Re: Proposal to Modify Children's Health Plan (to include Miracle Field)

Dear Commissioner Piercey and Commissioner Oliver:

We are in receipt of your letters dated June 7 and June 9, 2021 responding to our amendment request to add the Miracle Field project to the Children's Health Plan. Ballad Health ("Ballad") appreciates the time you have taken to review our proposal and we are glad to see that you are in agreement regarding the benefits the project will provide the region.

Both letters indicated that Ballad would only receive credit for the portion of Ballad's spend that occurred after the plan modification was submitted. Ballad disagrees with the states' position on this issue. We believe Ballad should receive credit for the total amount spent towards this project since the project, as both of your letters note, is consistent with the objectives of the Children's Health plan, the Tennessee Terms of Certification (the "TOC"), and the Virginia Order and Authorizing a Cooperative Agreement (the "CA"). We would like to work with both states to resolve this interpretation matter in the near future. However, until the matter of 'prospective credit' is mutually resolved, in order to ensure consistent application of the states' current position, we ask that you consider applying \$150,000 towards Ballad's commitment, rather than the \$100,000. This is the total amount that will be spent on the project after Ballad's proposal to modify the Children's Health Plan was submitted on March 17, 2021.

By way of background, Ballad's \$250,000 pledge towards the Miracle Field project was structured as five installment payments of \$50,000. Ballad made the first two installment payments on January 14, 2020 (payment was made after invoicing from the City of Kingsport, which is why the first two years were included in one payment). As you will see from the attached cancelled check, Ballad made the third installment payment on March 18, 2021 - after the plan amendment for this project was filed. Ballad intends to make the final two installment payments in FY22 (\$50,000) and FY23 (\$50,000). We appreciate your willingness to credit Ballad for the spending that has occurred since the plan

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amendment was filed and respectfully request that the amount be adjusted to be consistent with the approach set forth in your letters.

Your letters also requested that Ballad provide a schedule of milestones and metrics related to the project. As previously noted, this facility is owned by the City of Kingsport, not Ballad. While Ballad is a financial supporter of the project, our organization has no oversight or management of the Miracle Field's development and operation. The City of Kingsport is estimating that 500-600 children will use the Miracle Field facility annually, but this is an outdoor recreational facility that anyone can use at any time, so those numbers may vary greatly.

Given the nature of Ballad's involvement with this project, we are proposing the following milestones and metrics for the Miracle Field project:

- Ballad's third \$50,000 installment pledge shall be made no later than June 30, 2021.
  - This is satisfied by the payment made on March 18, 2021, as evidenced by the attached cancelled check.
- Ballad's fourth \$50,000 installment pledge shall be made no later than June 30, 2022.
- Ballad's fifth \$50,000 installment pledge shall be made no later than June 30, 2023.

As requested, Ballad will include this project and the investment in the next version of the Children's Health Plan and provide updates on the project at the Quarterly Meetings that are held with both states. This project is already having a positive impact on the health and well-being of a vulnerable subset of the service area population. Ballad appreciates your support as we work to improve children's health across our region.
