Tennessee Department of Health Tennessee Birth Defects Surveillance System (TNBDSS)

During the period 2011 – 2016, there were 16,138 babies (about 2,690 babies per year) diagnosed with birth defects in Tennessee. The Tennessee Department of Health's Tennessee Birth Defects Surveillance System (TNBDSS) is a statewide surveillance program, outlined in Tennessee Code Annotated § 68-5-506.
