Tennessee Code Annotated, Section <u>4-4-113 (b)</u> requires all State Departments that receive federal financial assistance to report any official notice related to noncompliance (received from the Federal Awarding Agency or designated Cognizant Agency) to the Comptroller of the Treasury and Finance & Administration.

To apply for federal assistance or to do business with the Federal government, registration with The System for Award Management (SAM) is required. On February 2, 2019, SAM implemented a new process that allows registrants to submit common federal government-wide certifications and representations for financial assistance. For more information related to this requirement, see Uniform Guidance section 200.208.

Non-federal entities creating new SAM registrations and existing non-federal entities completing their annual SAM registration renewals will be required to review and certify their financial assistance Certifications and Representations before their registration can be activated. Single Audit and Risk Management Announcement



The Office of Government-wide Policy (OGP) within the General Services Administration (GSA) is soliciting ideas for a Single Audit and Risk Management solution that stores and integrates audit results, findings, and corrective actions from Single Audits and other audits. The goal is to maximize the value of grant funding (Cross-Agency Priority Goal 8) and to reduce the grant recipient reporting burden (M-18-24). Single Audit Findings Analysis



Fiscal year 2018 Single Audit was completed and published on the State Comptroller's website. The Grants workgroup analyzed single audit findings for 3 years. The most common noncompliance issues related to the single audit findings were allowable costs/cost principles, eligibility, subrecipient monitoring, and reporting.

- The Grants Workgroup has identified the following primary causes related to noncompliance:
 - Lack of training
 - Inadequate internal controls
 - Insufficient subrecipient monitoring
 - Inadequate review process/procedures
 - Lack of supporting documentation
 - Lack of written policies/procedures
- > The Grants Workgroup suggests implementing the following steps

when developing a corrective action plan:

- 1) Identify the root cause related to the audit finding
- 2) List the individuals who will be accountable for the results of the corrective action
- 3) Create solutions that address the root cause
- 4) Set deadlines
- 5) Monitor the progress of the corrective action plan
