Proposed Establishment of Tennessee's Aquatic Resource Alteration General Permits for Non-isolated and Isolated Wetlands

TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

Where the Commissioner finds that a category of activities or discharges would be appropriately regulated under a general permit, the Commissioner may use a general permit to authorize alterations to waters for specific categories of activities that are substantially similar in nature. Notices of coverage by the Division of activities that qualify under general permits also serve as a section 401 Water Quality Certification pursuant to the federal *Clean Water Act.* The Division is proposing issuance or establishment of new permits for 2 general ARAPs, as follows:

The hearing officer will limit all testimony to relevant water quality issues and may limit testimony in the interest of time. However, all persons desiring to speak will be given an opportunity to do so. Written testimony will be accepted following the hearing and will be considered part of the official record. After considering all public comments, the Division will publish a final permit decision and a notice of the Division's determinations. Public comments will be received during the formal public hearing concerning the proposed renewal of Tennessee's Aquatic Resource Alteration General Permits.

Prior to opening the formal public hearing, an informational session will be held with Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation (TDEC) staff. Concurrent informational sessions will be held at the hearing and videoconferencing locations. The informational session will have a one-on-one question and answer format. Once the formal public hearing begins, the question-and-answer format will end, and all public comments will be collected for the hearing record without response from TDEC during the hearing. TDEC staff will provide written responses to all oral and written comments following the public hearing and public comment period, prior to making a final determination on the permit action.

The meeting moderator may limit the length of oral comments in order to allow all parties an opportunity to speak and will require that all comments be relevant to the proposed permit action and Division of Water Resources issues. Written comments will be accepted through June 30, 2025, and will be considered part of the hearing record.
