CERTIFICATE OF NEED STANDARDS AND CRITERIA FOR

HOME HEALTH SERVICES

- 1. Determination of Need:** In a given county, 1.5 percent of the total population will be considered as the need estimate for home health services in that county. This 1.5 percent formula will be applied as a general guideline, as a means of comparison within the proposed Service Area.

Response: Please see Table 1N-2R below, which uses the 1.5 percent formula for 2025 (the latest available year of JAR data) and projects need for three years to 2028. Naven notes that the underlying rationale stated for this standard is expressly conservative, which is borne out by the analysis herein.

Further, Naven asserts that the home health services determination of need formula is not applicable to the services it proposes to develop – home health services limited to delivering home infusion therapies. As such, the need for the proposed project is supported by qualitative factors beyond the quantitative determination of need formula defined above. These factors are discussed in detail in the response to #4 below.

It should also be noted that, in recent years, the Health Facilities Commission (“HFC”) has consistently approved CON applications proposing to establish home care organizations limited to home infusion services, despite the 1.5 percent formula. Most recently, the HFC approved an application from OPTIV Infusion, LLC to develop a home care organization limited to home infusion and related nursing services for pharmacy patients of OPTIVRX, LLC (CN2602-006A). The HFC has also recently approved CON applications from River City Infusion, LLC (CN2511-042A), Amerita, Inc. (CN2503-008A), and KabaFusion TN (CN2405-012A and CN2408-021A), among others, that proposed to provide home infusion services. As with these past projects, the HFC should not rely solely on the need formula above to evaluate the need for Naven’s project.

For a detailed discussion of the need for Naven’s proposed project, see the

response to #4 of the Standards and Criteria below.

2. The need for home health services should be projected three years from the latest available year of final JAR data.

Response: Please see Table 1N-2R below for the current and future estimated need in each of the 95 proposed service area counties, including CON-exempt Grundy County and Lake County, using the 1.5 percent formula.

Additionally, please see Attachment 1N-3R for supplemental use rate data, including the number of HHAs reporting patients served in 2025 and projections for each county’s home health capacities in 2028. Because Naven proposes to offer exclusively home infusion services, any home health surpluses suggested in Attachment 1N-3R do not reflect the need for Naven’s proposed project. The majority of Tennessee HHAs, including those licensed in the counties listed in Attachment 1N-3R, do not offer home infusion services; a majority of the small number of HHAs that do offer home infusion services are limited to patients of their own specialty pharmacies. Thus, Naven is certain there is a need for additional home health infusion services and that it has the expertise to deliver this care efficiently and effectively.

4. **County Need Standard:** The applicant should demonstrate that there is a need for home health services in each county in the proposed Service Area by providing documentation (e.g., letters) where: a) health care providers had difficulty or were unable successfully to refer a patient to a home care organization and/or were dissatisfied with the quality of services provided by existing home care organizations based on Medicare’s system Home Health Compare and/or similar data; b) potential patients or providers in the proposed Service Area attempted to find appropriate home health services but were not able to secure such services; c) providers supply an estimate of the potential number of patients that they might refer to the applicant.

Response: As previously noted above, Attachment 1N-3R does not capture the specific need for home infusion therapy services, as very few HHAs in Tennessee offer such services. In fact, as shown in Attachment 5N, of the 175 Tennessee HHAs reported in the 2025 JARs for Home Health Agencies, only 13, or seven percent, provided home infusion therapy services. Additionally, many of the HHAs that provide home infusion therapy services can only serve patients of their own specialty pharmacies. For example, TwelveStone Infusion Support’s CON (CN2205-025A) is limited to serving “pharmacy patients of pharmacies which are subsidiaries of TwelveStone Holdings, Inc.” Similarly, KabaFusion TN (CN2405-012A and CN2408-021A) was approved to serve “pharmacy patients of pharmacies which are subsidiaries of KabaFusion Holdings LLC.” The utilization of these two existing HHAs in the 2025 JAR for Home Health Agencies – 80 unduplicated patients for TwelveStone Infusion Support and 10 unduplicated patients for KabaFusion TN – supports this exclusivity.

Many recently approved but not yet implemented CONs to initiate home infusion services in Tennessee have a similar restriction on their patient populations. For example, Amerita, Inc. (CN2503-008A) is limited to providing home infusion and related nursing services for patients of pharmacies owned by Amerita, Inc.; River City Infusion, LLC (CN2511-042A) is limited to home infusion and related nursing services for pharmacy patients of RCIV, LLC; and OPTIV Infusion, LLC (CN2602-006A) is limited to home infusion and related nursing services for pharmacy patients of OPTIVRX, LLC. In other words, many existing or approved home infusion providers do not have the ability to provide home infusion care to *any* patient requiring such care.

Given the limitations of the need formula discussed in the response to #1 above and the limited access to home infusion services noted above, the need for Naven’s project is well-supported by a series of qualitative factors: its experience in Tennessee and across the U.S. delivering home infusion services, including home infusion services to specialty pharmacies with home health licenses; inadequate access to home infusion services for patients of Naven’s specialty pharmacy partners that lack home health licenses; and the accessibility and cost of care benefits associated with chronically ill patients receiving specialty infusion services at home. These factors are discussed

below.

Naven's Infusion Care Experience

Naven is a nationwide skilled nursing staffing agency that specializes in delivering infusion care to patients with chronic conditions. Through its network of skilled nurses, Naven partners with over 90 specialty pharmacies across the United States to provide the following infusion services for chronically ill patients:

- Alpha 1 Therapy
- Antibiotics
- Hemophilia Therapy
- Steroids
- Enzyme Replacement
- Immunotherapies
- Biologics
- Inotropes
- HIV Therapy
- First-Dosing

Naven also assists pharmaceutical manufacturers with patient access and adherence services, which includes the management of custom programs featuring highly specialized nurse support, patient education programs, drug administration training, and therapy adherence programs, among other services. Naven also provides clinical trial nurse training for Clinical/Contract Research Organizations.¹

In Tennessee, Naven contracts with over 30 existing specialty pharmacies to provide comprehensive infusion services, including home infusion for those pharmacies that hold home health licenses, as well as ambulatory infusion center staffing and patient education and support. In 2025, for those specialty pharmacies with Tennessee home health licenses – which include Coram CVS Specialty Infusion Services, Optum Infusion Services, and Option Care² – Naven delivered home-based, specialty infusion care to over 300 patients across 70 Tennessee counties. This care was provided through a network of 70 nurses, supporting the breadth of Naven's existing nursing network for its current services and the proposed project. Naven also currently operates 15 licensed HHAs nationwide, as well as two HHAs with pending accreditation. Thus, Naven is well-positioned to deliver more expansive home infusion services through the proposed project.

Specialty Pharmacy Partners Need for Home Health Providers

As mentioned throughout the application, very few existing HHAs in Tennessee provide home infusion services. This is largely due to the specialization needed to provide this type of care. Home infusion care, which involves administering specialty drugs, is typically delivered frequently, often several times a week over a period of multiple weeks. This requires complex coordination of care and nursing staff who are familiar with infusion medications and administration methods. Traditional HHAs generally do not have the professional expertise or capacity to deliver this type of care. As such, home infusion requires a specialized provider with appropriately trained staff and the staffing necessary to support infusion medication administration.

In addition, many of Naven's specialty pharmacy partners in Tennessee lack home health licenses, leaving a significant gap in infusion care for patients of these pharmacies. Currently, these specialty pharmacies do not have the ability to administer medications to patients in the comfort of their own homes. Thus, they require Naven's staffing support to provide these medications at outpatient infusion centers or, in some cases, inpatient settings. Given that specialty pharmacy patients typically receive medications for chronic and other debilitating conditions, such as autoimmune diseases and neurological disorders, the majority of these pharmacies' patients are chronically ill and may face difficulties travelling to an outpatient location to receive infusion services. Additionally, for patients living in more rural areas, it is often infeasible to travel a significant distance to receive infusion care in an outpatient setting, necessitating time away from home or work and travel coordination with family members or caregivers.

Specialty pharmacies' demand for high quality home infusion providers and, as a result, the need for Naven's project, are made clear through the significant growth in infusion patient volume Naven has experienced since it began operating in Tennessee in May 2023. Based on internal data, Naven provided home infusion care to 270 Tennessee patients in 2024 and 303 patients in 2025 via its partnerships with existing specialty pharmacies with home health licenses. In other words, the total number of Tennessee patients Naven served increased by 12.2 percent over only one year. Naven also continues to serve a growing portion of Tennessee counties. In its first year of operation, Naven cared for patients across 52 Tennessee counties; this number increased to 69 counties in 2024 and to 70 counties in 2025. This rapid growth is indicative of the need for Naven's project, particularly in counties where it does not yet serve patients; Naven's high quality services; and its ability to scale its staff appropriately to meet patient needs across Tennessee.

Accessibility and Care Benefits of Home Infusion Services

Naven's Tennessee patient population covers the majority of the state, including many rural service area counties. Based on the latest available U.S.

Census data, 78 of the 95 counties in Tennessee are rural (82 percent);³ of the 70 counties Naven served in 2025, 53 (more than 75 percent) were considered rural. These counties are noted in Table 6N-1 included in Attachment 6N.

Rural patient populations have more difficulty accessing healthcare services and an overall greater need for healthcare services. Compared to patients in urban areas, rural patients are more likely to suffer from chronic diseases and worse health outcomes, which leads to elevated rates of morbidity and excess mortality.⁴ Residents in these areas also face multiple barriers to accessing vital medical care, including longer travel distances to healthcare providers, higher uninsured rates, and poorer health literacy.⁵ Importantly for this project, research also shows that rural areas are far less likely than urban areas to have adequate access to home health services. Findings from the Rural & Minority Health Research Center indicated that 10.3 percent of rural ZIP Code Tabulation Areas (“ZCTAs”)⁶ lack any home health services, compared to only 2.2 percent of urban ZCTAs.⁷

Given that patients receiving specialty infusion medications are likely sicker and may have greater difficulties travelling to a specific location for care, it is important that these chronically ill patients have readily accessible healthcare options, including the opportunity to receive infusion care in their homes. Further, the advantages of home-based infusion extend well beyond the improvement of patient choice. For patients managing chronic or complex conditions – the majority of patients Naven serves today – the ability to receive infusion therapy in the home setting represents a meaningful clinical and quality-of-life benefit that cannot be replicated in an ambulatory infusion center. In the home setting, patients can receive their prescribed therapies on a schedule that accommodates their daily lives, reducing the disruptions to work, family obligations, and routine that are an unavoidable consequence of repeated visits to an outpatient facility. This flexibility supports patient adherence to prescribed treatment regimens – a critical factor in achieving

positive health outcomes for patients managing conditions requiring long-term infusion therapy.

Home infusion also facilitates a more personalized and continuous care relationship between the patient and the clinical team. Skilled nurses who deliver home infusion services develop an intimate familiarity with the patient's living environment, support systems, and day-to-day health status – insights that are difficult to develop through periodic visits to an outpatient facility. This continuity of care enables clinicians to identify changes in a patient's condition more quickly, intervene proactively, and communicate more effectively with the broader care team, all of which contribute to better health outcomes and reduced rates of preventable hospitalization.

More generally, given the relatively small number of home infusion providers in Tennessee, adding a provider capable of serving patients in all 95 service area counties promotes care that is cost-effective. As noted above, the medications provided by Naven's specialty pharmacy partners are largely for chronically ill patients. If patients cannot receive their medications at home, they must instead travel to receive these medications in an outpatient setting. This results in unnecessary travel for the patient or a patient's caregivers, costing both time and expenses for travel. For rural patients, this is especially significant. Worse, in some cases, patients who do not receive their medications in a timely manner may have to be admitted to an acute care facility and receive their medications on an inpatient basis. This is a much more costly means of receiving care and may result in undue stress for that patient and their loved ones. Administering these infusions in the home setting is more cost-effective than other settings, especially for patients receiving multiple infusion treatments for an extended period of time.

By operating its own licensed HHA, Naven will be able to provide home infusion services to all patients within its expansive existing network of specialty pharmacies partners – not just those that currently hold their own home health licenses. Naven already has a track record demonstrating its ability to deliver home infusion care to patients across the state, including those in rural areas. Expanded access to home infusion services promotes more timely, convenient and cost-effective care that reduces burdens on patients and their families. Overall, Naven believes these qualitative factors demonstrate the need for the proposed project and Naven's ability to meet this need.

- 5. Current Service Area Utilization:** The applicant should document by county: a) all existing providers of home health services within the proposed Service Area; and b) the number of patients served during the most recent 12-month period for which data are available. To characterize existing providers located within Tennessee, the applicant should use final data provided by the JARs maintained by the Tennessee Department of Health. In each county of the proposed Service Area, the applicant should identify home health agencies that have reported serving 5 or fewer patients for each of the last three years based on final and available JAR data. If an agency in the proposed Service Area who serves few or no patients is opposing the application, that opponent agency should provide evidence as to why it does not serve a larger number of patients.

Response: Please see Attachment 5N. HHAs that reported serving five or fewer patients for each of the last three years are highlighted in yellow. Attachment 5N also indicates whether an HHA treating patients in the proposed service area provides infusion therapy services, according to data those agencies submitted for the JAR. For those that do, the visits and hours per patient have been included.

- 6. Adequate Staffing:** Using TDH Licensure data, the applicant should document a plan demonstrating the intent and ability to recruit, hire, train, assess competencies of, supervise, and retain the appropriate numbers of qualified personnel to provide the services described in the application and document that such personnel are available to work in the proposed Service Area. The applicant should state the percentage of qualified personnel directly employed or employed through a third party staffing agency.

Response: Please see the response to Question 8Q for a detailed discussion of the staffing needs of the proposed project. Naven believes it will require 29.00 FTEs of staff in its first full project year. This includes 21.00 FTEs of direct care positions and 8.00 FTEs of non-patient care positions. Of note, 26.75 of these 29.00 FTEs are existing FTEs currently employed by or contracted with Naven; as such, the project will only require 2.25 additional FTEs.

Please note the Infusion Nurse FTEs represented in the table included with Question 8Q account for per diem nursing positions and are adjusted for full FTEs. Each Infusion Nurse in Naven's existing nurse network accounts for 0.25 FTEs. Generally, given Naven's extensive staffing network, it has the ability to flex existing employed and contracted nurses to provide home infusion services and meet the needs of the projected patient population. Naven will also be able to hire additional nursing staff as necessary and anticipates needing approximately 2.25 FTEs for administrative nursing positions. Please note that Naven currently contracts with more than 50 infusion nurses on a part-time basis; this structure gives Naven the flexibility to increase staffing capacity in correlation with utilization volume, without needing to recruit and hire a large number of new employees. Finally, Naven will be able to transition to operating as a licensed HHA quickly and

efficiently, with minimal ramp-up to care.

Naven, as well as its parent, Option Care, have robust existing policies related to the recruitment, training, assessment, and professional development of its employees. The proposed project will operate under these same policies. Please see Attachment 4C for the relevant policies, including policies related to staffing and employment.

- 7. Community Linkage Plan:** The applicant should provide a community linkage plan that demonstrates factors such as, but not limited to, referral arrangements with appropriate health care system providers/services (that comply with CMS patient choice protections) and working agreements with other related community services assuring continuity of care focusing on coordinated, integrated systems. A new provider may submit a proposed community linkage plan.

Response: As an existing nursing staffing agency in Tennessee, Naven has existing relationships with multiple specialty pharmacies across Tennessee. These relationships will continue following development of the proposed HHA. Please see Attachment 1N-4. Based on Naven's historical operations, it anticipates that the majority of its referrals will come through its extensive network of specialty pharmacy partners, which also work closely with a wide range of Tennessee healthcare providers.

- 8. TennCare Managed Care Organizations (MCOs) and Financial Viability:** Given the time frame required to obtain Medicare certification, an applicant proposing to contract with the Bureau of TennCare's MCOs should provide evidence of financial viability during the time period necessary to receive such certification. Applicants should be aware that MCOs are under no obligation to contract with home care organizations, even if Medicare certification is obtained, and that Private Duty Services are not Medicare certifiable services. Applicants who believe there is a need to serve TennCare patients should contact the TennCare MCOs in the region of the proposed Service Area and inquire whether their panels are open for home health services, as advised in the notice posted on the HSDA website, to determine whether at any given point there is a need for a provider in a particular area of the state; letters from the TennCare MCOs should be provided to document such need. See Note 2 for additional information.

