# **TOPICS OF DISCUSSION**

Focus: Monkey Pox also known as MPX

**Presenter:** Julie Shaffner, Epidemiologist of Emergency Preparedness Program and Dr. Caitlin Newhouse, Medical Director for Vaccine Preventable Diseases Program TN Department of Health

**Summary:** This presentation provides information regarding the Monkey Pox Disease, which is deep-seated pustular painful, itchy, and highly infectious legions. There are different strains of MPX, and this strain is not in the US as we know at this time. The signs and symptoms are 99% rash, malaise, fever and lymphadenopathy (swollen lymph nodes). Monkey Pox can last up to 2- 4 weeks. Monkey Pox was discovered in 1958 and in Central and West Africa. Monkey Pox is considered an Orthopoxviral, cousin to variola, smallpox and cowpox. As of August 17, 2022, nearly 40,000 Monkey Pox cases been detected globally, an estimate of 14,000 cases in the US. Tennessee first case was detected July 2022 and 99 cases been found across the state so far. Monkey Pox spreads through direct skin to skin, intimate and face to face contact and bodily fluids or indirect contact with items that have been contaminated with fluids or sores on clothing or bedding, that have not been disinfected.

Everyone is prone to this disease adults, adolescents, children and even pregnant women. People living with HIV might be at an even higher risk due to severity and prolonged disease. MPX Testing is a PCR Test with a swab over the rash and legions, to receive MPX Testing you must call your primary care doctor. to receive. Treatment available is called TPOX, which is a Smallpox treatment, and there are also (2) products of vaccine both licensed for smallpox. The vaccines are ACAM2000 and JYNNEOS. The ACAM200 huge supply and JYNNEOS, is very limited supply, receive (2) doses, 28 days apart. MPX Vaccine is only available at your local Health Departments.
