# **BeHiP: Behavioral Health In Pediatrics**

## What is **BeHiP**?

The Tennessee Chapter of the American Academy of Pediatrics has partnered with BlueCare to develop the Behavioral Healthcare in Pediatrics (BeHiP) training program. BeHiP training provides pediatric healthcare providers with tools and strategies to screen for, assess, and manage patients with emotional, behavioral and substance abuse concerns. It also encompasses strategies to provide for more efficient workflow (including information on coding), more effective care, and improved family and physician relationships.

### What is the purpose of the BeHiP program?

- · Apply principles of systems-based practice to behavioral health disorders in the primary care pediatric setting
- Demonstrate ways to screen, assess and treat behavioral health concerns.
- Develop primary care office-based protocols to improve communication and collaboration with the behavioral health system of care.

**TCAPES – Mental Health Access Line:** TCAPES (Tennessee Child and Adolescent Psychiatry Education and Support) is partnering with the Tennessee Chapter of the American Academy of Pediatrics to expand its Behavioral Healthcare in Pediatrics training program. TCAPES is a program that supports the integration of mental health care into pediatric primary care. TCAPES will help address the increasing behavioral health needs of children and adolescents and the mental health provider shortages in Tennessee. TCAPES is funded by the Health Resources and Services Administration, or HRSA. This program will provide pediatric Primary Care Providers in Tennessee, with training on screening and management of behavioral health conditions, assistance in finding community resources and access to pediatric and adolescent psychiatry consultation services through same day telephone consultation. <u>About TCAPES (tn.gov)</u>
