- Ecuador Independence Day Independence Day is a national public holiday celebrated annually on August 10 in Ecuador. In Spanish, it is known as "Da del Primer Grito de Independencia de Quito," "Day of Quito's First Cry of Independence." The Ecuadorians were the first in Latin America to declare independence and inspired other nations. On this date in 1809, the inhabitants of Quito, the current capital of Ecuador, rebelled against Spain and declared their independence. Its name in Spanish means "the equator," which rightly defines its location on the globe.
- National Minority Donor Awareness Week National Minority Donor Awareness Week is a way of bringing light to the need of more minority donors. This particularly highlights the urgent need for more organ, eye, and tissue donors, especially within the minority communities and it also gives acknowledgement and praise to those who already donated. The African-American, Asian, Hispanic, Native American, and Pacific Islander-American communities, experts have voiced concerns about the serious shortage of transplants but minorities make up 57% of those on the organ waiting list and only 30% of the donor population. Tennesseans can register their consent for donation at any TDOS Driver License Center, or with Donate Life Tennessee at www.tndonorregistry.org.
- National Health Center Week (NHCW) The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services Office of Minority Health (CMS OMH) recognizes National Health Center Week (NHCW) from August 6-12. NHCW, sponsored by the National Association of Community Health Centers (NACHC), celebrates the nearly 1,400 Community Health Centers (CHCs) nationwide that provide health care services to 30 million+ patients across more than 14,000 communities each year. This year's NHCW theme is "The Roadmap to a Stronger America," highlighting the ways that CHCs have improved the quality of and access to health care for diverse communities across the United States. CHCs serve a disproportionate number of people with a low income and people from racial and ethnic minorities, in addition to patients living in rural areas and those with limited English proficiency. Through the Coverage to Care (C2C) initiative, CMS OMH connects CHCs and other providers to materials they can share with patients to help them understand their health coverage and the care options available to them.
