


COVID-19 Trends in TN & US


- Tennessee

Syndromic Surveillance







NHSN Updates

Hospital Data Reporting -Annual Reporters

- As a reminder, the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) will require the following facility types to report Hospital Respiratory Data (HRD) to NHSN on a onceannual basis beginning in January 2025:
 - Freestanding inpatient rehabilitation facilities (including Medicaid-Only Rehabilitation Hospitals)
 - Freestanding inpatient psychiatric facilities (including Medicaid-Only Psychiatric Hospitals)
 - CMS-certified inpatient rehabilitation facility units (IRF within a hospital; distinct part units)
 - CMS-certified inpatient psychiatric facility units (IPF within a hospital; distinct part units)

Annual Facility Survey Forms

 Annual facility surveys can be found by looking under your facility's list of alerts and selecting the 2024 Survey or by using the left navigation banner and selecting "Add" found in the "Surveys" tab.

Within each blank form, a link to the table of instructions is included, which provides guidance for each question on the survey (as per screenshot below).

Annual Facility Survey Forms

- The 2024 Patient Safety Annual Facility Survey will introduce two new sections: Venous Thromboembolism (VTE) Practices and Prevention Practices.
- Facilities will have the option to temporarily save an incomplete survey.
- The annual Survey Data are used for calculating SIRS.
 Ensuring survey data is entered correctly is essential for reflecting accurate facility SIRS.



Questionnaire on Blood Culture Media Bottles

- The CDC is asking NHSN users to reply to a questionnaire to assess the potential impact on hospitals due to the disruption to the supply of BD BACTEC[™] blood culture media bottles.
- The questionnaire has been available since December 14, 2024, in the NHSN application and highly encouraged you to complete the questionnaire.


- Our Annual Training series is back for 2025!