Applicants should also provide information on projected revenue sources, including non-TennCare revenue sources.

Response: Not applicable. Due to Naven's current business model, which is expected to stay the same for the proposed project, Naven does not intend to establish relationships with payors, including with MCOs, as part of the proposed project. Currently, Naven does not directly bill payors for its services. Rather, Naven charges its partnering specialty pharmacies a fee for its services and the

specialty pharmacies bill the appropriate payor, which may include Medicare, Medicaid/TennCare, or Commercial payors, among other payors. Notably, as in other past home infusion projects the HFC has approved, the specialty pharmacies are billing payors for the drug and/or the cost of administering the drug rather than for home health services. Naven intends to maintain this arrangement and billing structure following the development of the proposed project. Further, as noted in the response to #7 above, the majority of patients Naven will serve through its HHA will be patients who are referred to Naven from its specialty pharmacy partners. Therefore, the fees charged to these specialty pharmacies are expected to be Naven's primary source of revenue for the proposed project.

9. **Proposed Charges:** The applicant's proposed charges should be reasonable in comparison with those of other similar agencies in the Service Area or in adjoining service areas. The applicant should list:

- a. The average charge per visit and/or episode of care by service category, if available in the JAR data.

Response: Please see Attachment 8C, which lists the charges per visit for HHAs in Tennessee that provide home infusion therapy services as listed in the 2025 JAR. Please note that the JAR for Home Health Agencies does not provide average charges specific to the various types of therapies Naven anticipates providing.

- b. The average charge per patient based upon the projected number of visits and/or episodes of care and/or hours per patient, if available in the JAR data.

Response: Please see the previously referenced Attachment 5N, which contains the visits and hours for the 13 HHAs that reported home infusion therapy services in the 2025 JAR for Home Health Agencies.

10. **Access:** In concert with the factors set forth in HSDA Rule 0720-11-.01(1) (which lists those factors concerning need on which an application may be evaluated), the HSDA may choose to give special consideration to an applicant that is able to show that there is limited access in the proposed Service Area for groups with special medical needs such as, but not limited to, medically fragile children, newborns and their mothers, and HIV/AIDS patients. Pediatrics is a special medical needs population, and therefore any provider applying to provide these services should demonstrate documentation of adequately trained staff specific to this population's needs with a plan to provide ongoing best practice education. For purposes of this Standard, an applicant should document need using population, service, special needs, and/or disease incidence rates. If granted, the Certificate of Need should be restricted on condition, and thus in its licensure, to serving the special group or groups identified in the application. The restricting language should be as follows: **CONDITION:** Home health agency services are limited to (*identified specialty service group*); the expansion of service beyond (*identified specialty service group*) will require the filing of a new Certificate of Need application. Please see Note 3 regarding federal law prohibitions on discrimination in the provision of health care services.

Response: For the reasons outlined in response to #4 above, as well as the reasons discussed in detail in the response to Question 4N, the proposed project will promote access to care for various patient populations with special needs. First, the proposed project's service area, which consists of all 95 counties in the State of Tennessee, is highly rural. Rural patient populations have more difficulty accessing healthcare services and higher healthcare needs, and these populations are also more likely to suffer from chronic diseases and worse health outcomes. Because the proposed service area is rural, many patients are located farther away from necessary resources and face multiple barriers to accessing medical care, including longer travel distances to healthcare providers, higher uninsured rates, and lower health literacy.

Second, patients receiving specialty infusion services – a highly specialized form of primarily intravenous medication administration used to treat and manage more serious medical conditions, such as chronic diseases, autoimmune diseases, and neurological disorders – are often sicker or medically frail. While some patients can tolerate the significant travel requirements involved with receiving infusion services at outpatient ambulatory infusion centers, this is not a viable long-term option for chronically ill patients requiring ongoing nursing care that can be safely delivered in their homes, particularly those who are immunocompromised. These enhanced medical needs limit infusion patients' ability to travel and increase the time sensitivity of receiving healthcare services. Additionally, specialty infusion medications often cost more than traditional pharmaceuticals and require special handling, comprehensive planning, and extensive clinical staff and patient training.

By developing an HHA to serve Tennessee patients, Naven will address the critical gap in home infusion care that patients of many specialty pharmacies

experience. With an additional provider of home infusion services, specialty pharmacy patients – the majority of whom are chronically ill and live in rural communities – have increased access to care.

- 11. Quality Control and Monitoring:** The applicant should identify and document its existing or proposed plan for data reporting (including data on patient re-admission to hospitals), quality improvement, and an outcome and process monitoring system (including continuum of care and transitions of care from acute care facilities). If applicable, the applicant should provide documentation that it is, or that it intends to be, fully accredited by the Joint Commission, the Community Health Accreditation Program, Inc., the Accreditation Commission for Health Care, and/or other accrediting body with deeming authority for home health services from CMS.

Response: Because Naven is an existing provider of home infusion services to many specialty pharmacy partners, Naven is already accredited by The Joint Commission (“TJC”) for “home care,” which includes the provision of home infusion services.⁸ This same accreditation will apply to the proposed HHA. Naven is also certified as a Health Care Staffing agency through TJC, demonstrating the breadth and quality of its staffing services.

As discussed in response to #6 above, Naven and its parent Option Care have comprehensive policies focused on monitoring care quality and ensuring that patients receive quality care. Please see the previously referenced Attachment 4C for Naven’s quality-related policies.

- 12. Data Requirements:** Applicants should agree to provide the Department of Health and/or the Health Services and Development Agency with all reasonably requested information and statistical data related to the operation and provision of services and to report that data in the time and format requested. As a standard of practice, existing data reporting streams will be relied upon and adapted over time to collect all needed information.

Response: Naven agrees to provide the Department of Health and/or the Commission such information and data as reasonably requested.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1E. Overview

RESPONSE:

Naven Health, Inc. (“Naven”) proposes to establish a home health agency (“HHA”) limited to providing home infusion services. Naven is a nationwide skilled nursing staffing agency operating in all 50 states and specializing in infusion care for patients with chronic conditions. Naven provides a wide range of infusion services, including Alpha 1 Therapy, Antibiotics, Hemophilia Therapy, Steroids, Enzyme Replacement, Immunotherapies, Biologics, Inotropes, HIV Therapy, and First-Dosing; Naven will not provide chemotherapy infusions through the proposed HHA. Naven’s existing footprint in Tennessee includes partnerships with over 30 existing specialty pharmacies and a network of more than 70 nurses. Additionally, Naven currently operates 15 licensed HHAs nationwide, as well as two HHAs with pending accreditation. The proposed project builds upon Naven’s existing infusion experience, enabling Naven to provide broadly accessible, home-based infusion care for all patients across Tennessee.

- Ownership structure

RESPONSE: Naven, which will own and operate the proposed HHA, is 100 percent owned by SPNN Holdings, LLC. SPNN Holdings, LLC is 100 percent owned by Option Care Enterprises, Inc. Naven’s complete ownership structure is detailed in Attachment 7A-2.

- Service Area

RESPONSE: The proposed project’s service area is all 95 counties in Tennessee, including CON-exempt Grundy County and Lake County.

- Existing similar service providers

RESPONSE: According to the 2025 Tennessee Joint Annual Report (“JAR”) for Home Health Agencies, there are 175 existing HHAs that are licensed to provide home health services in Tennessee. Only 13 (approximately seven percent) of these existing agencies provide home infusion therapy services. Additionally, many of the HHAs that provide home infusion services can only serve patients of their own specialty pharmacies. Please see the response to Question 5N for additional discussion of existing home health providers in Tennessee. Please see Attachment 5N for a detailed list of HHAs that operate in Tennessee, including those listed as providing home infusion therapy.

- Project Cost

RESPONSE: Project costs are approximately \$142,733. Of note, \$38,633 of these costs represent the estimated Fair Market Value (“FMV”) for the property that Naven will lease for the proposed project, which is a property that Naven is already leasing. - Staffing

RESPONSE: The proposed HHA will require 29.00 FTEs in its first project year, including 21.00 FTEs of direct care positions and 8.00 FTEs of non-patient care positions. Please see the responses to Question 8Q and #6 in Attachment 1N for additional staffing information.

- Need

RESPONSE: The need for the proposed project is driven by multiple factors. First, given the complexity of home infusion care, including the time- and resource-intensive nature of infusion treatments, many existing HHAs in Tennessee, particularly traditional HHAs, do not have the expertise or staffing capacity to provide infusion care. In fact, only 13 of the 175 (seven percent) Tennessee HHAs included in the 2025 JAR for Home Health Agencies provided home infusion therapy services. Second, Naven currently partners with many specialty pharmacies in Tennessee that do not hold home health licenses and, therefore, cannot provide infusion care to patients in the home setting. The proposed project allows patients of these pharmacies to access essential home infusion care in the comfort of their own homes. Third, given Tennessee’s significant rural patient population, many patients in the proposed service area struggle to access care, particularly if those patients are chronically ill, medically frail, or have difficulty travelling on their own. Although Naven is already serving many rural patients through its existing arrangements with specialty pharmacies with an HHA license, the project will allow Naven to meet the growing need for accessible care among Tennessee’s rural patient population. Finally, the proposed project facilitates more cost-effective care for medically frail patients by limiting potential hospital stays, meeting a need for affordable care among vulnerable patient populations. See #4 in Attachment 1N for a detailed discussion of the need for the proposed project.

- Quality Standards

RESPONSE: Naven is an established provider of high-quality healthcare services, both nationwide and in Tennessee. It is currently accredited by The Joint Commission (“TJC”) for “home care,” which includes the provision of home infusion services. This existing TJC accreditation will also apply to the proposed project. Naven is also certified as a Health Care Staffing agency through TJC. Naven already operates under robust policies designed to ensure the provision of high-quality care. These policies are included in Attachment 4C.

- Consumer Advantage

- Choice

RESPONSE: The proposed project enhances patient choice by establishing another provider of home infusion services in Tennessee that can serve patients in the comfort of their own homes, regardless of their specialty pharmacy. Few existing HHAs in Tennessee provide home infusion services; of these, even fewer operate across the entire state and are otherwise limited in the patients they can serve. Naven’s existing infusion staffing infrastructure in Tennessee will allow it to easily expand its delivery of home infusion services to additional patients who need such specialized care.

- Improved access/availability to health care service(s)

RESPONSE: The proposed project will also greatly increase access to home infusion services. First, the project improves access to home infusion services for the existing patients of Naven’s specialty pharmacy partners, enabling these patients to be treated in their homes, rather than an outpatient infusion setting. In particular, the project creates much needed access to home infusion services for rural patient populations in the proposed service area. As noted above, Tennessee is a highly rural state. Rural patient populations have more difficulty accessing healthcare services and higher overall healthcare needs, including a greater prevalence of chronic diseases and generally worse health outcomes. Enabling these patients to receive infusion therapy in their homes will reduce

barriers to accessing medical care, including longer travel distances to healthcare providers, higher uninsured rates, and lower health literacy.

○ Affordability

RESPONSE: The proposed project reduces the cost of care for patients and payors alike by allowing patients to receive timely care that improves management of their chronic health conditions and to avoid higher cost acute care settings. In addition, the project promotes cost-effective care by limiting travel time and transportation costs for patients that require infusion services. Instead of travelling to a hospital or outpatient setting to receive their infusion medications, patients can receive care at home, eliminating unnecessary travel costs for patients and their caregivers.

The proposed service area, which includes all 95 Tennessee counties, is reasonable. As discussed in the Standards and Criteria included as [Attachment 1N](#), Naven is an existing nursing staffing agency that operates in Tennessee and nationwide. Through partnerships with existing Tennessee specialty pharmacies with HHA licenses, Naven provided specialty infusion care to over 300 Tennessee patients across 70 Tennessee counties in 2025. Naven also currently has a network of over 70 nurses to deliver this care. Naven will leverage this strong existing presence in Tennessee to expand the home infusion services it provides statewide.

Further, Naven already cares for patients in rural Tennessee counties. Indeed, some 75 percent of the counties it served in 2025 are considered rural. Given Naven’s extensive staffing network and familiarity with the Tennessee and rural patient populations, Naven is well-equipped to deliver infusion care to patients statewide. A statewide proposed service area is critical to Naven’s mission to ensure all patients, including those in rural areas, have access to essential home-based infusion services. Indeed, there are not only few existing home infusion providers in Tennessee, but even fewer have the ability to serve all patients across the state.

Please note that the figures below include Grundy and Lake counties, which are CON-exempt. As stated above, the service area for the proposed project is all 95 counties in Tennessee. While not reflected in the table below, Naven

projects it will serve patients from all 95 Tennessee counties by 2028, its second full project year, driven in part by its existing experience operating in Tennessee and its expansive network of staff. Please see [Attachment 6N](#) for additional discussion.

Given its experience providing specialty infusion services, Naven knows that a wide range of patients, including both pediatric and geriatric (i.e., patients age 65 and over) patients, require infusion services. As such, Naven has assumed that its target patient population is the entire population of the proposed service area – i.e., all patients across Tennessee’s 95 counties.

As discussed in the Standards and Criteria included as Attachment 1N, 78 of the 95 counties in Tennessee classified as rural according to U.S. Census data. Therefore, Naven anticipates that the majority of its patients will reside in rural areas.

RESPONSE:

As discussed in the Standards and Criteria included as Attachment 1N, several demographic factors support Tennessee patients' need for broader access to home-based specialty infusion services. Further, Naven's existing operations and staffing network demonstrate Naven is already well-equipped to understand and meet the special needs of the proposed service area.

First, the project's 95-county proposed service area is highly rural; based on the latest available U.S. Census data and as noted in the response to #4 in the Standards and Criteria included as Attachment 1N, 78 of the 95 counties in Tennessee are rural (82 percent). Rural patient populations have more difficulty accessing healthcare services and an overall greater need for healthcare services, and these populations are also more likely to suffer from chronic disease and worse health outcomes. Because these counties are rural and located farther away from necessary resources, their residents also often face multiple barriers to accessing medical care, including longer travel distances to healthcare providers, higher uninsured rates, and lower health literacy.

Second, patients receiving specialty infusion services – a highly specialized form of primarily intravenous medication administration used to treat and manage numerous medical conditions, such as chronic diseases, autoimmune diseases, and neurological disorders – are often sicker or medically frail. While some patients can tolerate the significant travel requirements involved with receiving infusion services at outpatient ambulatory infusion centers, this is not a viable long-term option for chronically ill patients requiring ongoing nursing care that can be safely delivered in their homes, particularly for those who are immunocompromised.

Given the specialized medical needs of service area patients, the burdens associated with having to travel to an ambulatory infusion center or, worse, to an inpatient hospital setting for necessary infusion medications are significant. Infusion sessions are often lengthy, requiring patients to arrange transportation to and from a facility, secure childcare or eldercare coverage during their absence, and navigate the physical and emotional demands of extended time spent in a clinical setting – all while managing the symptoms of a serious underlying illness. Further, most traditional HHAs do not have the staff or clinical expertise to deliver such complex and time-consuming care. For patients in rural counties, these challenges are compounded by longer driving distances, limited public transportation, and higher financial costs associated with frequent out-of-pocket travel expenses. In addition, for immunocompromised and medically vulnerable patients, receiving infusions in non-home settings, such as ambulatory infusion centers, increases infection risk. Naven's project will offer high-quality infusion services in patients' homes, reducing service area patients' barriers to accessing care and thereby prioritizing the special needs of the service area population.

Multiple CON applications to develop HHAs limited to the provision of home infusion services have recently been approved but have not yet initiated services. First, in May 2025, Amerita, Inc. was approved to develop a home care organization limited to home infusion services with a service area of 80 counties (CN2503-008A). Next, in February 2026, River City Infusion, LLC was approved to develop an HHA limited to infusion services with a service area of all 95 Tennessee counties (CN2511-042). Most recently, in April 2026, OPTIV Infusion, LLC was approved to develop a home care organization and initiate home infusion and related nursing services for a 29-county service area (CN2602-006A).

