- With FY 2018 single audit in progress, we will soon be collecting information for the corrective action plan (CAP) for the current year audit findings. Since this task is only performed once a year, it can be difficult to remember all the required components detailed in Uniform Guidance Subpart F section 200.511 (c). The below components can serve as a reminder for when you fill out the CAP template we provide to you:
 - 1. The corrective action plan on each audit finding must be prepared by the auditee.
 - 2. Provide the name of the contact person responsible for the corrective action plan, the corrective action planned, and the anticipated completion date.
 - 3. If the auditee does not agree with the audit findings or believes that corrective action is not required, include an explanation along with specific reasons as support.

Memorandum M-18-24



- The OMB issued Memorandum M-18-24 on September 5, 2018. The Memorandum outlined a few steps that the Federal Government is taking to reduce the reporting burden for grants recipients. The Grants community will be impacted by the following changes:
 - SF-424B form Phase-out: Effective January 1, 2019, the SF-424B will become optional and agencies shall make plans to phase out use in Funding Opportunity Announcements.
 - 2. Central repository of <u>SAM.gov</u>: Effective January 1, 2020, the System for Award Management (SAM) will become the central repository for common government-wide certifications and representations required of Federal grants recipients. The registration in SAM is required for eligibility for a Federal award and registration must be updated annually. Federal agencies will use SAM information to comply with award requirements and avoid increased burden and costs of separate requests for such information unless the recipient fails to meet a Federal award requirement.
 - 3. Integrating new data standards: Government-wide core grants management data standards are expected to be finalized by the Grants Management Federal Integrated Business Framework (FIBF) and Federal agencies must submit a plan to OMB that describes their strategy for integrating the new data standards into current and future grant system by April 30, 2019.
- After issuing this memorandum, additional progress has been made. The proposed data standards cover the following areas: 010 Grant Program Administration; 020 Grant Pre-Award Management; 030 Grant Award Management; 040 Grant Post-Award Management and Closeout; 050 Grant Program Oversight; 060 Grant Recipient Oversight.

Period of Performance (POP)



In an effort to reduce audit findings that are related to Period of Performance (POP), agency personnel need to be aware of grants start and end dates listed on the Notice of Award or Grants Agreement from the Federal awarding agency. Other factors that also need to be considered include:

- > Common causes for noncompliance:
 - 1. Insufficient internal control.
 - 2. Adjusting journal entries or allocating journal entries done without proper review of Period of Performance.
 - 3. Reimbursement made to subrecipients without proper review of Period of Performance.
- ► How to prevent noncompliance:
 - 1. Use the Grant entry information template and grant entry checklist template when entering new grants into Edison.
 - 2. Review adjusting journal entries or allocation journal entries before posting to make sure those are within the proper time period.
 - 3. Conduct a review of documentation of Period of Performance before reimbursing the funds to subrecipients.
 - 4. If necessary, request an extension of period of performance to the Federal awarding agency or pass-through entities.

The Grants Workgroup has developed the Grants Entry Template for federal awards (this was provided previously through "Entering Grants Training" and a Federal Required Information Template that can be used for awards to subrecipients). Grant Reporting Efficiency and Agreements Transparency Act (GREAT) ACT



The GREAT Act is a continuation of open data to modernize and standardize a reporting system for recipients of Federal awards. The GREAT Act directs the executive branch to adopt a standardized data structure for the information that grantees must report to agencies.

The bill was introduced in the Senate on September 24, 2018 but was never passed in the Senate last year. With a new Congress, the bill has to be reintroduced since it was never passed in the Senate. For more information related to this bill, click here.
