	Activity:	City of Murfreesboro proposed impacts to 553 linear feet of stream, 6.09 acres of wetland, and 0.016 acres of open water pond for encapsulation, fill, and 177 feet of stream relocation associated with roadway improvements to Cherry Lane. Compensatory mitigation to offset impacts to wetlands will be provided through purchase of 12.18 wetland credits from the Harpeth River Mitigation Bank, and stream impacts will be offset through the purchase of 431.10 functional credits from the Gleason Creek Stream and Wetland Bank.

	Activity:	Duck River Utility Commission proposed to modify the active permit, which authorizes withdrawal from Normandy Reservoir up to 12.32 million gallons per day, averaged weekly (86.24 million gallons per week). The purpose of the withdrawal is for public water supply. Revisions include changes to the special conditions regarding water loss, drought management, and conservation education.

NRS24.229	Applicant:	Ray Jeffries		
	Activity:	Ray Jeffries proposed the excavation of 0.10 acres wetland and 100 feet of an Unnamed Tributary to Paint Creek in Greene County for the construction of a private pond not to exceed dimensions of 40 feet by 100 feet and 6 feet in depth. Impacts are to Exceptional Tennessee Waters and do not require mitigation.

NRS25.006 Applicant: Tennessee Department of General Services
Activity: Tennessee Department of General Services proposed replacing the boardwalk across the Dismal Swamp at Big Hill Pond State Park in McNairy County. The Dismal Swamp is considered an Exceptional Tennessee Water. Construction will require temporary impacts to 1.7 acres of wetland and permanent impacts to 0.036 acres.
