- Updated the committee on the CSMD Advisory Committee Rules
 - Rule 1140-11.02 Shall be deleted in its entirety and replaced with: Rule 1140-11.02 Drugs of Abuse
 - (1) The Committee has found that Schedule V controlled substances demonstrate a potential for abuse and should be reported to the CSMD as authorized by TENN. CODE ANN. § 53-10-304. However, Schedule V controlled substances which may be dispensed without a prescription do not have to be reported to the database. Some definitions were removed
 - o Rule 1140-11.05: Shall be deleted in its entirety
 - o Rule 1140-11.06: Shall be deleted in its entirety
 - o Rule 1140-11.07: Shall be deleted in its entirety
 - New definitions have been added



- Asked the committee for permission not to hold a rule making hearing before February 3, 2020 to repeal 1140-11.02 to be replaced by the new 1140-11.02; and to repeal 1140-11.05, 1140-11.06, and 1140-11.07,
 - o Mark Young made the motion to accept Mr. Coffman not to have a rule making hearing before February 3, 2020, and Dr. Tharp second the motion,
 - Move by acclimation to not hold a rule making hearing before February 3, 2020 were approved

CSMD Director's Report – Dr. D. Todd Bess

- Gateway Amendment Update
 - TN's strategy to offer statewide Electronic Health Record (EHR)/Pharmacy Management software workflow integration using Gateway Service has been shared during the outreach programs
 - o TDH contract logistics have delayed the efforts to finalize the required contract amendment that would allow the project to begin
- CSMD Enhancements: Law Enforcement Update
 - o Roles In Production
 - District Attorney General
 - Law Enforcement Officer
 - o Roles Completed and awaiting date to move to production
 - Tennessee Bureau of Investigation (TBI) Director
 - TBI Agent
 - Roles in Development
 - Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) Assistant Special Agent In Charge (ASAC)
 - DEA Agent
 - Drug Court Judge
- Tennessee currently working on interstate data sharing with Florida;
 - Florida will have to make changes in the way their roles are populated prior to go live
- Tennessee is now sharing data with the following states:
 - o Rhode Island
 - o Iowa
 - o Delaware
 - Missouri (one way sharing with the St. Louis County Program so TN can now request data from that program)
- Tennessee is targeting the following states to share data:
 - Massachusetts
 - Wisconsin
- Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 63-1-160 (d), on or after January 1, 2021, any



prescription for a Schedule II, III, IV, or V controlled substance issued by a prescriber who is authorized by law to prescribe the drug must be issued as an electronic prescription from the person issuing the prescription to a pharmacy. The name, address, and telephone number of the collaborating physician of an advanced practice registered nurse or physician assistant must be included on electronic prescriptions issued by an advance practice registered nurse or physician assistant.

- Dr. Bess discussed the percentage of documented electronic prescription submitted to the CSMD and encouraged the CSMD Committee members to share this information with their boards. This provides an opportunity for you as Committee members to include this information in upcoming outreach opportunities that the Committee members may participate during the next year.