The approval of these projects does not alter the need for Naven's project. Tennessee patients continue to lack sufficient access to home infusion services. As shown in Attachment 5N, of the 175 Tennessee HHAs listed in the 2025 JAR for

Home Health Agencies, only 13, or seven percent, provided home infusion therapy services in 2025; the initiation of three additional providers of home infusion services will increase this total to 16, which is still only nine percent of all HHAs in Tennessee ($16 \div 178 = 0.89 =$ nine percent). Additionally, these three HHAs were approved with the condition that they would provide home infusion services exclusively to patients of their own specialty pharmacies.[1] Therefore, these approved providers will not provide home infusion care to *any* patient who may require such care. In contrast, Naven’s proposed HHA will have the ability to provide home infusion care to appropriate patients of any specialty pharmacy in Tennessee that contracts with Naven.

[1] As noted in these agencies’ respective Letters of Intent, Amerita, Inc. stated that it would “initiat[e] home health services limited to home infusion and related nursing services for patients of pharmacies owned by Amerita, Inc.,” River City Infusion, LLC stated that it would “initiat[e] home health services limited to home infusion and related nursing services for pharmacy patients of RCIV, LLC;” and OPTIV Infusion, LLC stated that it would “initiat[e] home health services limited to home infusion and related nursing services for pharmacy patients of OPTIVRX, LLC.”

RESPONSE: As discussed in the Standards and Criteria included as Attachment 1N, Naven will not establish direct relationships with payors as part of the development of the proposed project. Currently, Naven does not directly bill payors for its services. Rather, Naven charges its partnering specialty pharmacies a fee for its services; these specialty pharmacies bill the appropriate payor, which may include Medicare, Medicaid/TennCare, or Commercial payors, among other payors. Naven intends to maintain this arrangement and billing structure following the development of the proposed project. The fees charged to these specialty pharmacies will be Naven’s sole source of revenue for the proposed HHA.

- 3C. Describe the effects of competition and/or duplication of the proposal on the health care system, including the impact upon consumer charges and consumer choice of services.

RESPONSE:

The proposed project will benefit service area patients and will not negatively impact existing providers of HHA services. As discussed throughout the application, there are few HHAs in Tennessee that currently offer specialty infusion services. Thus, significant gaps in care remain, particularly for rural patients who face greater challenges in accessing timely care. As an established provider in Tennessee with experience serving patients in rural counties, Naven will fill these critical gaps in home infusion services, acting as a provider of accessible care for patients who need it.

Further, Naven is already partnering with many existing specialty pharmacies in Tennessee with home health licenses to provide staffing support for their infusion services. As attested in the letters of support included in Attachment 1N-4, the patients of these existing specialty pharmacies can be conveniently and effectively served by Naven. Given these attestations and Naven’s existing presence and history of providing care in Tennessee, home infusion services in Tennessee will not be duplicated through the development of the proposed project.

The proposed project also creates a new choice of provider for specialty infusion patients in Tennessee, one capable of delivering home-based care. As discussed in the Standards and Criteria included as Attachment 1N, the medications dispensed through specialty infusion therapy are largely for chronically ill patients. Patients who cannot receive these medications at home must travel to – at best – an outpatient setting, imposing substantial time and transportation costs on both patients and their caregivers. In a worst-case scenario, patients who do not receive timely infusions may require admission to an acute care facility on an inpatient basis, a far more costly care setting that can cause undue stress for patients and their families. The approval of an additional home infusion provider, particularly one already experienced with home-based treatment, will minimize these burdens and create a cost-effective alternative that promotes competition in the state.

RESPONSE:

As discussed in response to #4 of the Standards and Criteria included as Attachment 1N, Naven is an existing nationwide skilled nursing staffing agency. As such, it has a robust network of staff that will be leveraged to provide home infusion care for the proposed HHA. In fact, Naven has historically provided care in Tennessee through a network of over 70 nurses. This network is supported by robust existing policies related to the recruitment, training, assessment and professional development of Naven’s employees. The proposed project will operate under these existing policies. Please see Attachment 4C for the relevant Naven and Option Care policies.

RESPONSE:

Upon approval of the proposed project, Naven will seek licensure from the Tennessee Health Facilities Commission as a home care organization providing home health services in Tennessee. As noted above, Naven intends to limit its CON and license to the provision of home infusion services.

As discussed in response to #1 of the Standards and Criteria included as [Attachment 1N](#), because Naven is an existing provider of home infusion services to certain specialty pharmacy partners, Naven is already accredited by The Joint Commission (“TJC”) for “home care,” which includes the provision of home infusion services. This same accreditation will apply to the proposed HHA. Naven is also certified as a Health Care Staffing agency through TJC, demonstrating the breadth and quality of its staffing services.

As discussed in response to #6 of the Standards and Criteria included as [Attachment 1N](#), Naven and its parent, Option Care, have comprehensive policies focused on monitoring care quality and ensuring that patients receive quality care. As discussed in the Standards and Criteria in [Attachment 1N](#), Naven currently charges its partnering specialty pharmacies a fee for its services; in 2025, this fee, on average, was \$827. Because Naven does not anticipate the proposed project will change its fee arrangement for services, Naven has maintained this average charge for its first two full project years.

As evidenced in [Attachment 8C](#), publicly available infusion therapy charge per visit data is very limited, and, for the reasons noted, may not offer useful charge comparisons. Only seven licensed HHAs provided charge per visit data in the 2025 JAR for Home Health Agencies; two of the seven are separately licensed agencies affiliated with Coram CVS Specialty Infusion Services. Additionally, two of the providers for which infusion therapy charge per visit data are available – Meritan INC and Methodist Alliance Home Care – did not report any infusion volume in the 2025 JAR. Finally, it is unclear from JAR data whether the infusion therapy visits reported are for the services that Naven proposes to provide. As such, based on available data, Naven cannot fully compare its proposed charges to those of HHAs in the service area.

Still, based on Naven’s infusion experience, as well as recently approved home infusion CON projects, the proposed charges are reasonable. The fees Naven charges specialty pharmacies for infusion services, while not directly incurred by the patient, are comparable to similarly situated home health infusion providers. For example, the average net charge for OPTIV Infusion, LLC, which received a CON to establish an HHA limited to home infusion therapy in April 2026 (CN2602-006A), was \$970. The approval of OPTIV Infusion, LLC’s CON application confirms the reasonableness of this average charge, as well as the reasonableness of the average net charge Naven proposes in the table above.

schools, it came down to UVA Wise for softball or Emory & Henry for basketball," she said. "It is probably the hardest decision I have ever had to make."



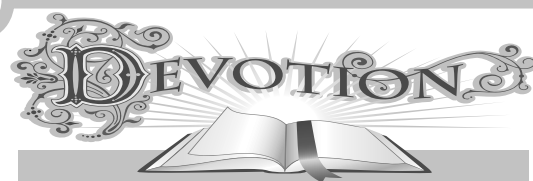

SUMMARY: The Rural Utility Service (RUS) has made a Finding of No Significant Impact (FONSI) with respect to a request for possible financing assistance to Northeast Lawrence Utility District for the construction of the Norton Road Water Treatment Plant and Well Project in Lawrence County, TN.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: The proposed project consists of the construction of a water treatment plant (WTP) facility with a clear well, a finished water line, and a pump enclosure and for the addition of well pumps and associated appurtenances to bring the existing groundwater well into production. Alternatives considered by RUS and Northeast Lawrence Utility District include: No action; Action Alternative 1: site development and construction of a clear well with high service pumps at the water treatment plant on Miller Lane, site development and construction of a pump station at the Norton Road well site, and the construction of an approximately 5,000 linear foot raw water line to convey raw water from the Norton Road well to the Miller Lane water treatment plant. The alternatives are discussed in the Norton Road Water Treatment Plant and Well EA. RUS has reviewed and approved the EA for the proposed project.

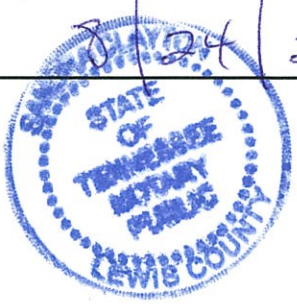



EASTER HAM

Easter ham is a custom that dates to pre-Christian times. It remains a traditional dish during the holiday. In modern times, honey-baked hams are particularly popular.

PASKA

It is a simple cake baked by Christians on Easter as a sign of faith.

EASTER BREADS

For Christians, the resurrected Christ is called. "The bread of life." The sweet bread is marked with a cross to help the

bread rise and as a visible sign that the bread is "blessed."

EASTER CANDY

Chocolate eggs symbolize new life and Jesus' resurrection. This

Easter named after Eostre

The name of the Easter celebration seems to go back to the pre-Christian goddess EOSTRE in England, who was celebrated at the beginning of spring.

Eostre, a German spring goddess, is believed to be the namesake of the Easter festival in some languages. The Anglo-Saxons worshipped her in April as Eostru.

The Christian holiday of Easter is believed to have taken its name from the Anglo-Saxon goddess Eostre, as mentioned by the 8th-century English monk Bede in his work "De temporum ratione," translated as "The Reckoning of Time." There is limited historical information about Eostre. Much of what is known comes from Bede's writings, which suggests that feasts were celebrated in her honor during the month corresponding to April.

Eostre is often associated with springtime symbols, such as eggs. These animals, bursting with meaning, have become cherished parts of our modern Easter festivities.

In some forms of modern Germanic paganism, Eostre (or

Ostara is venerated and celebrated during the spring equinox. Ostara is also known as Eostre or Eastre. Her name is etymologically linked to words related to dawn.

The very sound of her name calls to mind the first light of dawn and the promise of a new day.

A MORE DETAILED EXPLANATION OF THE HOLIDAY INCLUDES

- The holiday is associated with spring, dawn, fertility, and rebirth.
 - Eostre is often depicted with hares and eggs, which represent fertility and new life.
 - The knowledge of Eostre is primarily based on the writings of the Venerable Bede, an 8th-century monk, who mentions the Anglo-Saxon tradition of "celebrating in Eostre's honor during the month of April."
 - The Christian Paschal month, celebrating the resurrection of Jesus, replaced the feasts of Eostre, and the name Easter became associated with the Christian holiday.
 - In modern Pagan and Wiccan traditions, Eostre is seen as a manifestation of spring, often associated with the spring equinox.
- In conclusion, most evidence suggests that Easter is named after Eostre.

LEASE AGREEMENT

THIS LEASE AGREEMENT, entered into this 14th day of April, 2025, by and between K&N Office Limited Partnership hereinafter called "Landlord" and Naven Health, Inc., a Delaware Corporation, hereinafter called "Tenant".

WITNESSETH:

1. LEASED PREMISES. In consideration of the obligation of Tenant to pay the rent and other charges as provided in this Lease and in consideration of the other covenants, obligations and agreements hereinafter reserved and contained on the part of the Tenant to be observed and performed, Landlord demises and leases to the Tenant and Tenant rents from Landlord those certain premises in Knoxville, Knox County, Tennessee, as follows: Office/Room #6 located within Suite 250 at Executive Plaza, 9041 Executive Park Drive, Knoxville, TN ("demised premises").

2. TERM. The terms of this lease shall be for a period of One (1) year, commencing on the 1st day of May, 2025, and ending on the 30th day of April, 2026.

3. RENTAL. As rental for the demised premises, Tenant hereby agrees to pay to Landlord without deduction, set-off, or prior notice or demand, base rent. Base rent is payable in advance in monthly installments of \$550.00 and continuing due and payable on the first day of each and every month for the entire term of the lease at the Landlord's management office located at 9041 Executive Park Drive, Suite 250, Knoxville, TN 37923, or such other place as Landlord may direct in writing. Rental for a portion of a month, if any, (at the beginning and end of the term hereof) shall be prorated. Other remedies for non-payment of rent under Paragraph 15 or elsewhere herein notwithstanding. If the monthly base rent and additional services payment are not received before the fifth (5th) day of the month for which said rent is due, a late charge of TEN PERCENT (10%) of the base rent owed shall become due and payable in addition to the regular base rent owed under this Lease.

4. USE OF PREMISES. The demised premises shall be used for general office purposes and no other business or other purposes without written consent of Landlord. The demised premises shall not be used for any illegal purposes, nor in violation of any valid regulation of any governmental body, nor in any manner to create any nuisance or trespass or tending to disturb any other tenant, nor in any manner to vitiate the insurance or increase the rate of insurance on premises or the building. Tenant will not use or permit upon said demised premises anything that may be dangerous to life or limb. Tenant will not in any manner deface or injure said building or any part thereof, or overload the floors of said building. Tenant and its employees shall have access to the demised premises 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year.

5. BUILDING OPERATING HOURS. Building Hours are Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., and Normal Business hours are Monday through Friday, 8:30 a.m. to 5.00 p.m., except for Legal Holidays.

6. SERVICES OF LANDLORD. Landlord agrees to furnish Tenant with the following services: (1) water service for use in the lavatories on the floor on which the Premises are located; (2) heat and air conditioning in the Premises; (3) janitorial service on business days; and (4) elevator service 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. During all hours outside Building Hours, Landlord shall furnish the services required hereunder except for heat and air conditioning. If requested by Tenant, the Landlord shall furnish heat and air conditioning at times other than Building Hours and the cost of such services as established by Landlord shall be paid by Tenant as additional payment, payable as provided in Section 3. No janitorial service shall be provided on legal holidays.

7. CONDITION OF PREMISES. Tenant accepts the demised premises in such condition and repair as they are in at the commencement of the term of the lease, which acceptance shall be conclusive evidence of the good and satisfactory condition of the premises at such time, and shall on its termination surrender them in the same condition and repair, ordinary wear and tear excepted.

8. HEAT PRODUCING EQUIPMENT. Tenant shall not install any equipment or lights in the Leased Premises which will utilize electrical service or generate an amount of heat in excess that is typically found in a normal business office or in excess of five (5) watts per square foot. In the event Tenant utilizes electrical current in excess of five (5) watts per square foot or installs equipment which generates heat in excess of the amount typically found as aforesaid, then the Landlord shall have the right to charge Tenant as an additional charge a reasonable sum as reimbursement for the direct costs of such additional use or service necessary by reason of Tenants use. In the event of a disagreement as to the reasonableness of that amount of such additional charge, the opinion of a qualified local independent professional engineer selected by Landlord shall be binding upon Landlord and Tenant.

9. ALTERATIONS AND IMPROVEMENTS. No alterations, additions, or improvements to the leased premises, except such as may be provided for in this lease, shall be made without first having the consent, in writing, of the Landlord (which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld), and any improvements, additions or alterations made by the Tenant after such consent shall have been given, including any and all fixtures installed, excepting trade fixtures, shall be removed, unless otherwise agreed in writing remain on the premises as the property of the Landlord, without compensation to Tenant, or shall be removed therefrom and the premises restored to their original condition at cost to Tenant, at the expiration or sooner termination of this lease. The Tenant shall, at its cost, repair any damage caused by the removal of trade fixtures restoring the premises to their original condition. The Tenant agrees to save Landlord harmless on account of claims for mechanics, materialmen or other liens in connection with any alterations, additions or improvements to which Landlord may give its consent with the leased premises and Tenant will, if required by Landlord, furnish such waiver or waivers or lien or bond in form and with surety satisfactory to Landlord, as Landlord may require before starting any work in connection with alterations, additions or improvements to the leased premises.

10. REPAIRS. Landlord shall maintain the demised premises in good order and repair, except that Tenant shall repair damages caused by its negligence. Tenant shall at once report in writing to Landlord any defective condition in the demised premises known to him which Landlord is required to repair.

11. SERVICES & RULES AND REGULATIONS. Tenant and Tenant's servants and agents shall at all times observe, perform and abide by the Rules and Regulations attached hereto as Exhibit "B" and Exhibit "C", any additional Exhibits are to be made a part of this lease, together with such other services and further reasonable rules and regulations as Landlord may from time to time adopt.

12. PERSONAL AND PROPERTY RISKS. Landlord shall not be held responsible for and is hereby expressly relieved from all liability by reason of any injury, loss or damage to any person or property on the leased premises except for such injury, loss or damage resulting from the acts or omissions of Landlord. If any such injury, loss or damage shall be caused by the acts of negligence of the Tenant, the Landlord may, at its option, repair such damage, whether caused to the building or the tenants thereof, and the Tenant shall thereupon reimburse the Landlord the total cost of such damage both to the building and to the tenants thereof. The Tenant further agrees that all of Tenant's personal property upon the demised premises shall be at the risk of the Tenant only and that the Landlord shall not be liable for any damage thereto or theft thereof. Nor shall the Landlord be liable for the stoppage or interruption of water, light, heat, air conditioning, telephone service, janitor or elevator service, caused by riot, strike, accident or to make needful repairs, or by any cause over which the Landlord has no control. Tenant shall indemnify Landlord and save it harmless from any and all claims, actions, damages, liabilities and expenses in connection with personal injuries or damage to property occurring in the demised premises to the extent caused in whole or in part by any act or omission of Tenant, its agents, contractors, employees, customers, licensees, or guests. Tenant hereby grants Landlord and Landlord's agent's authority to sign for receipt of overnight courier letters and/or packages addressed to Tenant and agrees to indemnify and hold harmless Landlord and its agents against any claim arising from such actions taken by Landlord or its agents on Tenant's behalf.

