This letter is submitted on behalf of Baptist Trinity Home Care-Private Pay Division ("Baptist-Trinity") for the purpose of requesting an additional year of inactive status as described below.

Baptist-Trinity is owned by Baptist Memorial Health Care Corporation ("BMHCC"), a nonprofit health system based in Memphis. BMHCC operates hospitals and other health care facilities, and provides physician services and a wide variety of other health services, in Tennessee, Mississippi, and Arkansas. Baptist-Trinity is a home health agency authorized to provide services in Fayette, Hardeman, Haywood, Shelby, and Tipton counties. It is not Medicare or Medicaid certified, and it has historically provided private duty home health services to commercially-insured and self-pay patients.

As you are aware, Baptist-Trinity was previously granted inactive status under T.C.A. § 68-11-206(b). Since that time, Baptist-Trinity has continued to evaluate whether there is a continued need for the services previously offered under this license. That evaluation remains ongoing.

Baptist-Trinity therefore respectfully requests approval for an additional year of inactive status in order to allow further time to consider potential future operations of the agency.
