• Spinal Muscular Atrophy Awareness Month The month of August is recognized as Spinal Muscular Atrophy (SMA) Awareness Month. This is a time of year in which the community works together to spread awareness about this rare disease both among the public and in the medical field. Spinal Muscular Atrophy (SMA) is a progressive neurodegenerative disease that affects the motor nerve cells in the spinal cord and impacts the muscles used for activities such as breathing, eating, crawling, and walking.

It is a hereditary neurological illness that inhibits voluntary muscle action, leading to gradual muscular weakness. There are different types of spinal muscular atrophy that are categorized by when symptoms first appear, such as loss of reflexes, muscle weakness and poor muscle tone, problems with feeding and swallowing, developmental delays, respiratory muscle weakness, tongue twitching, and a bell-shaped torso.

The purpose of SMA awareness is to demonstrate our support through local and national activities, promote awareness, educate people, raise funds for additional research, and aid in the hunt for a cure. It's intended that this month-long awareness campaign, and others like it in the future, would recognize every one of those whose lives are affected by and bring about future change. • Digestive Tract Paralysis also known as Gastroparesis Awareness Month Is a chronic digestive disease that affects your stomach's motility; the normal muscular contractions that enable your stomach to empty itself by moving food from the stomach to the small intestines. Serious problems can occur when your stomach stops moving food or takes too long to move food to the small intestines. Food that stays too long in the stomach can harden into masses called bezoars, causing vomiting, pain, and discomfort. This awareness was founded by the International Foundation for Gastrointestinal Disorders (IFFGD) to raise awareness, promote education, and encourage research.