13. DAMAGE BY FIRE OR OTHER CASUALTY. If the demised premises or other portions of the building essential to or affording access to them should during the term of this lease be damaged by fire or other casualty so as to render the demised premises wholly or partially unsuitable for occupancy, Landlord shall repair and restore the same as promptly

as is reasonably possible, strikes, walkouts, and force majeure excepted, provided, however, that if Landlord shall determine that the demised premises or other such portions of the building cannot be repaired within sixty (60) days from the date of such damage, it shall so notify Tenant in writing and either Landlord or Tenant may then or within fifteen days thereafter terminate the lease by notifying the other party in writing of its election so to do. There shall be a prorata abatement of rental for any portion of the premises that is not usable during the period of repair following damage by fire or other casualty, and no rental shall be charged to Tenant during any period that the demised premises are totally unfit for occupancy or during which there is no access to the demised premises by reason of such damage.

14. TRANSFER OF TENANT. Landlord reserves the right, at its option and upon giving sixty (60) day written notice in advance to Tenant, to transfer and remove Tenant from the premises to any other available rooms and offices of substantially equal size and area of which the premises are a part. Landlord shall bear the expense of said removal, as well as, the expense of any renovations or alterations necessary to make the new space substantially conform in layout and appointment with the original premises.

15. RIGHTS AND REMEDIES ARE CUMULATIVE. Rights and remedies herein given to and reserved by the Landlord are separate and cumulative rights and remedies and no one of them, whether or not exercised by the Landlord, shall be deemed to be in exclusion of any of the others, or in the exclusion of any rights or remedies in law or equity under the law of the state in which the property herein demised is located.

16. DEFAULT BY TENANT. In the event of a breach (as hereinafter defined) by the Tenant of any of the terms or conditions of this lease, Landlord shall have the right, at its option, to either annul and terminate this lease upon written notice sent by registered mail to the Tenant, and thereupon to re-enter and take possession of the demised premises, or shall have the right, upon such notice, to re-enter and relet the demised premises or parcels thereof from time to time as agents of the Tenant, and such re-entry and/or reletting shall not discharge Tenant from any liability or obligations hereunder, except that net rents collected as a result of such reletting shall be acquitted on the Tenant's liability for rents payable and other sums due under the terms of this lease. Nothing herein, however, shall be construed to require the Landlord to re-enter and relet in such event, nor shall anything herein be construed to waive or postpone the right of the Landlord to sue for rents due, but on the contrary, the Landlord is hereby given the right to sue for all rents due and payable at any time after default. The occurrence of any one of the following events shall be considered a breach of this lease: (a) In the event the Tenant should fail to pay one or more of said installments of rents as and when the same shall become due and payable and such default shall continue for as much as thirty (30) days, or for as much as five days after written notice thereof by registered mail; (b) In the event an execution or other legal process is levied upon the property of the Tenant located on the demised premises or upon the interest of the Tenant in this lease unless such execution or other levy be discharged of record within thirty (30) days; In the event a voluntary petition in bankruptcy is filed by the Tenant or the Tenant is adjudged bankrupt or in the event the Tenant makes an assignment for the benefit of creditors, or in the event of the appointment of a receiver, whether bankruptcy or otherwise, of the Tenant's property, provided such appointment be not vacated or set aside within thirty (30) days or in the event any plan of reorganization of the Tenant which is not satisfactory to or approved by the Landlord shall be approved by any court or any judge thereof, and such approval be not set aside within thirty (30) days; or (c) In the event the Tenant violates any of the other terms, conditions, covenants, stipulations or agreements on the part of the Tenant, herein contained, and fails to remedy the same within thirty (30) days after written notice thereof by registered mail by the Landlord to the Tenant. After an authorized assignment or subletting, the occurring of any of the foregoing breaches shall affect this lease only if caused by or happening to the assignee or sublease.

17. STORAGE. If Tenant shall fail to remove all effects from said premises upon termination of this lease for any cause whatsoever, or when Landlord shall re-enter and relet the premises for account of Tenant, Landlord may at its option remove the same in any manner that the Landlord shall choose and store said effects without liability to Landlord for loss thereof, and Tenant agrees to pay Landlord on demand any and all expenses incurred in such removal, including court costs and attorney's fees and storage charge on such effects for any length of time the same shall be in Landlord's possession, or Landlord may at its option without notice sell said effects or any part of the same at private sale and without

legal process for such price as Landlord may obtain and apply the proceeds of such sale upon any amounts due under this lease from Tenant to Landlord and upon the expense incident to removal and sale of said effects.

18. NON-WAIVER. The failure of the Landlord to insist in any one or more instance upon a strict performance of any of the covenants and conditions contained in this lease or to exercise any option herein contained shall not be construed as a waiver for the future of any such covenant or condition or option, but the same shall continue and remain in full force and effect. The receipt by the Landlord of rent in whole or in part, or any other payment due hereunder, with knowledge of the breach of any such covenant or condition, shall not be deemed a waiver of such breach and no waiver by the Landlord of any provision hereof shall be deemed to have been made unless expressed in writing and signed by Landlord.

19. LANDLORD'S ATTORNEY'S FEES. In the event of the employment by the Landlord of an attorney to collect any rents due by the Tenant hereunder or to protect the interest of the Landlord in the event of a breach (as hereinbefore defined) by Tenant of any of the terms and conditions of this lease, Tenant will pay to Landlord the reasonable fees of such attorney and such fees shall be forthwith due and payable upon demand and shall constitute additional rent due and payable by the Tenant hereunder.

20. PEACEFUL POSSESSION. Landlord hereby covenants and agrees that at the time of the delivery of this lease it is the owner of the premises herein leased, and has full right and power and authority to lease the same, and does hereby warrant to Tenant the quiet and peaceful possession of the premises hereby leased during the whole term of this lease so long as all terms and conditions herein are fully performed.

21. HOLDING OVER. If Tenant shall, with the written consent of Landlord, hold over after expiration of the term of this Lease, such tenancy shall be deemed a month-to-month tenancy, which tenancy may be terminated as provided by applicable state law. During such tenancy, Tenant agrees to pay Landlord a monthly payment agreed upon by Landlord and Tenant. If Tenant shall hold over without written consent of Landlord at the expiration of this Lease, such tenancy shall be deemed a month to month tenancy, which tenancy may be terminated as provided by applicable state law. During such tenancy, Tenant agrees to pay Landlord of 200% of the Base Rent which was paid in the last month of the Lease Term, and to be bound by all of the terms, covenants and conditions herein specified, so far as applicable.

22. TERMINATION OF LEASE. Notwithstanding anything herein to the contrary, Landlord may terminate this Lease at any time during the term hereof, or any renewal or extension term by providing Tenant with a minimum of thirty (30) days prior written notice of said termination.

24. CONDEMNATION. If the leased premises are condemned for public use or if such a portion is condemned so as to prevent Tenant from using the leased premises in substantially the same manner as theretofore used, this lease will terminate on the day prior to the vesting of title in the condemning authority. If a portion of the leased premises is taken or condemned, and if such taking does not prevent the Tenant from using the leased premises in substantially the same manner as theretofore used, then this lease shall terminate as to the portion of the leased premises taken on the day prior to the vesting of title in the condemning authority, but shall continue in effect as to the portion of the leased premises not taken. Tenant at all times during the Lease term shall, at its own expense, keep in full force and effect comprehensive general liability insurance with "personal injury" coverage and contractual liability coverage, with minimum limits of \$1,000,000.00 on account of bodily injuries to, or death of, one or more than one person as the result of any one accident or occurrence and \$500,000.00 on account of damage to property. All insurance policies or duly executed certificates for the same required to be carried by Tenant under this Lease, together with satisfactory evidence of the payment of the premium thereof, shall be deposited with Landlord on the date Tenant first occupies the leased premises and upon renewals of such policies not less than fifteen (15) days prior to the expiration of the term of such coverage. All insurance required to be carried by Tenant under this Lease shall be in form and content, and written by insurers reasonably acceptable to Landlord. Landlord shall during the term of this Lease, keep in full force and effect a commercial property liability insurance policy with limits not less than the replacement cost of the Leased Premises, a commercial general liability insurance policy with limits not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence/\$2,000,000 aggregate and workers' compensation insurance with limits of liability not less than statutory requirements. Landlord agrees to provide evidence of coverage upon request and will provide Tenant notice of cancellation or material reduction in such coverage.

26. PARTIES INCLUDED. Whenever reference is made herein to the words, "Landlord" or "Tenant", the same shall be construed to be both plural and singular and to include the respective heirs, distributees, executors, administrators, legal representatives, successors and assigns of the Landlord and Tenant.

27. GOVERNING LAW AND SEVERABILITY. This lease shall be interpreted in accordance with the laws of the State of Tennessee. If any clause or provision hereof should be determined to be illegal, invalid or unenforceable under present or future laws effective during the term of this lease or any renewal term hereof, then and in that event, it is the express intention of the parties hereto that the remainder of this lease shall not be affected thereby, and it is also the express intention of the parties hereto that in lieu of each clause or provision of this lease which may be determined to be illegal, invalid or unenforceable, there may be added as a part of this lease a clause or provision as similar in terms to such illegal, invalid or unenforceable clause or provision as may be possible and be legal, valid and enforceable.

28. MEMORANDUM OF LEASE. This Lease shall not be recorded.

29. ENTIRE CONTRACT. This lease embodies the entire contract of the parties and shall not be altered, changed, or modified in any respect except by instrument of equal dignity to this instrument.

30. SECURITY DEPOSIT. Tenant has deposited with Landlord the sum of \$550.00 as security for performance by Tenant of all of the terms, covenants, and conditions of this Lease upon Tenant's part to be performed. The security deposit shall be returned to Tenant after the expiration of the term of this Lease, provided that Tenant has fully performed hereunder. Landlord shall have the right to apply all or a portion of the security deposit to cure any default by Tenant. If Landlord applies the security deposit, or a portion of it, to any default by Tenant, then Tenant shall deposit with

Landlord the amount so applied, with the effect that Landlord shall have the full deposit on hand at all times during the term of this Lease. If the Building is sold or leased, subject to this Lease, Landlord shall have the right to transfer the security deposit to the vendee or Tenant of the Building. Landlord shall thereupon be released from all liability for the return of such security deposit to Tenant. The security deposit shall not bear interest during the term of this Lease and shall not be assigned or encumbered by Tenant in favor of any party other than Landlord. Any attempted assignment or encumbrance of the security deposit shall be void.

31. ACCESS. Upon reasonable advance written notice to Tenant, Tenant shall permit Landlord and its agents to enter into and upon the Premises at all reasonable times for the purpose of cleaning, repairing, altering or improving the Premises or the Park provided that Landlord shall use commercially reasonable efforts to minimize interference with Tenant's operations in connection with any such entry. Further, Landlord shall only enter the demised premises (other than in the event of an emergency) only with a representative of Tenant. Nothing contained in this Section shall be deemed to impose any obligation upon the Landlord not expressly stated elsewhere in this Lease. When reasonably necessary to prevent damage to persons or property or otherwise in the event of an emergency Landlord may temporarily close entrances, doors, corridors, elevators, or other facilities without liability to Tenant by reason of such closure and without such action by Landlord being construed as an eviction of Tenant or release of Tenant from the duty of observing and performing any of the provisions of this Lease upon reasonable advance notice to Tenant. Landlord shall have the right to enter the Premises for the purpose of showing the Premises to prospective tenants within the period of 90 days prior to the expiration or sooner termination of the lease term upon reasonable advance written notice to Tenant.





Excessive use or abuse of the telephone line(s) may result in Landlord forced use of voice mail and/or additional charges, and/or termination of this Lease Agreement at Landlord's sole discretion.

4. The telephone number(s) assigned is the sole property of the Landlord.

INTERNET SERVICE HOURS AND OWNERSHIP

1. Landlord will provide internet service Monday – Friday 8:30 am to 5:00 pm (excluding Legal Holidays) for a fee.

2. Tenant will hold Landlord harmless without liability for electrical or mechanical failures, weather or disaster related delays in service or human error. Tenant acknowledges that Landlord will make every effort to operate and maintain all equipment and software properly but in no way be held liable for equipment or software failure. Excessive use or abuse of the internet may result in Landlord to termination such service and/or Lease Agreement at Landlord's sole discretion.

3. Any additional cost to connect internet service to Tenant's computer or any software required for Tenant to access the internet shall be the sole responsibility of the Tenant. If Landlord shall contract for such service on behalf of Tenant, Tenant shall promptly reimburse Landlord the total cost plus twenty (20%) percent.

4. The internet assigned is the sole property of the Landlord

ADVERTISING

1. Tenant is responsible for the contracting and payment for all Yellow Page listings and advertisements.

MEETING ROOM FACILITIES

1. Landlord agrees to provide access of the Conference Rooms, and Training Room. Reservations are accepted on a first come first serve basis and it is understood and agreed that Suite tenants have priority status in reserving said facilities. In the event of a scheduling conflict, forty-eight hours (48) notice will be given to Tenant to make other arrangements. Scheduling for Conference Rooms, and Training Room is limited to forty-five days in advance. Conference Rooms, Training Room keys (if applicable) must be returned by 12:00 p.m. the following business day or a Twenty Five Dollar (\$25.00) key charge will be billable. The Reception Area is not to be used under any circumstances for meetings or otherwise prior to or after scheduled functions. Guests attending meetings, seminars, etc., may not congregate and/or linger in the Reception Area before or after meetings or during breaks. Noise level must be kept to a minimum as not to disturb other tenants. Violation of this policy will result in immediate suspension of facility privileges. Tenant understands and agrees he/she will be billed for time in one (1) hour increments. Reservations must be canceled twenty-four (24) hours in

advance or reserved time will be billed to Lessee. Conference Rooms and Training Room must be left in good condition with all tables left in original placement, dry erase board clean and all trash removed. A minimum fee of Twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) will be charged to Tenant should Landlord be required to clean facilities due to Tenant's negligence.

Administrative services are provided on a "first come first served" basis. Additional charges may be imposed for "rush" jobs or those requiring Landlord's staff to work beyond the above stated regular business hours

2. Landlord has carefully selected and trained its employees. It is the Landlord's goal to offer the best quality services possible; however, Landlord cannot imply or state any guarantee of the accuracy, time completion, or storage of work. It is the sole responsibility of the Tenant to proofread all work and to keep backup copies of all work. Landlord shall be held blameless for any errors, typographical error or storage problems.

POSTAGE AND OVERNIGHT MAILINGS

1. Landlord will provide Monday through Friday from 8:30 a.m. to 4:15 p.m., postage services, outgoing mail and express mail delivered to U.S. Postal Service for a fee.

2. Landlord cannot guarantee accurate postage or delivery time.

EMPLOYEE REPLACEMENT COST

Tenant agrees that it will not, during the term of this Lease Agreement, or within one year afterwards, hire any person who has been an employee of the Landlord. If Tenant shall violate this stipulation, Tenant shall be liable to the Landlord for liquidated damages in an amount equal to six (6) months wages of the employee, at the rate last paid to that employee by the Landlord.

LATE FEES AND TERMINATION OF ADDITIONAL SERVICES

Tenant will be billed for services at a rate set by Landlord, which rate may change from time to time without notice to Tenant. Payments for these services are due upon receipt of statement for same, and if not paid within ten (10) days, a late payment charge of ten percent (10%) shall be imposed. If Tenant shall fail to remit payment of statement by the 15th of the month, Landlord shall terminate all services without notice to Tenant, until payment in full has been received by Landlord. Landlord shall reserve the right to bill for services and require a cash only basis if Tenant shall continue to be delinquent for more than three times in a twelve month period.

