Complaints

The Office of Investigations in the Division of Health Related Boards investigates complaints filed against practitioners licensed by the Department of Health. Complaints are investigated and reviewed to determine whether the practitioner's alleged conduct constitutes a violation of the licensing board's practice act (Tennessee law) or rules. 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Legislative Update

Public Chapter 529

If the Commissioner of Labor and Workforce Development receives a complaint that a person, licensed by a state regulatory Board, knowingly employs, recruits or refers for a fee for employment an illegal alien, that person is subject to an investigation and contested case hearing.

If there is proof a person knowingly employed, recruited or referred for a fee for employment, an illegal alien, which occurred while acting within the scope of practice of his/her license, the regulatory Board will be required to revoke, suspend, or deny the person's license.

For the first violation, the regulatory Board will be required to suspend the person's license until they show they no longer employ, recruit or refer for a fee for employment, an illegal alien. This can be made by the person filing a sworn statement that they no longer employ illegal aliens.

If a second violation occurs within three years from the first order, the regulatory agency will be required to suspend the person's license for one year. Effective January 1, 2008.

Public Chapter 83

The General Assembly passed a law that requires health care practitioners to report cases of suspected or confirmed domestic violence to the Tennessee Department of Health.

The mandatory monthly reporting is by a Web based system. The system was operational in October 2007. The Department will mail you the details of the required data to be reported and the instructions on how to use the reporting tool. The Board will also keep you informed as more information is available. Effective July 1, 2007.

Public Chapter 410

Public Chapter 410 creates the <u>Non-Smoker Protection Act</u> which **prohibits** smoking in all enclosed public places within the State of Tennessee including, but not limited to, the following places:

"Areas available to and customarily used by the general public in businesses and non-profit entities patronized by the public including, but not limited to, banks, laundromats, factories, **professional offices**, and retail service establishments; and, "health care facilities". (Nursing homes and long-term care facilities are exempt.)

The legislation requires offices and health care facilities to do the following:

- Inform all existing employees and any prospective employees upon their application for employment of the prohibition on smoking; and
- "No Smoking" signs or the international "No Smoking" symbol, shall be clearly and conspicuously posted at every entrance to every public place and place of employment where smoking is prohibited.

The Department of Health shall, while an establishment is undergoing otherwise mandated inspections, inspect for compliance with this Act. Information about these inspections will be communicated with the appropriate offices and/or health care facilities in the future. Effective October 1, 2007.

Non-Compliance with License/Certificate Renewal Requirements

Chiropractors, chiropractic x-ray technicians and chiropractic therapy assistants who fail to renew their licenses/certificates pursuant to Rule 0260-2-.09, 0260-3-.09 and 0260-5-.09 are subject to disciplinary action. The licensee must pay a \$100 monthly civil penalty for each month the licensee has worked on an expired license, after an initial three month grace period.

Rule Amendments

Rule amendments pertaining to titles, interviews, conditions (0260-2-.03, .07, .15; 0260-3-.14; 0260-5-.14) were approved by the Board on August 9, 2007 and sent to the Tennessee Attorney General on November 20, 2007. The rules were approved by the Tennessee Attorney General and filed with the Secretary of State on October 27, 2008. They will go into effect on January 10, 2009.

Rule amendments pertaining to continuing education (0260-2-.12, 0260-3.12, and 0260-5-.12) were approved by the Board on November 29, 2007 and sent to the Tennessee Attorney General on December 3, 2007. The rules were approved by the Tennessee Attorney General and filed with the Secretary of State on October 29, 2008. They will go into effect on January 12, 2008.

Reprimanded. Unprofessional conduct. Assessed \$1,700 civil penalty.

Continuing Education Audit

Pursuant to Rule 0260-2-.12, each licensee is required to complete twenty-four (24) clock hours of Board-approved continuing education each calendar year (January 1-December 31). If the licensee practices acupuncture, six (6) of the twenty-four (24) hours shall pertain to such acupuncture practice.

New licensees are required to complete a six (6) hours Board-approved course in risk management,

sexual/professional boundaries, and Tennessee statutory and regulatory chiropractic jurisprudence as part of the twenty-four (24) clock hour requirement for the first calendar year continuing education is required.

Each licensee shall submit proof of completion of the annual continuing education requirements to the Board's administrative office no later than January 15th of the year immediately following the end of each calendar year. Such proof may be transmitted electronically by using the fax to e-mail number listed above. Each licensee must retain copies of proof of attendance and completion of all continuing education requirements for a period of four years.

2007 Continuing Education Audit Results

Of the 915 licensed Chiropractors in 2007, 340 were non-compliant.

Of the 313 licensed Chiropractic Therapy Assistants in 2007, 83 were non-compliant.

Of the 85 licensed Chiropractic X-ray Technicians on 2007, 30 were non-compliant.

Non-Compliance with Continuing Education Requirements

Chiropractors, chiropractic x-ray technologists and chiropractic therapy assistants who fail to comply with the continuing education requirements pursuant to Rule 10450-2-.05 are subject to disciplinary action. Chiropractors must pay a \$600 civil penalty. Chiropractic x-ray technologists and chiropractic therapy assistants must pay a \$300 civil penalty. The licensee must pay the civil penalty within thirty (30) days of notification from the Board, obtain the deficient continuing education hours by the end of the next calendar year and complete an additional five (5) continuing education hours by the end of the next calendar year in the category of diagnosis, treatment and management in the practice of chiropractic, in addition to the deficient hours and current biennial continuing education hour requirement.
