NRS23.332	Applicant: Activity:	Tennessee Department of Transportation (TDOT) Tennessee Department of Transportation proposed permanent impacts to 1,102 linear feet of stream impacts in Old Hickory Reservoir in Sumner County for the replacement of an existing bridge, associated riprap along the shorelines underneath, north, and south of the bridge, and relocation of utilities.

NRS25.081	Applicant: Activity:	City of La Vergne The City of La Vergne proposed 805 linear feet of permanent impacts to five (5) streams and fill of 0.54 acres of three (3) wetlands associated with the expansion of Blair Road West in Rutherford County. No compensatory mitigation is required for the linear transportation stream impacts. Wetland impacts total fill of 0.54 acres and are to be offset through purchase of 0.58 wetland credits from Christmas Creek Mitigation Bank. Partially filled wetlands are to be monitored for two (2) years post-construction

NRS25.129	Applicant: Activity:	Tennessee Department of Transportation (TDOT) Tennessee Department of Transportation proposed permanent impacts to 784 linear feet of streams and permanent impacts to 1.7962 acres and temporary impacts to 0.6143 acres of wetland impacts for road widening. 373.4 functional feet of stream impacts will require the purchase of 373.4 credits from High Hood Mitigation Bank. 1.7962-acres permanent wetland impacts for grading and fill are to be offset at a 2:1 ratio with a 12% temporal loss multiplier through purchase of 3.81 wetland mitigation credits from Tennessee Mitigation Fund within Cumberland County Service Area.

Activity: Tennessee Department of Transportation has proposed impacts to Unnamed Tributary to South Mouse Creek through improvements to State Route 60 to address safety deficiencies. Permanent impacts include 282 linear feet of encapsulation with 72-inch reinforced concrete pipe and 9 linear feet of "A" type endwall with concrete apron at both the inlet and the outlet. Compensatory mitigation to offset the functional loss will be provided through the purchase of 15 credits purchased from Lodi Mitigation Bank.

Activity: Cypressbrook Coley Davis, GP proposed construction of a temporary 230-ft concrete single span bridge (24'-0" out-to-out width) over the Harpeth River, preceding construction of a permanent 535-foot, 3-span steel bridge (40'-0' out-to-out width) in Nashville, Davidson County. The 3-span bridge consists of Span 1 (162.5-ft), Span 2 (210-ft) and spans the average channel width of the Harpeth River, and Span 3 (162.5-ft). A temporary haul road and crane pad will be utilized during the bridge construction.