EXHIBIT "C"
BUILDING RULES AND AGREED REGULATIONS

1. Tenant agrees to make a deposit, in an amount fixed by Landlord from time to time, for each key issued by Landlord to Tenant for its offices, and upon termination of this Lease, to return all keys to Landlord.
2. Tenant will refer all contractors, contractors' representatives and installation technicians, rendering any service to Tenant, to Landlord for Landlord's supervision, approval and control before performance of any contractual service. This provision shall apply to all work performed in the building including installations of telephones, telegraph equipment, electrical devices and attachments, and installations of any nature affecting floors, walls, woodwork, trim, windows, ceilings, equipment or any other physical portion of building.
3. Movement in or out of the building of furniture or office equipment, or dispatch or receipt by Tenant of any merchandise or materials which require use of elevators or stairways, or movement through building entrances or lobby shall be restricted to hours designated by Landlord. All such movement shall be under supervision of Landlord and in the manner agreed between Tenant and Landlord by prearrangement before performance. Such prearrangement initiated by Tenant will include determination by Landlord and subject to its decision and control, as to the time, method, and routing of movement and as to limitations imposed for safety or other concerns which may prohibit any article, equipment or any other item from being brought into the building. Tenant is to assume all risk as to damage to articles moved and injury to persons or public engaged or not engaged in such movement, including equipment, property, and personnel of Landlord if damaged or injured as a result of acts in connection with carrying out this service for Tenant, from time of entering property to completion of work, and Landlord shall not be liable for acts of any person engaged in, or any damage or loss to any of said property or persons resulting from any act in connection with such service performed for Tenant.
4. No signs, advertisements or notices shall be painted or affixed on or to any windows or doors, or other parts of the building, except of color, size and style and in such places, as shall be first approved in writing by Landlord. No nails, hooks or screws shall be driven or inserted in any part of the building, except by the building maintenance personnel, nor shall any part be defaced by Tenant. All signs will be contracted for by Landlord at the rate fixed by Landlord from time to time, and Tenant will be billed and pay for such service accordingly.
5. Tenant shall not place, install or operate in the Demised Premises or in any part of the building, any engine or machinery, or maintain, use or keep any inflammable, explosive, or hazardous material without consent of Landlord.
6. Landlord will not be responsible for lost or stolen personal property, equipment, money, or jewelry from Tenant's area or public rooms regardless of whether such loss occurs when the area is locked against entry or not.
7. No birds or animals shall be brought into or kept in or about building.
8. Landlord will not permit entrance to Tenant's offices by use of pass keys controlled by Landlord to any person at any time without written permission by Tenant, except employees, contractors, or service personnel directly supervised by Landlord.
9. The entries, passages, doors, elevators, elevator doors, hallways or stairways shall not be blocked or obstructed; no rubbish, litter, trash or material of any nature shall be placed, emptied or thrown into these areas; and such areas shall not be used at any time except for ingress or egress by Tenant, Tenant's agents, employees, invitees or visitors to or from the Demised Premises.
10. Plumbing fixtures and appliances shall be used only for purposes for which constructed, and no sweepings, rubbish, rags or other unsuitable material shall be thrown or placed therein. Damage resulting to any such fixtures or appliances from misuse by Tenant shall be repaired and replaced at Tenant's sole cost and expense, and Landlord shall not in any case be responsible therefore.

11. Tenant shall not do, or permit anything to be done in or about the building, or bring or keep anything therein, that will in any way increase the rate of fire or other insurance on the building, or on property kept therein, or obstruct or interfere with the rights of, or otherwise injure or annoy, other tenants, or do anything in conflict with the valid pertinent laws, rules or regulations of any governmental authority.
12. The Landlord desires to maintain the highest standards of environmental comfort and convenience for the tenantry. It will be appreciated if any undesirable conditions or lacks of courtesy or attention are reported directly to the management.
13. The work of the janitor or cleaning personnel shall not be hindered by Tenant after 5:30 p.m. and such work may be done at any time when the offices are vacant; the windows, doors, and fixtures may be cleaned at any time. Tenant shall provide adequate waste and rubbish receptacles, cabinets, book cases, map cases, etc., necessary to prevent unreasonable hardship to Landlord in discharging its obligation regarding cleaning service.
14. Landlord shall have the right to determine and prescribe the weight and proper position of any unusually heavy equipment including safes, large files, etc., that are to be placed in the building, and only those which in the opinion of Landlord might not with reasonable probability do damage to the floors, structure and/or freight elevator, may be moved into said building. Any damage occasioned in connection with the moving or installing of such aforementioned articles in said building or the existence of same in said building shall be paid for by Tenant, unless otherwise covered by insurance.
15. 

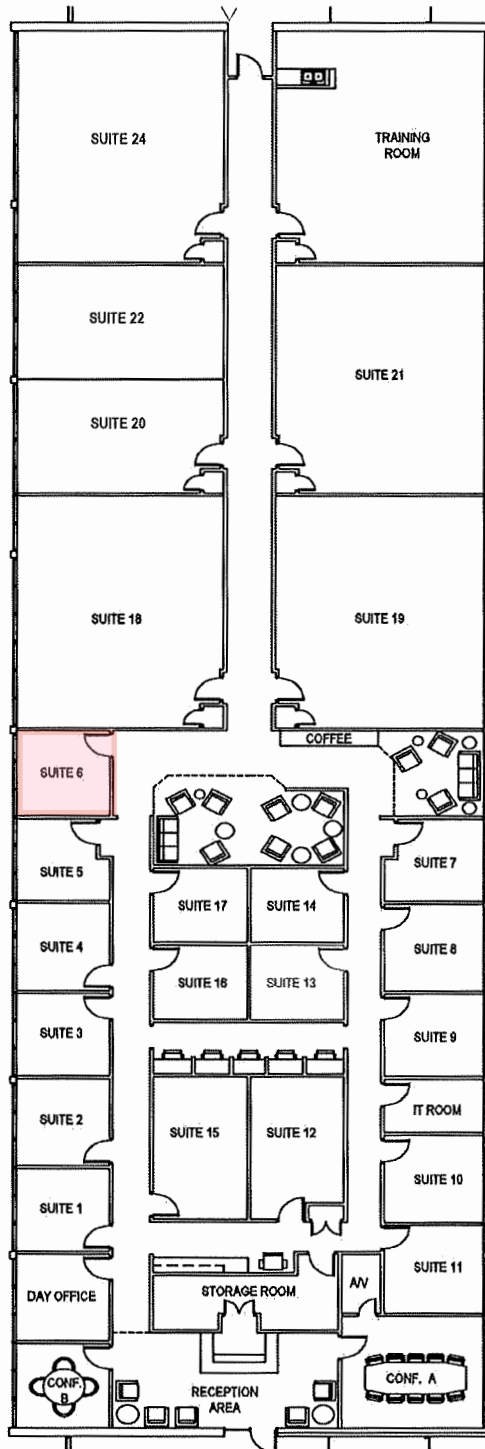

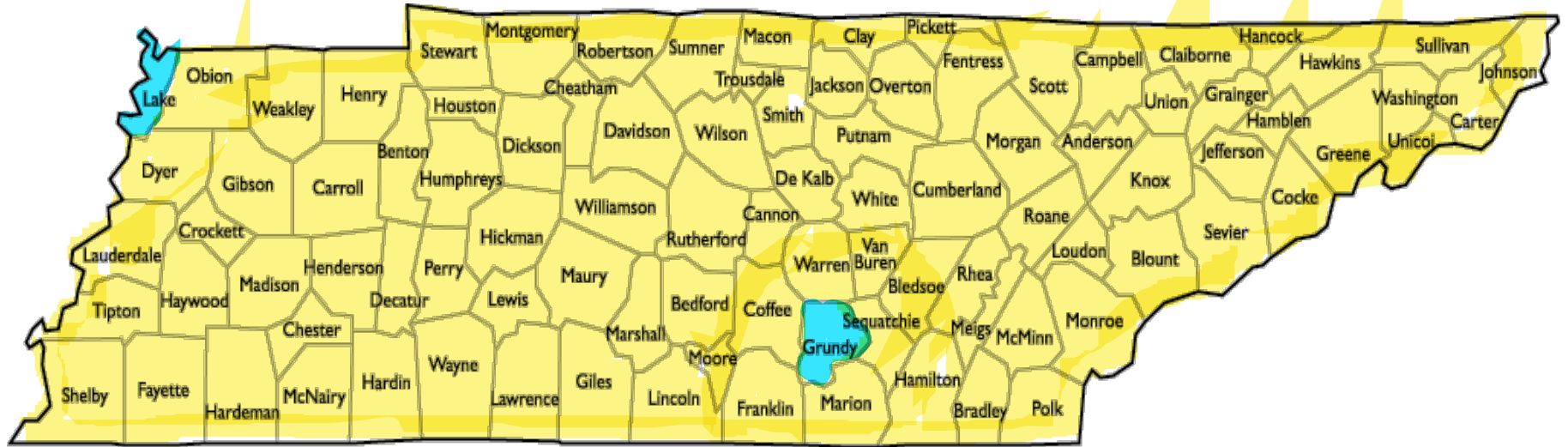

Attachment 6N: Projected Utilization and Methodology

As a skilled infusion nursing staffing agency, Naven has partnered with specialty pharmacies across Tennessee since May 2023. Some of these specialty pharmacies currently hold licenses as home care organizations, such as Coram CVS Specialty Infusion Services, Optum Infusion Services, and Option Care, but contract with Naven for home infusion therapy support for their chronically ill patients. These home infusion therapies include immunoglobulin therapy, Tumor Necrosis Factor-alpha inhibitors, and other therapies to treat autoimmune and neurological diseases, the full list of which is provided in the response to #4 in the Standards and Criteria. Table 6N-1 shows the historical home infusion visits that Naven has conducted for existing specialty pharmacies with HHA licenses from 2023 to 2025, as well as the pharmacies' corresponding patient censuses.

As shown in the table above, in 2025, Naven provided 1,824 home infusion therapy visits for 303 total home health patients from its specialty pharmacy partners with an existing HHA license. This is more than two times the number of patients Naven served in 2023 and represents a 12.2 percent increase in patients from 2024. While patient visits decreased from 2024 to 2025, this decrease in patient visits represents a year-over-year change in the overall acuity of the patients served – i.e., in 2025, the patient population generally needed fewer home health visits than those in 2024. Still, the strong growth in unduplicated patients served is representative of the growth of Naven’s services in Tennessee and the growth that Naven expects to continue in the future.

To project a baseline of its potential utilization in 2027, the first full year of the proposed project, Naven applied the HFC's projected statewide population growth rate for Tennessee from 2024 to 2028 – 2.9 percent – to each county's historical patients and visits for 2025, the most recent full year for which utilization data are available. Not only is this growth rate conservative relative to Naven's actual historical patient census growth of 12.2 percent from 2024 to 2025, it is reasonable because Naven's proposed service area encompasses all 95 Tennessee counties.

Naven's projections are based in part on the number of patients it has served through specialty pharmacies with existing home health licenses. But, based on this experience, another important component of Naven's projected utilization is the number of additional patients it can serve via its specialty pharmacy partners that lack home health licensure. Currently, Naven provides these pharmacies with staffing support in ambulatory infusion centers, as well as other infusion support services, but these providers have expressed a need for their patients to receive home infusion services and to have reliable access to a licensed HHA moving forward. Based on these specialty pharmacies' estimated historical volume of home health-appropriate infusion patients, Naven believes it is reasonable to project an additional 429 patients and 2,547 visits. The total projected baseline utilization of Naven's proposed HHA is shown in Table 6N-2 below.

The second full year of the proposed project is 2028. To grow its baseline projection of patients and visits from 2027 to 2028, Naven once again utilized the projected Tennessee population growth rate of 2.9 percent. This growth is shown in Table 6N-3 below. Although Naven did not serve patients from several Tennessee counties in 2025, given its operational experience, its extensive staffing network, and the added resources of the proposed project, Naven has conservatively estimated it will serve at least one patient from every Tennessee county by 2028. It has assumed that it will provide six visits in each of these counties, which is equivalent to the average number of visits per patient in 2025 ($1,824 \text{ visits} \div 303 \text{ patients} = 6.02 \text{ visits per patient in 2025}$).

Naven's total baseline projected patients and visits for 2027 and 2028, its first two full project years, is shown in Table 6N-3 below.

Although Naven will maintain its strong relationships with existing specialty pharmacies and anticipates continuing to provide home infusion services to many of these pharmacies' existing patients, Naven conservatively projects that it will treat 50 percent of the patients and visits projected in Table 6N-3 above. While Naven's actual home infusion utilization may be higher than this given its experience providing care in the state, Naven believes that this is a conservative estimation of the total utilization of its proposed HHA. This projected utilization is shown in Table 6N-4 below.

Option Care Health Agreed to Pay \$719,000 for Allegedly Violating the Civil Monetary Penalties Law by Paying Improper Remuneration in the Form of Referral Based Compensation

After it self-disclosed conduct to OIG, Option Care Health, Inc. f/k/a BioScrip, Inc., Option Care Enterprises, Inc. d/b/a Option Care, BioScrip Infusion Services, LLC d/b/a BioScrip Infusion Services, and East Goshen Pharmacy, LLC d/b/a BioScrip Infusion Services (collectively, “Option Care”), headquartered in Bannockburn, Illinois, agreed to pay \$719,265 for allegedly violating the Civil Monetary Penalties Law. OIG alleged that Option Care paid remuneration to a health care system and a physician practice in the form of compensation for physician services that varied with the volume of parental infusion therapy services referred to Option Care by the health care system and the physician practice, where the physician services were reimbursable separately.

1. 1E. Overview

It is noted that the applicant currently operates as a staffing agency partnering with pharmacies and existing licensed home health agencies to deliver infusion care.

What operational differences will be implemented in the transition to licensed home health agency rather than a contract staffing agency?

Will the applicant ever accept referrals as a standalone home health agency, or directly admit a home infusion patient under its license? If not, what is the purpose of pursuing statewide licensing?

Please include a note in response to Item 1E. of the application that the applicant proposes a limitation to home infusion therapy as stated in Attachment 1N.

Response : Naven currently operates in Tennessee as a skilled nursing staffing agency, providing specialized infusion nursing support to specialty pharmacies and, in some cases, their affiliated licensed home health agencies (HHAs). As described in the application's response to #4 in the Standards and Criteria included as Attachment 1N, this care model reflects the clinical demands of high-quality home infusion therapy: it requires a level of nursing specialization, training, and time commitment that most general HHAs are not equipped to independently provide. Infusion therapies are often administered across multiple sessions spanning weeks or months, and require consistent, highly trained clinical staff. This is precisely the nursing care Naven delivers to its current specialty pharmacy partners.

Although Naven effectively serves patients through its current staffing arrangement, it introduces inherent coordination challenges for patients and providers. Care must be managed across multiple entities – the referring provider, the specialty pharmacy, the licensed HHA, and Naven as the staffing contractor – each with its own administrative obligations. The result can be duplicative costs, administrative friction, and, most consequentially, logistical barriers that can delay access to medically necessary therapies for patients.

The proposed project – through which Naven will be licensed as a standalone HHA – addresses these inefficiencies. Rather than functioning as one component within a multi-party chain of care, the proposed project enables Naven to consolidate clinical and administrative responsibilities within its organization. Naven will be able to oversee a patient's plan of care from referral through discharge, coordinate directly with referring providers, and have full accountability for the care it delivers. This structural change positions Naven to deliver infusion care more efficiently and with greater clinical continuity.

Naven will accept referrals and directly admit home infusion patients under its own HHA license. Naven's project is designed to allow it to fully support its specialty pharmacy partners who receive infusion medication

referrals from a wide network of physicians, hospitals and other healthcare providers. Naven's proposed HHA will be able to serve all patients referred to it via its network specialty pharmacy partners; however, it will have the ability to expand its referral network as a result of the proposed project. Thus, statewide licensure is necessary and enables Naven to meet the identified need for broader access to infusion care across Tennessee.

Naven will comply with all HHA licensure and regulatory requirements under Tennessee law, including annual reporting of patient utilization data through the Joint Annual Reports (JARs).

Naven has altered its response to 1E accordingly.

2. 1E. Overview

Please discuss the extent to which the applicant's existing services are provided through partnerships with pharmacies and home health agencies that have any shared ownership with Option Care Health. Will the applicant partner with and accept referrals from any entities that are not affiliated with Option Care Health?

Where does the applicant currently provide nursing staff for ambulatory infusion centers in Tennessee?

