

## **Tracy Alcock** *General Counsel*

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Tracy Alcock serves as General Counsel for the Tennessee Department of General Services, where she leads the Office of General Counsel in providing legal guidance across the Department. She and her team advise on a wide range of matters, including contract and licensing review, rulemaking, and representation in legal proceedings. The office also plays a key role in reviewing proposed legislation and serves as the Department's liaison to the Governor's Legislative Office, the Tennessee General Assembly, and the Office of the Attorney General.



Alcock brings more than a decade of State service and extensive legal experience to her role. Most recently, she served as Deputy General Counsel for the Tennessee Department of Health, where she previously held the Senior Associate General Counsel position. As Deputy General Counsel, she managed a team of attorneys and paralegals who prosecuted disciplinary cases against healthcare professionals. Her team focused on complex cases, including those involving improper prescribing of opioids and other controlled substances. She also served as the advisory attorney for the Tennessee Board of Physician Assistants.

Earlier in her career, Alcock served as an Assistant Attorney General in the Criminal Appeals Division of the Tennessee Office of the Attorney General. In that role, she represented the State in criminal appellate matters and presented oral arguments before the Tennessee Court of Criminal Appeals. She also practiced in the private sector as an associate attorney at Evans | Petree, PC in Memphis, where she focused on construction law and advised clients on contract disputes, licensing, and delay and disruption claims.

Before entering the legal profession, Alcock worked as a Senior Marketing Analyst, developing expertise in data analysis, strategic planning, and project management.

Alcock earned her Juris Doctor, cum laude, from the University of Memphis Cecil C. Humphreys School of Law and her Bachelor of Science in International Marketing, magna cum laude, from the University of Alabama. While in law school, she served as Notes Editor for *The University of Memphis Law Review* and competed nationally in appellate advocacy, earning regional championships in both the 2010 San Francisco and 2011 Seattle American Bar Association competitions.

She is licensed to practice law in Tennessee and remains active in the legal and civic community. Alcock is a graduate of Lead Tennessee and the Nashville Bar Foundation Leadership Forum, and she previously served on the board of the Nashville Lawyers' Association for Women. She is also an active member of her church and serves on several church committees.
