

NOTICE OF INTENT TO RENEW A HAZARDOUS WASTE MANAGEMENT CORRECTIVE ACTION PERMIT FOR CHEMOURS MEMPHIS PLANT

The Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation (TDEC) Division of Solid Waste Management (DSWM) proposes to renew a hazardous waste corrective action permit for The Chemours Company FC, LLC's Memphis Plant. The facility (EPA ID TND007024672) is located in Shelby County at 2571 Fite Road, Memphis, Tennessee 38127. **TDEC invites the public to submit comments on this proposal during a 45-day comment period ending on June 22, 2020.**

Permit TNHW-143 required Chemours to reapply for renewal prior to the current permit's expiration date. Because the facility submitted their renewal application at least 180 days before the current permit was set to expire (September 30, 2019), Tennessee Hazardous Waste Management Regulations allow the facility to continue to operate under the current permit until another permit is issued or denied. As part of the permitting process, Chemours held a pre-application public meeting on January 23, 2019, as announced in the December 20, 2018 edition of The Millington Star. Three members of the public attended, but no comments were received.

The current permit only addresses corrective action of solid waste management units (SWMUs) and areas of concern (AOCs). All releases to the environment have been thoroughly investigated, all remedial actions are completed, and all contaminant concentrations in the site's monitoring wells have been determined to be well below the established groundwater protection standards. If the renewal permit is approved, Chemours will be required to continue to perform compliance monitoring and to maintain engineered and institutional controls at the facility. The proposed permit includes provisions for site security and inspections, restrictions on digging and drilling, groundwater and surface water sampling and analysis, notification of any newly discovered release to the environment and maintenance of financial assurance with the DSWM in an amount that meets the cost of providing that long-term care.

Based on the review of the renewal application and as authorized pursuant to Tennessee Rule 0400-12-01-.07(7), DSWM determined the application to be complete and has drafted a renewal permit. DSWM proposes to reissue the permit under the authority of the Tennessee Hazardous Waste Management Act of 1977, as amended, Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 68-212-101 et seq., and Rule Chapter 0400-12-01, Hazardous Waste Management. In accordance with Rule 0400-12-01-.07(7)(e), this notice requires a 45-day comment period, beginning on the date of this publication and the opportunity to request a public hearing. A fact sheet has been prepared that provides additional information about the site and the proposed permit. Pending consideration of any contrary information received, it is the present intent of DSWM to reissue this permit. If reissued, the permit would be effective for ten years.

DSWM invites the public to review and submit comments on the draft permit during the 45-day comment period ending on June 22. A request for a public hearing requires a significant degree of public interest. The request shall be made in writing, including the contact information of the requestor, and shall state the nature of the issues to be raised at the hearing.

After considering all comments, DSWM will make a final decision to either issue or deny the permit. Notice will be given to the applicant and each person who has submitted written comments or requested notice of the final decision. At the time a final decision is issued, a Response to Comments document addressing all significant input received on the draft permit will be made available to the public. The final decision shall become effective upon signing by the Director of DSWM.