Where are Option Care Health affiliated pharmacies and home health agencies currently located in Tennessee?

Response : According to the 2025 JAR for Home Health Agencies, there is one existing Option Care HHA in Tennessee: Vanderbilt HC Option Care IV Services, located in Nashville. Additionally, Option Care operates specialty pharmacies in Knoxville, Memphis and Nashville. Lastly, Option Care operates ambulatory infusion centers in Chattanooga, Clarksville, Knoxville, Memphis, and Nashville.* Naven provides infusion nursing staffing support to these Option Care locations today, albeit not exclusively; Naven also provides nursing staffing support to other specialty pharmacies and ambulatory infusion centers not operated by Option Care, such as those licensed HHAs and specialty pharmacies that provided support letters for Naven's project, which have been updated as [Attachment 1N-4R](#).

As previously stated, although Naven's relationships with Vanderbilt HC Option Care IV Services, the Option Care specialty pharmacies, and the Option Care ambulatory infusion centers will continue following development of the proposed project, Naven intends to partner with, and accept referrals for home infusion services from, any entity as necessary. As a separately licensed HHA, Naven's patients will be reported under its own HHA license.

3. 2E. Rationale for Approval

Are the home infusion patients historically served by the applicant's contracted nursing staff being reported by the primary home health agency contracting for these staff? What percentage of the overall infusion patients served by these primary HHAs (admitting agencies), are being served by contracted nursing staff provided by the applicant?

Is this model - continuing to function as a contracted staffing agency rather than a primary admitting agency consistent with the applicant's approach in other states where it operates as a licensed home health agency? Are there different models utilized by the applicant in different states?

Please discuss the TJC accreditation for home care. Which licensed entities are covered under the accreditation for home care and where are those entities located? Will the applicant have to admit patients directly as a home health agency before becoming eligible for TJC accreditation in Tennessee?

Response : Because Naven does not currently operate as a licensed HHA, the HHAs it partners with to provide home infusion nursing staffing support are responsible for reporting their own utilization data to the JAR for Home Health Agencies. These HHAs do not, and are under no obligation to, share their detailed utilization data with Naven. As such, Naven is not aware of the percentage of the patients of these HHAs' that are receiving infusion treatments through Naven's nursing staff.

Naven's care model varies based on the services it is licensed to provide in any given state. As stated in its response to #4 in the Standards and Criteria included as Attachment 1N, Naven is a nationwide skilled nursing staffing agency. It is certified as a Health Care Staffing Agency through TJC, a certification that applies to all 50 states. When operating as a nursing staffing agency, Naven's services and operating model are similar to how it operates in Tennessee today.

Naven also operates licensed HHAs and is accredited to provide home infusion services through TJC accreditation for "home care" in California, Florida, North Carolina, New Jersey, Ohio, Texas, and Virginia. For these HHAs, Naven provides home infusion care through employed registered nurses – not contracted staff operating on behalf of other providers. This is the same model Naven will use as a licensed HHA in Tennessee.

Thus, Naven has experience operating HHAs nationwide and holds the necessary accreditation to provide such services. It will leverage that experience to seek the same TJC accreditation for home care services for its licensed HHA in Tennessee. Naven will comply with any steps TJC requires to be eligible for home care accreditations as it has successfully done in other states.*

How many of the existing licensed HHAs and recently approved but unimplemented CONs does the applicant currently contract with for nursing services? Does the applicant intend to partner with other licensed providers, or accept patient referrals from new sources once it becomes licensed?

Please discuss how the project will meet the needs of the service area beyond what is currently provided through its presence and relationships in the 70 counties it is already operating in?

How will becoming licensed expand the applicant's ability to address unmet need if the applicant is not altering its business model beyond contracted staffing for existing licensed HHAs?

Are the applicant's existing agency partners not licensed in some of the proposed service area counties? Please clarify.

Response : As stated in its CON application, Naven currently contracts with three existing licensed HHAs to provide home infusion nursing staffing support in Tennessee: Coram CVS Specialty Infusion Services, Optum Infusion Services, and Vanderbilt HC Option Care IV Services. These three HHAs are not Naven’s only partnering providers in Tennessee; Naven also partners with numerous existing specialty pharmacies that lack home health licenses. See, for example, the letters of support from some of these partnering specialty pharmacies in [Attachment 1N-4R](#).

The proposed project is for the establishment of a separately licensed HHA that will exclusively provide home infusion services. As such, Naven will be able to accept patient referrals from any source, including but not limited to those it partners with today.

As also discussed throughout its CON application, the proposed project allows Naven to address the unmet need for additional home infusion services across all 95 counties in Tennessee – not just the 70 counties where it currently provides nurse staffing services. Through its expansive staffing network, which the proposed project will be able to draw from, Naven has the ability and capacity to provide home-based infusion care across Tennessee, including in highly rural counties. By operating a separately licensed HHA, Naven can more easily coordinate timely infusion care for these rural patients. The proposed project will also meet the needs of the service area by establishing a home infusion provider that is not limited to serving patients affiliated with its own specialty pharmacies – as is the case with many licensed home infusion providers in Tennessee today. As stated in its CON application, there are only 13 Tennessee HHAs included in the most recent JAR for Home Health Agencies that provided home infusion therapy services in 2025. Many of these HHAs have licenses that are limited to serving patients of their own affiliated specialty pharmacies. Thus, the proposed HHA greatly expands accessibility to home infusion services for patients across Tennessee.

Lastly, please see [Attachment 4R](#) for a list of the Tennessee counties in which Coram CVS Specialty Infusion Services, Optum Infusion Services, and Vanderbilt HC Option Care IV Services are licensed to provide care, as sourced from the HFC’s list of Home Health Licensed Counties. As shown in that attachment, some of those providers are not currently licensed to provide care in specific counties. As stated above, Naven’s proposed HHA will service all 95 Tennessee counties.

Response : Please see [Attachment 3NR](#) for revised data.

Based on Naven's experience, the need for infusion therapy spans patients' lifetimes. As such, the demographics of the typical patient population requiring home infusion services are wide-ranging and challenging to approximate across all therapy types, including those Naven has historically provided and may provide through the proposed project.

Naven estimates that approximately 11 percent of its Tennessee patient census is comprised of pediatric patients. Naven anticipates that a similar share of pediatric patients will be served by its proposed HHA.

In terms of the therapies Naven has historically offered, approximately 50 percent were immunoglobulin medications, 20 percent were alpha inhibitor medications, 20 percent were integrin receptor antagonists, and the remaining ten percent were other therapies treating a wide range of conditions, such as Crohn's disease, ulcerative colitis, and various autoimmune diseases. Again, the clinical indications for these medications are patient-specific and are not limited to patient populations with certain demographic characteristics. Naven has skilled nursing staff with the knowledge and experience necessary to deliver high-quality infusion services to this diverse target population.

6. 4N. Special Needs of Service Area

Does the applicant have any data on the percentage of its historical home infusion patients who were covered through Medicare, TennCare or were uninsured?

Does the applicant have a charity care policy?

Response : No, Naven does not have any payor data for the home infusion patients it has served through its existing partnerships. In all cases, Naven's partnering specialty pharmacies are responsible for billing patients' payors, where applicable, and they do not share patients' payor data with Naven. As stated in its application – specifically in [Attachment 10C](#) – Naven does not directly bill payors for its services. Naven charges its partnering providers a fee for its nurse staffing services. Naven's partnering providers bill patients' payors, if applicable, which may include various state and federal programs, such as Medicare and TennCare.

For the same reasons noted above and as also explained in [Attachment 10C](#), Naven does not have a charity care policy, as it does not directly offer charity care to the patients of these partnering providers. Again, Naven's specialty pharmacy partners retain responsibility for offering charity care to patients. However, Naven is aware that many of its specialty pharmacy partners offer financial assistance programs to patients meeting certain criteria, and it is supportive of such programs and serving patients participating in them. The proposed project is equally committed to supporting these programs, and Naven remains willing to work with its specialty pharmacy partners to ensure uninsured or patients with financial needs have adequate access to home infusion care.

7. 5N. Unimplemented services

Does the applicant intend to partner with any of the recently approved but unimplemented CON agencies identified on Page 17? If so, in what capacity?

Attachment 5N appears to contain errors with the following:

2025 Infusion Visits - Pain Management - Implanted Pump Management LLC - ID 47452

Response : Naven does not anticipate partnering with Amerita, Inc., River City Infusion, LLC, or OPTIV Infusion, LLC, upon their licensure as HHAs, particularly given that they are limited to serving patients of their own pharmacies. Nevertheless, if approved, Naven's proposed statewide service area would enable it to serve patients of these three HHAs or their affiliated specialty pharmacies.

Naven was unable to find an error for the noted provider in [Attachment 5N](#). As recorded in the individual facility report for Implanted Pump Management LLC, included as [Attachment 7R](#), the total number of visits and hours provided by this licensed HHA were 360 and 102, respectively. These totals are viewable on page 11 of [Attachment 7R](#) and match the utilization totals for this provider included in the originally attached [Attachment 5N](#).

8. 1C. Transfer Agreements

Will the applicant ever be responsible for transferring a patient under its proposed business model or will other primary HHAs be responsible?

Response : In Naven's experience, transfers from a home health setting are rare. If a patient receiving home infusion services were to be in need of a transfer, it would likely be due to an emergency that required the patient to be admitted to a hospital. Thus, a Naven registered nurse, the patient, or their caretaker would contact the emergency medical services in their area, and the patient would be transported to an inpatient facility.

If a patient required emergent care during the home infusion process – i.e., due to a reaction to administered medication or for some other reason – Naven's nursing staff would coordinate with emergency resources to ensure the patient received the appropriate care. For example, please see [Attachment 8R](#) for Naven's Anaphylaxis Treatment and Management policy, which would apply to the proposed HHA.

Will the applicant ever directly admit or discharge a home infusion patient without a referral coming through another HHA first?

What is the timeframe required for the applicant to become TJC accredited for its services as a licensed HHA in Tennessee? How many patients must be served to become eligible to TJC review?

Response : As stated in Section Q of its application, Naven, as a separately licensed HHA exclusively providing home infusion services, will comply with all HFC licensure requirements. Its fee-for-service arrangements with specialty pharmacies will not impact its ability to comply with these rules. As stated in response to Question #3, Naven will follow the process for TJC accreditation as outlined by both the HFC and TJC.*

As a licensed HHA, Naven will directly admit or discharge any patient receiving home infusion services through its HHA. It will not rely on other licensed HHAs for all patient referrals.

10. 4C. Accessibility to Human Resources

What will the clinical supervision structure be for the applicant's home health agency?

Will staff for the project be employed directly or on a contract basis?

Please discuss the geographical distribution of staff for the project currently and how that is projected to expand if approved?

Response : All nurses providing care for Naven’s licensed HHA will be direct employees of Naven Health, Inc. Additionally, all nurses will be registered nurses (RNs). These RNs will report directly to a Nurse Manager, of which there will be two for the proposed HHA. These two Nurse Managers will report to a Senior Nurse Manager, who will then report to the Director of Nursing. These positions and their requisite FTEs are listed in response to Question 8Q of Naven’s application.

Naven’s existing RNs in Tennessee are located across a wide geographic area, and as such have had, and will have, the ability to provide care across the entire state. Specifically, Naven utilizes a geographically distributed nursing model designed to support timely access to care. Nurses are aligned to designated coverage regions based on patient density, referral trends, and geographic proximity, allowing for efficient scheduling and continuity of care while minimizing travel burden and response delays. In higher-volume markets, Naven utilizes dedicated local nursing coverage, while rural and lower-volume areas are supported through a combination of regional nurses and strategically deployed per diem resources to maintain flexibility and responsiveness. To support timely patient care needs, Naven operates through centralized referral coordination and staffing oversight, allowing referrals, scheduling, and urgent patient needs to be monitored in real time. Clinical leadership and staffing teams actively manage daily capacity, prioritize urgent starts of care, and adjust coverage dynamically based on patient acuity, therapy type, and geographic need. This allows Naven to maintain broad statewide reach while continuing to provide responsive, patient-centered care. Naven’s nursing response timelines vary based on therapy type, patient urgency, physician orders, and payer authorization requirements; however, most routine referrals are reviewed and coordinated within 24 hours of receipt, with urgent or time-sensitive referrals prioritized for same-day or next-day response whenever clinically appropriate. Current average “Time to Yes” metrics – defined as referral receipt to nurse acceptance and scheduling – are approximately one to two days across the organization, with many Tennessee referrals coordinated more rapidly depending on location and patient need.

As discussed in response to #6 of the Standards and Criteria in [Attachment 1N](#), Naven has the ability to hire additional nursing staff and flex its network of existing nursing staff to full-time status to serve additional patients, as necessary.

11. 6C. Historical/Projected Data Chart

Please explain how bad debt is being calculated if the applicant is only billing other agencies as a contractor.

Response : The costs that Naven tracks bad debt cover rare situations where Naven may not receive full payment from a specialty pharmacy provider. Thus, the projected bad debt in 6C is based on the historical share of Naven’s total gross revenue that is accounted for through these occurrences, which, again, are rare. Specifically, it is based on 0.4 percent of the gross revenue for Naven’s outpatient services, which is reflected in the table in Question 6C.

12. 8C. Proposed Charges

Please detail the projected average number of hours per visit and visits per patient. How are fees billed, as visits, per hour, by procedure type, etc? What leads to variation in these charges?

Response : As noted in its projections provided in [Attachment 6N](#), Naven provides, on average, six visits per home infusion therapy patient. Although this is a reasonable tool for projecting utilization for its proposed HHA, it is nevertheless an approximation, as the number of visits a home infusion therapy patient needs can vary significantly, from one infusion therapy visit per month to multiple infusion therapy visits per week across multiple weeks. Thus, the complex and specialized nature of home infusion therapy services creates challenges in approximating an “average” visit length. For example, a patient receiving antibiotic home infusion therapy

following a serious hospitalization may require daily home infusion therapy following their discharge; these therapies may also take hours to deliver per day. As the patient recovers, however, the cadence of their therapy may change; the patient may eventually only require antibiotic infusions a few days per week, then weekly, then monthly. The length of these home infusions may also vary as the patient regains their health, and their condition can be managed at a reduced level of care.

Similarly, Naven cannot provide an average time or charge for home infusion therapy services, as each visit – and patient – is unique, and requires a case-by-case approach. Naven would note, however, that its fee-for-service charges are based on visit length, with a standard rate for the first two hours, then an hourly rate for every hour thereafter.

What are the infusion therapy types driving the 12% annual growth for the applicant? Are there specific regional gaps in existing providers capable of delivering these high demand infusion therapies?

Response : Immunoglobulin (IG) therapy has been the primary driver of Naven's historical growth in home infusion services. IG therapy is among the most resource-intensive infusion therapies to administer. These treatments are typically delivered across multiple sessions, often spanning several hours per visit over the course of multiple weeks. The clinical demands of IG therapy require nurses with specialized training and the scheduling flexibility to manage extended, recurring care episodes. These are precisely the characteristics that distinguish home infusion nursing from general home health services and that have historically made IG therapy difficult for traditional HHAs to absorb into their existing staffing models.

Beyond IG therapy, Naven delivers a broad range of home infusion therapies that also require specialized nursing competencies and sustained care coordination. Thus, effectively administering all infusion therapy types is complex – both clinically and logistically. As a provider exclusively focused on home infusion services, Naven has the clinical resources necessary to navigate these complexities.

Naven's project responds directly to identified unmet need for home infusion services across Tennessee. Based on Naven's experience, this need is more acute in Tennessee's rural communities where patients requiring IG and other specialized infusion therapies may have limited or no access to a qualified provider capable of delivering care in the home setting. Traditional HHAs operating in these markets frequently lack the specialized nursing staff and care coordination infrastructure that complex infusion therapies demand. By operating as a licensed HHA, Naven will be able to respond directly to referrals from rural physicians, hospitals, and specialty pharmacies without relying on an affiliated partner to hold the license and manage the care relationship. With a statewide proposed service area, the project is sure to expand critical access to infusion services, allowing Naven to serve patients beyond the geographic footprints of its existing specialty pharmacy partners.

Response : All nurses that will be employed by Naven's proposed HHA will be licensed registered nurses and are required to have at least one year of experience providing infusion therapy care. Naven does not require its nursing staff to hold any specific certifications, but it does cover the costs of Certified Registered Nurse Infusion certification for nurses who choose to pursue it. This certification, administered by the Infusion Nurses Society, is the only specialty certification for infusion nurses and evidence of a nurse's knowledge of and commitment to high-quality, evidence-based infusion practices.

