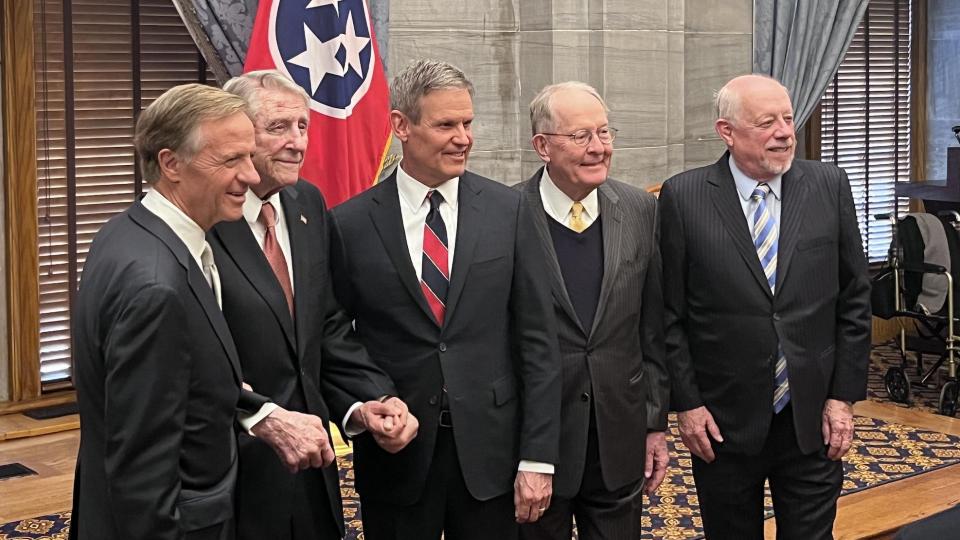

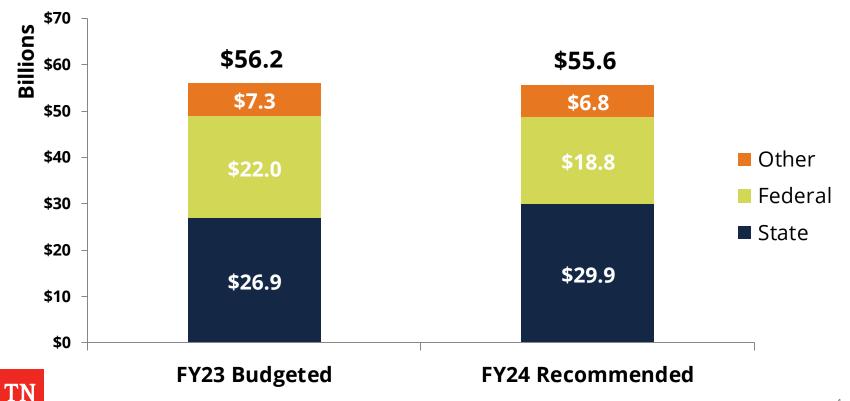

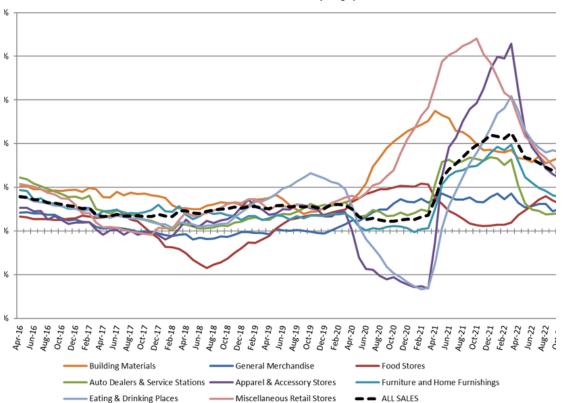




### **Uncertainty - Economy has not 'Reset' yet from COVID**

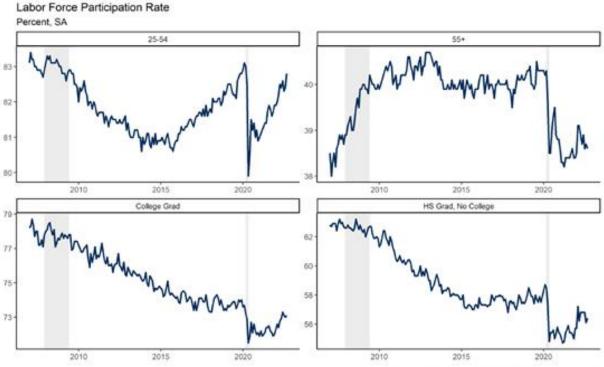

### Hiring Challenges - Individuals have left the Work Force

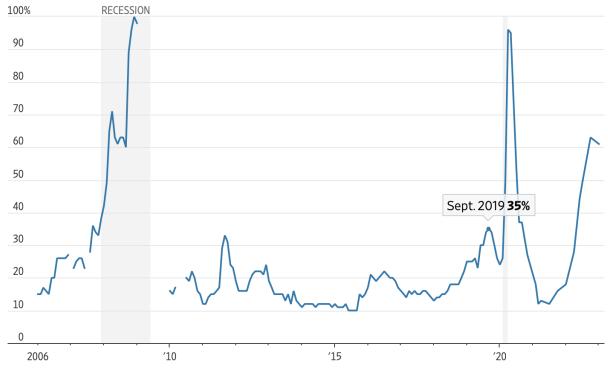






### 61% of Economists expect recession in 2023

#### **Slowdown Expected**

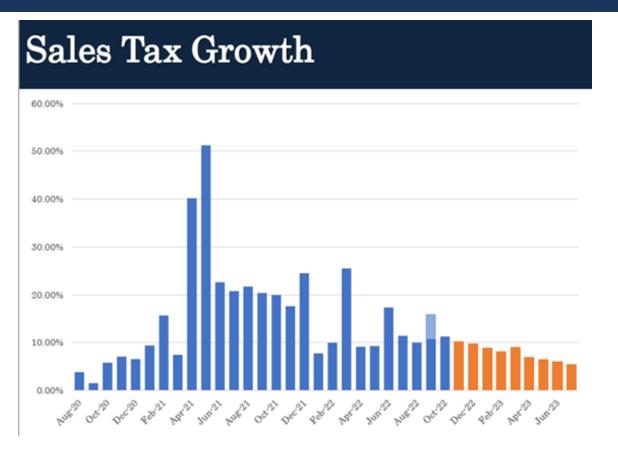
- Expect an Economic Slowdown possibly second half of 2023
- Expect Slower Growth moving forward this year and into FY24
- Recession Likely (Probably Mild)
- Economic Uncertainty Continues
- The Federal Reserve Board will continue to pursue goal of reducing inflation

#### **Some Good News**

- Inflation is expected to ease in 2023
- TN's Population Growth and Domestic Migration will provide some buffer to a national economic slowdown

