Dr. Holley	Roll Call, Introduction and Approval of Minutes.	There was a motion to accept the minutes. Motion seconded. Passed with a voice vote.			
	Update on Equipment list	Dr. Holley reviewed the changes that were made to the equipment list. Mrs. Tidwell stated that she had discussed the issue of Critical Care paramedics initiating blood, during transport, cross matched to the patient, with the Lab Board. Mrs. Tidwell stated that the Lab Board had reviewed it and they do not see a problem with it going forward. Once approved, it will go out onto the website. Dr. Holley discussed utilizing the KED device as a pelvic stabilization device. Dr. Holley stated that he believes that this device would suffice for a stabilization device. Dr. Holley asked for a motion to accept the KED as an acceptable pelvic stabilization device. There was a motion and second. Motion passed with a voice vote. Mrs. Tidwell asked Dr. Holley if language should be included to indicate that individuals must have proper training to			

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		<p>use the device for pelvic stabilization. He agreed. There was discussion as to how many traction splints are required and various combinations to meet this requirement. Dr. Holley stated that if they do not put it in the protocol that they have training on the device, they should have a memo stating that they have had training on the device. Dr. Holley discussed the x-collar. There was a discussion about getting training from an outside source for this product. The discussion concluded with a suggestion about letting a service to do a pilot testing of the x-collar. Mrs. Tidwell asked how we would determine the effectiveness. Dr. Holley suggested that they keep the required head blocks on the unit but test the x-collar for six (6) months.</p>
