


Emerging Trends Brief: Illicit Benzodiazepines in Tennessee

Illicit or "designer" benzodiazepines, a class of illegally manufactured benzodiazepines, have been linked to overdose deaths nationwide and in Tennessee (TN). In 2023, TDH published an article comparing the impact of this emerging drug class and prescription benzodiazepines. This brief covers basic trends on illicit benzodiazepine-involved deaths of TN residents captured by the TN State Unintentional Drug Overdose Reporting System (SUDORS).

Illicit Benzodiazepine-Involved Deaths in Tennessee by County, 2019-2023

Below are the number of illicit benzodiazepine-involved overdose deaths for Tennessee residents by their county of residence





Bromazolam emerged as the dominant illicit benzodiazepine in 2023


Bromazolam represented 90% of illicit benzodizepine-involved deaths in 2023, compared to 40% in 2022.

Opioids and benzodiazepines taken together can increase overdose risk



Taking both an opioid and a benzodiazepine together can slow your breathing too much. This can cause an overdose and possibly death.

- 1 Fentanyl
- 2 Methamphetamine

96% of illicit benzodiazepineinvolved deaths also involved an opioid