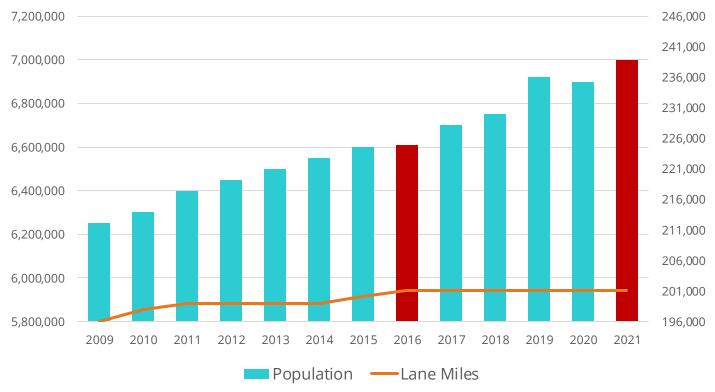

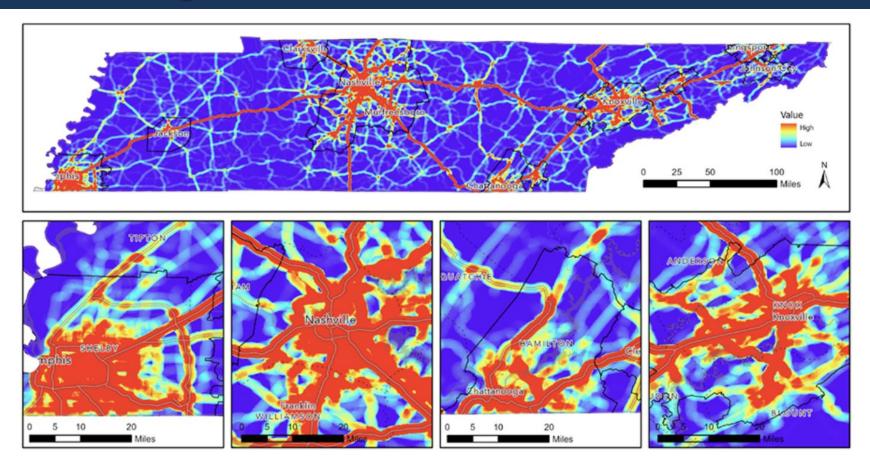
### **Transportation - Population Outgrowing Roads**

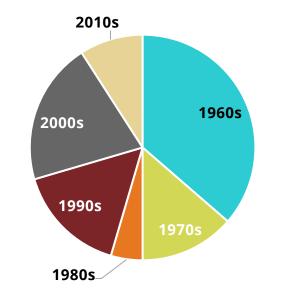


#### **TCAT Facilities**

#### **Many Facilities Need Replacement**

- Half the buildings are 50-60 years old
- Many building systems (roofs, HVAC, electrical, plumbing, etc.) are reaching the end of their useful lives
- Spaces are not designed for modern equipment and teaching methods
- Many facilities lack modern amenities, including air conditioning, accessible restrooms, and modern finishes

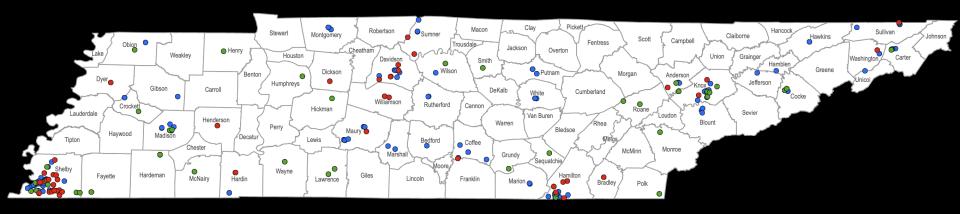

### Summary

- Applies conservative growth projections
- Uses \$2.8B recurring revenue for nonrecurring expenditures
- Pays down \$550 million in liabilities
- Incurs no new debt
- Grows the Rainy-Day Fund beyond the 8% statutory goal
- Includes 77 fewer positions than FY23
- Reduces Taxes
- Grows Reserves
