new expenses and/or new fees or revenues are needed or anticipated?**

Yes, the current system is satisfactory. Any costs that may occur will be discussed at the Perry County Municipal Solid Waste Regional Meeting. However, Perry County has been hit hard with the recent cuts of 25% in their waste tire program. Perry County has limited funds to operate this program without state help. In addition, they have not received any notice regarding their 2000 Recycling Equipment Grant which would help them expand their recycling programs.

The Town of Lobelville operates a house-to-house pickup program. They don't foresee any changes in the current system.

Perry County is the only county within the region. The cities within the region include Linden and Lobelville.

Perry County operates two convenience center, which collect materials like, cardboard, household garbage, newspapers/magazines, aluminum cans, steel cans, and tin cans. The convenience centers are located Hwy 13 North in Linden and Crooked Creek Road in Lobelville. All recyclables for the entire County are accepted at these locations.

The county and its municipalities work well together. Solid Waste funding is provided by a 28 cents on the tax rate. Future needs include increased recycling programs throughout the county and its municipalities. Also, the Perry County Regional Planning Board would like to receive grant funds to replace recycling bins at the convenience center. Bins are already located at local schools for the collection of aluminum cans. A future goal would be to place bins for recycling paper at area schools in Perry County to help increase recycling numbers. The availability of a Class III/IV landfill also helps the community to divert waste from the landfills.

The Towns of Linden and Lobelville operate house-to-house pickup programs available to town residents.

WHEREAS, the adoption of the Subtitle D landfill regulations by the United State Environmental Protection Agency and companion regulations adopted by the Tennessee Solid Waste Control Board will impact on both the cost and method of disposal of municipal solid waste; and

WHEREAS, at the urging and support of a coalition of local government, environmental, commercial, and industrial leaders, the 97th Tennessee General Assembly enacted T.C.A. 68-211-801 et seq., titled "Solid Waste Management Act of 1991"; and

WHEREAS, with the view that better planning for solid waste will help control the additional costs that will be imposed by the new landfill regulations, help protect the environment, provide an improved solid waste management system, better utilize our natural resources, and promote the education of the citizens of Tennessee in the areas of solid waste management including the need for and desirability of reduction and minimization of solid waste, local governments in Tennessee supported and worked for the passage of this Act; and

WHEREAS, one of the stated public policies of this Act is to institute and maintain a comprehensive, integrated, statewide program for solid waste management; and

WHEREAS, as per T.C.A. 68-211-811, the nine development districts in the State of Tennessee have completed a district needs assessment which are inventories of the solid waste systems in Tennessee; and

WHEREAS, Perry County's Board of County Commissioners has given consideration to the needs assessment prepared by the South Central Tennessee Development District; and

WHEREAS, T.C.A. 68-211-813, requires that counties in the State of Tennessee form municipal solid waste regions; and

WHEREAS, the Act's stated preference is the formation of multi-county regions with counties having the option of forming single or multi-county municipal solid waste regions; and

WHEREAS, the State of Tennessee will provide grant monies of varying amounts to single county, two county, and three or more county municipal solid waste regions to assist these regions in developing their municipal solid waste region plans; and

WHEREAS, the primary and prevailing purpose of the municipal solid waste regions are the preparation of municipal solid waste regional plans which among other requirements must identify how each region will reduce its solid waste disposal per capita by twenty-five percent (25%) by December 31, 1995, and a planned capacity assurance of its disposal needs for a ten (10) year period; and

WHEREAS, the development of a municipal solid waste regional plan that results in the most cost effective and efficient management of municipal solid waste is in the best interest of the citizens of Perry County.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of County Commissioners of Perry County, Tennessee, acting pursuant to T.C.A. 68-211-801 et seq., that there is hereby established a Municipal Solid Waste Region for and by Perry County, Tennessee; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that pursuant to T.C.A. 68-211-813 (a) (2), that the Board of County Commissioners of Perry County, Tennessee finds and determines that Perry County shall be and shall constitute a single county municipal solid waste region due to the following: 1) the county determined it is in their best interest to evaluate solid waste alternatives as a single county; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that pursuant to T.C.A. 68-211-813 (b) (1), a Municipal Solid Waste Region Board is hereby established to administer the activities of this Region; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this Municipal Solid Waste Region Board shall be composed of five (5) members; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that pursuant to T.C.A. 68-211-813 (b) (1), Three Board members shall be appointed by the County Executive and approved by this Board of County Commissioners and, due to the fact that Linden collects or provides disposal services through its own initiative or by contract, the Town of Linden shall have one Board member appointed by the Mayor of Linden and approved by the Town of Linden and, due to the fact that Lobelville collects or provides disposal services through its own initiative or by contract, the City of Lobelville shall have a Board member appointed by the Mayor of Lobelville and approved by the City of Lobelville; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that members of the Board of the Municipal Solid Waste Region shall serve a six (6) year term except that one member appointed by the County Executive shall have a two (2) year term, that one member appointed by the County Executive shall have a four (4) year term, that one member appointed by the County Executive shall have a six (6) year term, that one member appointed by the Mayor of Linden shall have a six (6) year term, that one member appointed by the Mayor of Lobelville shall have a four (4) year term; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this Municipal Solid Waste Region Board shall have all powers and duties as granted it by T.C.A. 68-211-813 et seq. and in addition, in the performance of its duty to produce a municipal solid waste region plan, it shall be empowered to utilize existing Perry County governmental personnel, to employ or contract with persons, private consulting firms, and/or governmental, quasi-governmental, and public entities and agencies and to utilize Perry County's services, facilities and records in completing this task; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that at the Municipal Solid Waste Region Board's initial organization meeting it shall select from its members a chair, vice-chair, and secretary and shall cause the establishment of a municipal solid waste advisory committee whose membership shall be chosen by the Board and whose duties are to assist and advise the Board; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Municipal Solid Waste Region Board, in furtherance of its duty to produce a municipal solid waste region plan, is authorized to apply for and receive funds from the State of Tennessee, the federal government, Perry County, the City of Lobelville, the Town of Linden and donations and grants from private corporations and foundations; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Perry County shall receive, disburse and act as the fiscal agent for the administration of the funds of the Municipal Solid Waste Region and the Region's Board; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that upon the passage of this Resolution and at no later date than May 2, 1994, the County Clerk of Perry County shall transmit a copy of this Resolution to the Tennessee State Planning Office.

RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF PERRY COUNTY, TENNESSEE, this 16th day of May, 1994, the welfare of the citizens of Perry County requiring it.