17. 1N. Criteria and Standards

Attachment 1N. Home Health Criteria and Standards, Criterion #8 MCOs

Please provide context for the statement that past home health agency CONs have been approved where "the specialty pharmacies are billing payors for the drug and/or the cost of administering the drug rather than for the home health services."

Will the applicant's charges to HHAs vary based on the patient's payor source?

Response : This statement reflects and is consistent with the general reimbursement scheme for home infusion services, particularly when these services are delivered through specialty pharmacies' licensed HHAs. As noted throughout the application, the HFC has approved numerous home infusion projects in recent years, including but not limited to, OPTIV Infusion, LLC (CN2602-006A), Blueberry Health Infusion Nursing (CN2505-019A), and Amerita, Inc. (CN2503-008A). At a high level, infusion services can be broken down into several components: (1) pharmaceuticals and pharmaceutical supplies, (2) durable medical equipment, and (3) nursing, which can occur in a variety of settings, including a patient's home. Generally, payors, including government payors, reimburse pharmacies for pharmaceuticals and pharmaceutical-related supplies. Home health services are not usually covered unless a patient is homebound; therefore, the majority of specialty pharmacies offering home infusion services are receiving reimbursement for the pharmaceuticals and pharmaceutical-related supplies and covering a patient's home infusion services through pharmaceutical-related reimbursement.

Naven's charges will not vary based on the patient's payor source. Again, Naven does not have access to patients' payor information; its specialty pharmacy partners retain this information.

18. 1N. Criteria and Standards

Attachment 1N. Home Health Criteria and Standards, Criterion #12 Data Requirements

How will the applicant handle Joint Annual Report submission to ensure that duplication of reported patients is minimized with the primary reporting HHAs?

Response : Naven will operate as a separately licensed HHA. Any patients that receive care through the Naven HHA will be reported as patients of Naven, and not as patients of any other HHA. As such, no duplication of reported patients will occur.

19. 1N. Criteria and Standards

Attachment 1N. Home Health Criteria and Standards, Criterion #11 Quality Control and Monitoring

What quality improvement data is captured by the applicant currently as a staffing contractor on behalf of HHAs reporting to payors? How is it shared with the applicant's partners? How will the applicant's collection of performance data be altered if the applicant becomes a licensed HHA in Tennessee?

Response : Naven utilizes various quality assurance, risk management, and patient experience metrics to ensure its providers deliver high-quality infusion care. This includes monitoring metrics such as the following for its nursing staff:

- Documentation of Compliance with Lab Draws
- Epinephrine Availability

- Documentation Compliance with Medication Administration
- Total Adverse Events
- Infusion-Related Adverse Event Rate
- Medication Error Rate
- Adverse Drug Reaction Rate
- Supply Event Rate
- Catheter/IV Line Event Rate
- ED Use without Admission Rate
- Hospitalization Rate
- Complaint Event Rate
- Net Promoter Score
- Patient Satisfaction Rating

Naven also has various policies and procedures in place to monitor and ensure the quality of its services, including Naven’s Supervision of Clinical Nursing Services policy, its Clinical License Verification Policy, its Competency Assessment policy, its Staff In-Service and Education policy, and its Nursing Orientation, Competency Assessment, and Skills Validation policy. These are included in Attachment 4C as submitted with Naven’s initial application.

Naven will use similar metrics to monitor the quality of care at its proposed HHA.

20. 10C. Project Only Payor Mix

It is noted the applicant will not bill payors directly and charge a fee for its services and the specialty pharmacies will bill the partnering specialty pharmacies. Within that billing model, please estimate the percentage of the \$1,872,362 gross “fee” revenue projected that will represent Medicare, TennCare, Commercial, and Self-Pay patients.

How is it possible the applicant will be capable to provide infusion services to Medicare and TennCare patients while a majority of existing home infusion home health agencies only serve commercial pay patients?

Why is there no charity care projected especially as noted in Attachment 10.c. by the applicant, “*Naven will accept all medically appropriate patients referred from its specialty pharmacy partners, the project is sure to be broadly accessible to Tennessee’s most medically vulnerable populations*”.

Please clarify who will be accredited for infusion home health services for Medicare enrollees, the applicant or the supplier? If the applicant is billing medication pharmacies a “fee” for the nursing component of the infusion therapy service, how will Medicare monitor the applicant for HIT deemed accreditation and quality?

Response : As the question notes, Naven will not bill payors directly for home infusion services. It does not bill payors as a staffing agency, and it also does not intend to bill payors as a licensed HHA. Again, the patients it will serve will come through specialty pharmacies’ referrals. As explained in the response to Question #6 above, Naven does not have access to the payor mixes of its partnering pharmacies and does not anticipate gaining access to this information once it is licensed as an HHA. Therefore, Naven is unable to provide the percentage of its gross revenue that will represent Medicare, TennCare, Commercial, and Self-Pay patients.

As noted in the response to Question 3Q, Naven will not seek accreditation for Medicare – like several other previously approved home infusion projects. To the extent one of Naven’s specialty pharmacy partners participates in the Medicare Home Infusion Therapy (HIT) benefit, the pharmacy would retain responsibility for complying with applicable accreditation and quality requirements. Naven does, however, comply with terms of its arrangements with specialty pharmacies, which, if applicable, could incorporate requirements a pharmacy must comply with to participate in the HIT program. But, again, the specialty pharmacy would remain responsible for ensuring applicable payor requirements were met. Naven would also note that, for the reasons explained in response to Question #17 above, the lack of HIT certification would not prevent Naven or its specialty pharmacy partners from being able to provide infusion care to all patients, including Medicare and TennCare enrollees.

As stated above, Naven does not have insight into the historical payor mix of its partnering specialty pharmacies. Although many patients in need of home infusion services may be covered by commercial payors, the most recently approved CON proposing the initiation of home infusion services did not reflect this assumption. This CON application was that of OPTIV Infusion, LLC, which projected that only 10 percent of its total gross operating revenue would come from commercial payors.

Regardless, the purpose of Naven’s project is to offer broad access to home infusion services for all patients, regardless of payor. And, as stated in the response to Question #5, Naven currently serves and will continue to serve a diverse patient population with wide-ranging demographic characteristics. The clinical infusion experience of its registered nurses differentiates Naven from other home infusion projects, and it is imperative that Naven have the opportunity to serve all patients, including Medicare and TennCare patients. For these same reasons, Naven noted in its application that it would accept all medically appropriate patients. This position is not altered by Naven’s charity care projections, which are explained in detail throughout the application and in response to Question #6 above. Again, Naven is aware of and fully supports the charity care programs of its specialty pharmacy partners.

21. 3Q. Accreditation/Certification/Licensure Plans

Please clarify if the proposed accreditation by The Joint Commission is specific to infusion therapy. If so, please listed that type of accreditation.

Response : Naven will seek “home care” accreditation through TJC for the proposed project. This accreditation category includes the provision of home infusion services.

22. 8Q. Staffing

There is no physician listed in the staffing chart. Please explain.

Response : The supervising physician for any patient treated through Naven's proposed HHA will be the physician who orders a patient's home infusion medication. As such, no physician is listed in the staffing chart for Question 8Q. This is also consistent with the staffing charts provided in several recently approved CON applications for HHAs limited to providing home infusion services, including those of OPTIV Infusion, LLC; River City Infusion, LLC; and Amerita, Inc.

Naven's staffing agency does currently employ a Chief Medical Officer who, as a Medical Doctor, oversees the development of policies and procedures related to the provision of home infusion care and is available to provide clinical guidance as necessary. This Chief Medical Officer will also be able to provide such guidance for the services offered through the proposed HHA.

On behalf of **Coram Alternate Site Services, Inc. DBA” Coram”** I am writing to express our strong support for the Certificate of Need application submitted by Naven Health to establish a Tennessee-licensed home health agency dedicated to supporting home infusion patients.

Coram is a pharmacy provider that dispenses and manages home infusion therapies for patients across Tennessee. Our patients often require complex medications administered in the home setting, including biologics, anti-infectives, parenteral nutrition, and other therapies that depend on timely, skilled nursing services for safe initiation, monitoring, and patient education.

In practice, one of the most significant challenges we face is securing reliable nursing support for home infusion patients through traditional home health agencies. Understandably, many home health agencies prioritize higher-volume, episodic home health services and are not structured to support the on-demand, therapy-specific nursing visits required for infusion therapy. As a result, pharmacies and patients often experience delays in care initiation, difficulty locating nurses with appropriate infusion experience, and inconsistent availability of services across different regions of the state.

These challenges can directly affect patient access and continuity of care. For patients who are medically appropriate for home infusion, delays in securing nursing support may result in extended hospital stays, delayed discharges, or interruptions in therapy, all of which increase healthcare costs and create unnecessary burdens for patients and families.

Approval of this project would help address these issues by allowing Naven Health to operate a Tennessee-licensed home health agency specifically designed to support home infusion providers and their patients. Naven Health already supports pharmacies in Tennessee that hold their own home health licenses, and it has an established track record of providing nursing support to infusion providers across the country. This experience demonstrates both operational readiness and a clear understanding of the specialized clinical and logistical needs of home infusion therapy.

PURPOSE:

To provide guidelines for identifying, monitoring, treating, and reporting anaphylaxis reactions. This policy includes information regarding issues that must be taken into consideration when assessing patients that may require readiness to treat anaphylaxis. There are certain comorbidities and drug interactions that, if present, could influence the decision to accept the patient for a first dose in the home setting.

RELATED DOCUMENTS:

NH-PC-030 First Dose Administration

POLICY:

Patients will be assessed prior to the start of care and based on therapies to be administered, appropriate pre-medications will be ordered by the prescriber and dispensed. Life threatening medical emergencies resulting from the prescribed therapy will be treated per the prescriber's orders.

Failure to comply with this Policy may result in disciplinary actions up to and including termination of employment.

PROCEDURE:

1. Please refer to NH-PC-030 *First Dose Administration* for first dose administration of a new medication and the requirements for anaphylaxis kit prescribing and dispensing at the initiation of therapy. Nursing team members will follow prescriber's orders to treat anaphylactic and adverse drug reactions.
2. During the initial patient visit, the Nurse will educate the patient on procedures to follow in case of medical emergency:
 - a. The patient and/or caregiver shall be instructed to call 911 in case of medical emergency or signs of an anaphylactic reaction.
 - b. If indicated, the patient and/or caregiver will be instructed on the use and administration of epinephrine or other prescribed medications to treat an adverse drug reaction or anaphylaxis.
3. Indications that your patient may be experiencing an anaphylactic response or adverse drug reaction:
 - a. Cutaneous reactions. Flushing, pruritus (especially of the hands, feet, and groin) erythema, urticaria, hives and angioedema. Pruritus and congestion involving the mucous membranes of the eyes, nose and mouth can occur. These symptoms may also be precursors of a more severe reaction

Anaphylaxis Treatment and Management

- b. Gastrointestinal reactions. Nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, abdominal cramping and increased mucous secretions.
- c. Respiratory reactions. Uvular edema, hoarseness, dyspnea, tightness in the chest, wheezing, stridor, and acute bronchospasm.
- d. Cardiovascular reactions. Dysrhythmias, tachycardia, hypotension, ischemia with chest pain and circulatory collapse.

4. Epinephrine/Adrenaline

- a. For severe allergic or anaphylactic reactions such as wheezing, difficulty in breathing, angioedema, or swelling of the eye lids, lips or throat while receiving an infusion and the RN is present:
 - i. Epinephrine will be administered per prescriber order.
 - ii. Immediately stop the infusion and completely remove the source of the medication, while maintaining IV access, DO NOT FLUSH the remaining medication from any IV extender tubing once disconnected from the infusion, if necessary, withdrawal any remaining medication and flush with the saline that will be hung for the treatment of the anaphylaxis.
 - iii. Contact or have the caregiver call 911.
 - iv. The RN will administer epinephrine or auto-injector per treatment guidelines. the dose may be repeated according to prescriber order.
 - v. The preferred route of administration for epinephrine during an anaphylactic reaction is intramuscular injection. The anterolateral aspect of the thigh is the recommended injection site. The epinephrine can be administered subcutaneously if intramuscular injection is not possible.
- b. For severe allergic or anaphylactic reactions such as wheezing, difficulty in breathing, angioedema, or swelling of the eye lids, lips or throat while receiving an infusion and the RN is not present:
 - i. The patient and/or caregiver will call 911.
 - ii. The patient or caregiver will administer epinephrine via Auto-Injector or vial/ampule per treatment guidelines. If a patient requires another dose and emergency medical services have not arrived, the dose may be repeated.

5. Diphenhydramine/Benadryl

- a. Administer diphenhydramine per prescriber's orders.

6. Actions after Medications Administered

- a. Monitor and document patient's vital signs, including mental status. If hypotensive, place the patient in supine position with lower extremities elevated or in Trendelenburg position to maximize perfusion to vital organs. If breathing difficulty, tilt the patient's head or thrust jaw to relieve airway obstruction. Confirm that emergency medical services have been activated.

Anaphylaxis Treatment and Management

- b. Maintain IV line with sodium chloride 0.9%, if ordered, to keep the line open until the arrival of a paramedic or ambulance.
- c. If the patient is stable to do so, notify the patient's prescriber of the adverse event and remain with the patient until the arrival of emergency medical services.
- d. Until the arrival of emergency medical services, monitor and document vital signs every 2 minutes until stable, then every 15 minutes as needed.
- e. If the patient is not transported for additional emergency care, instruct a family member or a caregiver to monitor the patient for 8 to 12 hours after the onset of the episode as some patients experience a recurrence (biphasic anaphylaxis), also known as a 'rebound anaphylaxis' and instruct the caregiver to call 911 should there be any recurrence of symptoms, difficulty breathing or changes in mentation.
- f. Document the occurrence and actions in a progress note and complete an event in event management system.

1. 1E. Overview

Is the applicant going to continue operations as a nurse staffing agency if approved?

Which, if any, entity will be billing the patients and payor sources for the home infusion nursing services provided by the applicant's HHA given the applicant's indirect fee-based model? Are home infusion nursing services not reimbursed by commercial payors or Medicare Advantage? Is the specialty pharmacy referring each patient to home infusion services able to bill any payor sources for the cost of infusion nursing care? Which payor sources, commercial or governmental cover the cost of infusion nursing care?

If infusion nursing service are eligible for reimbursement through certain payors, why is the applicant not billing them directly for the scope of its services as a home health agency?

Response : If Naven's proposed project is approved, the majority of its patients will be served through its HHA. All home infusion services will be provided via Naven's licensed HHA, and, as detailed in Naven's Supplemental Round 1 responses, will be reported to the HFC accordingly. When operating outside patients' homes, Naven will retain the ability to operate as a nurse staffing agency, such as when Naven partners with specialty pharmacies to staff their ambulatory infusion centers. Naven currently has the staffing resources necessary to offer these services and, if needed, can recruit and hire additional nursing FTEs.

The specialty pharmacies that Naven partners with will bill patients and payors for home infusion nursing services as permitted under applicable billing guidance. Again, Naven's specialty pharmacy partners, both currently and if the proposed project is approved, manage relationships with payors and are responsible for billing payors. Thus, the specialty pharmacies have more direct knowledge and experience with home infusion nursing reimbursement, including understanding the specific terms of their payor agreements. Generally, it is Naven's understanding that each payor reimburses for the various components of infusion therapy, including nursing services, according to its pharmaceutical agreement with the specialty pharmacy. In many cases, however, payors will not reimburse directly for nursing services.

As stated throughout Naven's application and supplemental responses, Naven does not have information on the payor mixes of its specialty pharmacy partners or access to their payor agreements. As such, Naven does not know the specific components of home infusion nursing care that each payor reimburses. In Question #20 of the first round of supplemental questions, the HFC stated that "the majority of existing home infusion home health agencies only serve commercial pay patients," suggesting that commercial payors are more likely to reimburse for home infusion care than governmental payors. This aligns with Naven's understanding that the Medicare Home Infusion Therapy ("HIT") certification only applies to a very limited number of higher acuity medications – medications that will not represent the majority of Naven's anticipated home infusion volume. For example, according to recent CMS HIT program guidance,* there are 34 highly specialized drugs that may be eligible to have home infusion nursing covered under the Medicare Part B HIT benefit. As shown on page

six of that guidance, nearly 70 percent of all HIT service visits were linked to only three drugs, one of which is a Category 3 chemotherapy medication that Naven will not administer through the proposed HHA, and another of which is a Category 1 inotrope, a type of therapy that will comprise a small share of the services that will be provided by Naven's HHA, as discussed in the response to Question #5 of Naven's first round of supplemental responses.

