



bring back before this Committee for discussion possible other aggravating facts that the Board could consider when looking to go above the minimum discipline guidelines.

The third agenda item was to discuss and act regarding competency questions on the Special Volunteer application. Dr. Blake provided an overview which came up from an individual wanting to abbreviate or bypass some of the requirements of the application when applying for a Special Volunteer license. The requirements are straight forward cannot be changed or abbreviated. Dr. Saunders provided an explanation of the pathways to apply for a Special Volunteer by those that have not been previously licensed in Tennessee and those that have. The Committee reviewed the Special Volunteer application and noticed the competency questions do not mirror the changes the Board made to the full medical license application. After a discussion the Committee ask the administrative staff to investigate updating the questions to mirror the initial full medical license application and to check that all other initial applications mirror the same language.

The fourth and final agenda item was to discuss and act regarding CMEs for voluntary service. Dr. Blake informed the Committee that we are waiting on more information on this subject matter. A new statute 63.6.712 was developed and TMA is currently developing a process that could verify CME for volunteer services.

There was no public comment and the meeting adjourned at 5:54 pm.
