

# **INFLUENZA-LIKE ILLNESS (ILI)**

### Percent of Outpatient Visits for Influenza-Like Illness Week 15




The U.S. Outpatient Influenza-like Illness Surveillance Network (ILINet) monitors outpatient visits for respiratory illness referred to as influenza-like illness (ILI). Tennessee has approximately 100 sentinel providers across the state that contribute this data weekly from a variety of healthcare setting such as primary care, pediatrics, county health departments, student health centers, and emergency departments.

ILI is defined as a fever plus cough or sore throat, not laboratory-confirmed influenza. Therefore these data may capture respiratory illness visits due to infection with any pathogen that can present with similar symptoms, including influenza, SARS-CoV-2, and RSV.



# **INFLUENZA-LIKE ILLNESS (ILI)**



ILI is defined as a fever plus cough or sore throat, not laboratory-confirmed influenza. Therefore these data may capture respiratory illness visits due to infection with any pathogen that can present with similar symptoms, including influenza, SARS-CoV-2, and RSV.

\*CDC develops state-specific baselines by calculating the mean percentage of patient visits for ILI during non-influenza weeks for the most recent two seasons and adding two standard deviations (2021-2022 and 2022-2023). A non-influenza time period (e.g., a "non-influenza week") is defined as two or more consecutive weeks in which each week accounted for less than 2% of the season's total number of specimens that tested positive for influenza in public health laboratories.


