Dr. Joe Holley	Old Business	Off-Load Protocol Brandon Ward provided background discussion regarding difficulty with off-load times from 2-4 hours and up to 8 hours on some calls causing considerable impacts to EMS availability. Dr. Holley was asked to provide a set of guidelines addressing this concern while addressing patient safety. The 'Delayed Off Loading of Stable Non-Emergent Patients in the ED' Procedure is part of the clinical guidelines and was shared in the meeting. Current language of Lieutenant or Battalion 20 can be adjusted to fit the department using the protocol. Discussion around the use of this protocol for higher level acuity patients which may need to occur on a local/regional basis with concern for patient safety and collaboratively as hospital capacity concerns increase. This is a State protocol and can be adapted/excluded by an	n/a	n/a	n/a

individual service. In some areas, this has been a			
long-standing issue the needs continued evaluation			
at the State level. Motion to approve protocol by

Discussion regarding the impact of this protocol			
addressing the delays in off-load since it could be			
adapted/excluded by individual services. Motion			
was amended by Jeffrey Feike to a motion to			
support rather than to approve this protocol.			
Discussion also included the State expanding			
reimbursement of TennCare ambulance transports			
to facilities other than Emergency Departments			
which may be more appropriate settings. Motion			
carried by unanimous Roll Call vote (no vote by			
Gary Ross).			
COVID-19 Impacts			
Seeing an increase in numbers of COVID-19			
patients. This number is expected to continue to			
increase. Illness has impacted some services with			
significant impacts on staff. Dept. o EMS allowed			
those services to utilize EMRs as drivers after State			
of Emergency was declared in those counties.			
Seeing impacts on educational system regarding			
clinical opportunities and transitions to virtual	n/a		
learning. Facilities concerns not accepting patients		,	,
without a negative COVID-19 test and/or not		n/a	n/a
allowing EMS into the building without a negative			
COVID-19 test. Executive Order 67, section 10.2,			
allows EMS personnel to work in any acute care			
settings in a hospital with an approved plan by the			
hospital. The State EMS office will be involved in			
table-top exercise regarding upcoming vaccination			
plans. Much of the office continues to work			
remotely. Continued concern for air medical crews			
transporting COVID-19 patients, even with proper			

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PPE. Some services are not transporting COVID-19 patients on BiPAP. State EMS will accept 100% online CEUs (if CAPSE) approved for this renewal cycle.			
CARES Project Requires a data manager dedicated to the project. In process of purchasing data reporting system that will enable pulling of data from current system.
