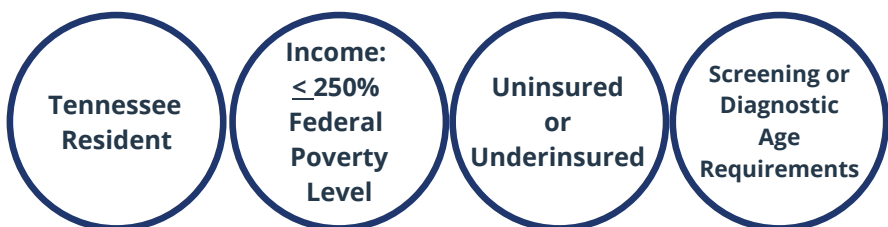


Tennessee Breast and Cervical Screening Program

Fiscal Year 2021 (July 1, 2020 - June 30, 2021)

The Tennessee Breast and Cervical Screening Program (TBCSP) operates in all 95 counties by providing screening and diagnostic procedures for breast or cervical cancer and enrollment into TennCare for treatment for eligible individuals. The TBCSP aims to serve the most vulnerable populations, specifically those who are low-income and uninsured or underinsured.

Program Eligibility Guidelines:



Nearly 400 vendors, including local health departments, radiologists, breast centers, and Federally Qualified Health Centers, provide services throughout Tennessee.



12,125 women served

Among more than 86,300 eligible women in Tennessee, almost 14% received cancer screening through TBCSP

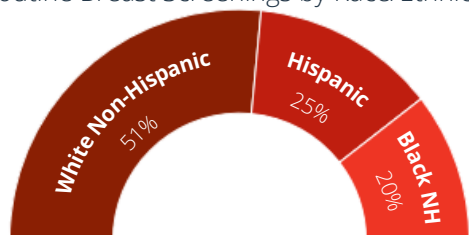


Over 10,800 breast services provided

29% Increase in Black Women

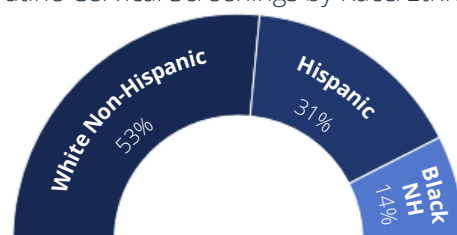


Over 4,300 cervical services provided

Men are eligible for diagnostic breast services if they meet the other program eligibility requirements and can be enrolled in TennCare if breast cancer is diagnosed.
