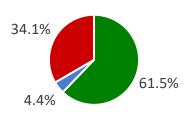

 - Provides trained, skilled, and ready reserve defense in support of the state and nation.

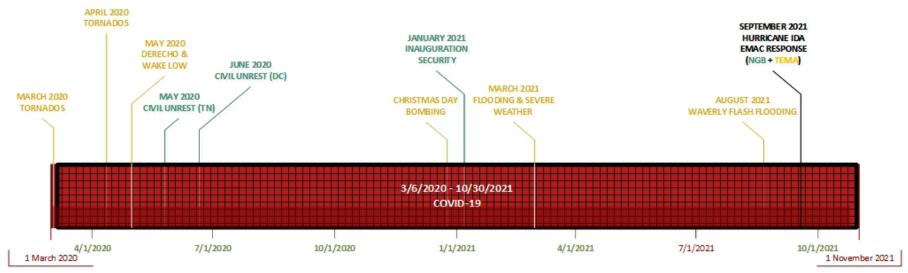
■ Emergency Management

- Protect the homeland during natural and man-made disasters and emergencies.
- Build and maintain partnerships with our State, communities, families and employers.
- Communicate to young Tennesseans.
- Tennessee Emergency Management Agency (TEMA)
 - Coordinate all-hazard emergency preparedness, response, recovery, and mitigation activities to reduce the vulnerability of the people and property of Tennessee and ensure effective disaster relief and restoration.
 - Operates the State Emergency Operations Center to coordinate Tennessee and local actions and communicate critical emergency functions.



Military Department

 Supported the statewide COVID-19 response, in conjunction with six additional emergencies receiving federal disaster recognition, and civil unrest support.
 SEOC/JEOC has been activated for 565+ consecutive days.

Military Department - TEMA

- Deployed TEMA District Coordinators on 135 mission assignments directly supporting support local emergency response organizations with requests for assistance and resources.
- Coordinated distribution of over 250 million items (personal protective equipment, medical equipment, sanitizer, etc.) in response to COVID pandemic.
- Supported state and local preparedness by conducting 248 training courses for 3,965 state and local responder students in a COVID environment. A majority of these courses were conducted in communities across Tennessee.



Military Department - National Guard

- 700+ National Guardsmen brought on orders (COVID/Natural Disaster)
 - Over 941K COVID tests and vaccinated over 1.038M citizens
 - NG Staff Augmentation Sites support culminated in 65K man hours and over 730K patient contacts
 - Waverly Flood: 168 Soldiers/Airman (1,147 dump truck loads totaling 4.8M pounds debris)
 - Blackhawk Helicopter Aquatic Rescue Team: 21 Aug rescued 2 civilians and recovered 1
 - Hurricane IDA: Relief efforts w/ 325 National Guardsmen (Transportation/Military Police)
 - Conducted 8 aeromedical austere evac mission in Great Smoky Mountains (10/19-6/21)
 - Currently, 438 TNNG and 11 TN State Guard at 40 Staff Augmentation Sites
- Civil Unrest Support (1800+ National Guard soldiers and airman)
 - May 2020: Tennessee (Major Metropolitan areas)
 - June 2020: United States Capitol Response
 - January 2021: Inauguration Security
- Federal Funding: Army/Air National Guard \$70.6M (4/20 9/21), extension authorized \$13M for Pay and Allowances and \$4M for Travel and Per Diem, through 31 DEC 2021 for COVID-19 support efforts
- State Expenses: \$9.8M for State Active Duty personnel/support w/ 100% federal reimbursement through FEMA