For the reasons stated throughout Naven's CON application and supplemental responses to date, even if payors reimburse for infusion nursing services, billing payors directly is not and will not be Naven's business model. Naven is seeking a home health license to enhance its current business model, better serve its specialty pharmacy partners, and, most importantly, fulfill an identified patient need.

2. 2N. Service Area

Since the applicant's projections are based on existing nurse staffing services, are these services projected to continue at the same level, or will the applicant's direct admission patients replace that base of patients who were previously served under the contracted staffing model?

Response : As stated in response to Question #1 above, Naven anticipates that the majority of its future Tennessee patients will be patients served under its HHA license. As such, these patients will "replace" Naven's historical patient base from an operational reporting perspective. This is consistent with the assumptions and projected patient utilization data provided in Attachment 6N of Naven's application.

3. 5N. Unimplemented services

Please list visits and hours in 2025 for Amedisys Home Health Care (Madison) ID 57075.

Response : According to the 2025 JAR for Home Health Agencies, Amedisys Home Health Care recorded 51,785 total visits and 20,358 visits for "Infusion Therapy – Pain Management," specifically. No hours are listed alongside these visits. Because Amedisys does not exclusively provide specialty infusion services – like Naven does – Naven does not view Amedisys as a "similar healthcare provider" under 5N. Regardless, the proposed project is unlikely to affect Amedisys's current or future infusion therapy visits.

4. 8C. Proposed Charges

How many hours is the average per visit charge \$827.38 based on?

Response : The average charge per visit charge noted above corresponds to a home infusion therapy visit approximately four hours in length. However, as noted in response to Question #12 of Naven's first round of supplemental responses, the length and complexity of home infusion services can vary significantly, which affects the charges for those services. The figure above is an aggregate of charges across all of Naven's possible home infusion therapy patients. As explained in response to Question #12 of Naven's first round supplemental responses, Naven's fee-for-service charges are based on visit length, with a standard rate for the first two hours, then an hourly rate for every hour thereafter.

5. 1N. Criteria and Standards

Attachment 1N. Home Health Criteria and Standards, Criterion #8 MCOs

Please explain whether any of the infusion nursing costs are being reimbursed through commercial or governmental payor sources or whether the applicant is stating that no nursing costs are ever being reimbursed for home infusion and all costs are simply absorbed under the reimbursement the pharmacy receives?

It appears that many home infusion nursing visits and hours reported under commercial payors in the JAR? Are they not billing and being reimbursed for nursing care provided to patients?

Response : As explained in more detail in the response to Question #1 above, commercial and governmental payors vary in their coverage of infusion nursing costs. Generally, home infusion services are covered through the pharmaceutical-related reimbursement that the specialty pharmacy receives from a payor – commercial or governmental.

In Question #20 of the first-round supplemental questions, the HFC noted that “the majority of existing home infusion home health agencies only serve commercial pay patients.” Although Naven has no direct knowledge of how these HHAs are billing and being reimbursed for nursing care provided to patients, based on its experience in the infusion industry, Naven assumes these agencies are billing and being reimbursed for home infusion nursing services as outlined above and in response to Question #1.

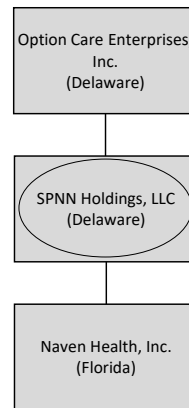

On behalf of **Coram Alternate Site Services, Inc. DBA” Coram”** I am writing to express our strong support for the Certificate of Need application submitted by Naven Health to establish a Tennessee-licensed home health agency dedicated to supporting home infusion patients.

Coram is a pharmacy provider that dispenses and manages home infusion therapies for patients across Tennessee. Our patients often require complex medications administered in the home setting, including biologics, anti-infectives, parenteral nutrition, and other therapies that depend on timely, skilled nursing services for safe initiation, monitoring, and patient education.

In practice, one of the most significant challenges we face is securing reliable nursing support for home infusion patients through traditional home health agencies. Understandably, many home health agencies prioritize higher-volume, episodic home health services and are not structured to support the on-demand, therapy-specific nursing visits required for infusion therapy. Purpose:

The purpose of this policy is to ensure that registered nurses are performing clinical tasks according to Naven policies and procedures.

Related Document(s):

NA

Policy:

1. The Nursing Manager/Area Director or Nursing (ADON)/ VP of Operations is responsible for the clinical and operational nursing direction of their designated clinical region (s) as applicable.
 - a. Takes reasonable steps to ensure that:
 - i. The patient care services provided are in compliance with regulatory standards, licensing requirements and align with policies.
 - ii. Coordinate with the Quality Improvement department to develop, implement, monitor and ensure safe, effective and efficient Quality services.
 - iii. Review all events related to the scope of patient care services.
 - iv. Development of personnel qualifications and assignment of personnel.
 - v. Care/services provided by agency personnel and contracted agency personnel are coordinated and integrated.
 - vi. Ensure policies and procedures, which guide and support the provision of care/services are implemented and followed.
 - vii. Make recommendations for resources needed and communicate through appropriate channels for resolution.
2. The Nursing Manager/ADON is qualified and possesses appropriate clinical training and experience, as verified by:
 - a. Review of education, training, and previous work experience.
 - b. Verification of licensure, education.
 - c. Interview for understanding of care/service being provided as well as population being served.
 - d. Management experience and clinical knowledge.
 - e. Adheres to applicable state licensing and certification of health

agencies, as applicable.

- f. It is the responsibility of the employee's Nurse Manager to ensure that professionally licensed individuals practice within their scope of practice for the states in which the employee is licensed.
 - g. As State Practice Acts vary state to state, it is imperative that the employee's Nurse Manager be aware of the rules and regulations that affect the Regions the manager is responsible for.
3. Supervision of clinical services is available twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week by the Nursing Manager/ADON/ or his/her designees. The Nurse Manager/Area Director of Nursing (ADON) or his/her designee shall be available on the premises or immediately accessible by telecommunications during operating hours when patients are receiving services. Observation and evaluation of direct care personnel performing their job duties will be performed by qualified personnel at least annually and/or in accordance with state and federal regulations. This activity may be performed as part of a supervisory visit and will be documented as part of the personnel record.
 4. The Nurse Manager/DON/ are responsible for the oversight of daily nursing operations through consultation and collaboration with other operational team members.
 - a. Team members are reviewed in combination with the patient census, acuity, etc.
 - b. If team members are limited, the Nurse Manager/ADON or will review options which include but are not limited to:
 - i. Use of outside, contracted agency personnel.
 - ii. Use of overtime by agency employees.
 - iii. Communicating any issue not resolved by the to the attention of the Nurse Manager/ADON.
 5. The Nurse Manager directly reports to their designated Director of Nursing and or Senior Nurse Manager.
 6. The Director of Nursing maintains the agency's compliance with state and federal guidelines for disciplines in combination with the Senior Manager of Quality, Regulatory, Education and Manager of Quality.
 7. The Nurse Manger/ADON has access to qualified clinical consultation for services outside his/her expertise, using Nurse Educators, Corporate Clinical Services and other leaders within the organization with expertise.

Nursing Licensure Verification and Maintenance:

1. Verifications of licensure and education are maintained and monitored by the Manager of Credentialing and HR and communicated to the Nurse Manager/ADON and VP of Operations
 - a. Naven Credentialing and Recruitment is responsible for primary verification of current licensure upon hire.

Supervision of Clinical Nursing Services

- b. Credentialing in collaboration with licensed team members is responsible for entering and maintaining their licensure in the human resource management system.
- c. In collaboration with the Credentialing Department, is responsible to ensure re-verification with a primary source (i.e., state website) that all licensed clinicians hold a valid license (renewal).
- d. Primary source verification of current licensure and certification is conducted upon hire, and thereafter no later than scheduled expiration or no less than annually.
- e. All licenses will be maintained and tracked for all team members in the human resource management system.
- f. The following license attributes need to be tracked:
 - i. Expiration dates
 - ii. License numbers
- g. Any personnel required to maintain an individual professional license to perform their job duties shall obtain the license as required by law or regulation. The individual employee shall be responsible for obtaining, maintaining, and updating personal licenses and insurance (as applicable).
- h. Employees practicing in bordering states are responsible for obtaining/maintaining/updating appropriate licensures according to state law and regulation.
- i. If any employee's license should ever become invalid or the employee is put on official probation by the state licensing board, it is the employee's responsibility to notify their immediate supervisor within 24 hours of being made aware of their license's change in status. The employee is to discuss with their immediate supervisor/manager prior to performing any work-related activity.
- j. Employees without a valid license may not perform duties for which a license is required.
 - i. If an employee's license is not renewed, put on probation or revoked, the employee may be assigned to non-licensed duties or their employment may be terminated, after the case is reviewed with HR to determine the appropriate course of action.

Education and Training of Nursing Personnel:

1. Orientation of newly hired clinical team members is a systematic process that involves the Credentialing Department, Nurse Educators and Nurse Managers.
2. All newly hired nurses are required to have a skills assessment and Supervisory visit before proceeding with a formal independent assignments.
3. Assigned Workday modules and competency assessment is completed within the orientation period.

4. Nurse Managers/DONs are responsible for alerting the Nurse Educators if additional learning or training needs are identified.
5. Performance Evaluations are the responsibility of the Nurse Manager/ADON for all nursing field personnel.

PURPOSE:

To establish a standardized and comprehensive process for credentialing and recredentialing licensed clinicians at Naven Health, a wholly owned subsidiary of Option Care Health.

POLICY:

1. Naven Health assures consumer safety and provision of nursing services are provided by competent and qualified nurses by implementing a comprehensive credentialing and recredentialing policy.
2. Failure to comply with this Policy may result in disciplinary actions up to and including termination of employment.

PROCEDURE:

1. The Corporate Human Resources Credentialing Department is responsible for primary verification of current licensure upon hire.
2. The licensed team member is responsible for maintaining their licensure and reporting any changes and updates to the Naven Health credentialing team so updates can be made in the human resource management system.
3. The Naven Health credentialing team is responsible for re-verifying with primary source verification that all licensed nurses hold a valid license. A primary source is the original organization, board, or source of a certain credential that can verify the accuracy of the credential reported by an individual employee. A primary source verification is received directly from the issuing source, for example, a board of pharmacy website.
4. Licenses or certifications should be verified with a primary source for nurses, licensed practical nurses and any other applicable ancillary services under Home Health Agencies as required by state regulation. If required by state regulation, evidence of the primary source verification will be saved for future review when necessary.
5. Primary source verification of current licensure and certification is conducted upon hire, and thereafter no later than scheduled expiration or no less than annually.
6. Source verification documents for Joint Commission accredited sites will be maintained via the human resource management system.
7. All licenses will be maintained and tracked for all team members in the human resource management system.
8. The following license attributes need to be tracked:
 - a. Expiration dates
 - b. License numbers


Clinical License Verification

9. If required by the state, hard copies of licenses should be posted in the office.

EXPIRED LICENSE, SUSPENDED LICENSE OR DISCIPLINARY ACTION AGAINST LICENSE:

1. If a clinician is determined to be working with an invalid license, the employee will be immediately suspended from clinical duties until license has been reinstated and reported to corporate human resources.
2. These are situations that may result in disciplinary action, up to and including termination:
 - a. Professional license is expired
 - b. Professional license has a disciplinary action against it
 - c. Professional license is suspended
 - d. Professional license is revoked
3. Notification when license is expired, has discipline action, suspension or revocation.
 - a. Team members are required to notify their manager or human resources of any adverse change in licensure or certification status prior to the next scheduled patient visit or shift.
 - b. Naven Health Corporate Legal, Corporate Compliance and other applicable agencies are notified as required.

PURPOSE:

To identify mechanisms to assist with the development of a competency assessment program for all patient care and service staff members.

To identify and provide the appropriate number of competent staff to meet the needs of the patients served.

POLICY:

1. Naven Health will follow a standardized competency assessment program that allows for measurable assessment of competence of staff who provide care and services.
2. The competency program will consider the care and services provided and the ages and types of populations served.
3. A competency assessment must be performed:
 - a. When a new team member is hired
 - b. When a team member changes roles or job descriptions
 - c. Annually
 - d. If the team member was previously evaluated as unsatisfactory during the competence review.
 - e. When identified trends or specific events indicate all employees or a specific employee needs additional training or supervision.
4. The assessment methods used in determining competence may include but are not limited to:
 - a. Observation (by supervisor or other qualified, competent individual)
 - b. Educational materials with written testing
 - c. Annual Competency Checklists based on each job description, if applicable
5. Each nurse will complete clinical education as indicated in their orientation and competency/skills checklist upon hire.
6. Annually, each nurse will complete an annual competency per policy or annual checklist based on their job description.
7. Naven Health has established minimum requirements re: training, education, and experience for each nurse. These criteria will be included in the employee's job description and validated through personal interview, job history and verification of education and licensure.
8. Supervisory and management staff will be assessed as part of orientation and at least

annually. The assessment will be conducted by another qualified individual who has demonstrated competency.


9. All supervisors and managers as well as all staff who perform direct patient care will be observed by a qualified supervisor at least annually or more frequently as issues are identified. Supervisory visits may occur in the AIS or patient's home for new hires, and may occur in the AIS, home or virtually for annual review of existing employees. Any performance issues identified will be documented and an appropriate plan for improvement will be completed.
10. Naven Health clinical, operational, and educational leaders will collect and analyze data to assess staff competence and pinpoint training needs. Sources for data analysis may include:
 - a. Performance evaluations
 - b. Skills checklists
 - c. Client satisfaction surveys
 - d. Employee needs assessment
 - e. Event Management System trends
 - f. Medical record reviews
 - g. In-service and CE attendance

Failure to comply with this Policy may result in disciplinary actions up to and including termination of employment.

Purpose:

The purpose of this policy is to explain the requirements for education upon hire as well as annually and explain how these are tracked within the system.

DEFINITIONS:

“Naven Health Team Members” includes employees, personnel and/or individuals performing services at or on behalf of Naven Health including independent contractors, agency and temporary staff, volunteers, students, contract workers, and vendors, as well as other persons who, in the performance of work at Naven Health are under the direct control of Naven Health, whether or not they are paid by Naven Health, a wholly owned subsidiary of Option Care Health.

POLICY:

1. All Naven Health Team Members shall participate in an orientation and education program. Policies pertinent to their job description and responsibilities will be presented/reviewed upon hire and when updated.
2. In-service presentations are available in the Learning Management System to meet the annual in-service program (AIP) and educational requirements. Refer to Annual Training Calendar for the schedule of Annual In-Services. Requirements for completion of AIP's are 30 days upon hire and by September 30 for all other Naven Health Team Members.
3. Naven Health Team Members may receive training through continuing education programs, staff meeting presentations, journal articles, video and audio tapes, teleconferences, web-conferences, product demonstrations from manufacturers, self-study programs, and in-service presentations.
4. Nurses receive education as needed on current drug information and when indicated for new drugs/therapies administered.
5. Managers and Supervisors are encouraged to complete in-services, and continuing education modules as needed to improve their supervisory and management skills.
6. All licensed nurses are required to complete Continuing Education (CE) hours as specified in their state practice acts to maintain their license and certifications. Copies of CE obtained shall be available to management upon request and may be filed in the employee's personnel record. As applicable, educational programs should be designed to assist staff with work-related issues of grief, loss and change along with pain and symptom management.
7. Specific state, Medicare, and accreditation required in-services are conducted as needed.
8. All training will be documented in the learning management platform or staff meeting log verifying all attendees.
9. In-service logs and self-study certificates may be kept in an employee's personnel

record if deemed per state regulations.

Clinical Education

1. Nurses will complete clinical education training on therapies and programs provided as part of their new hire competency and orientation.
2. Post-test answers and evaluations are required after each learning module. The user must attain a passing score (based on number of questions and content). If an individual does not pass the post-test the user shall repeat the training and retake the exam until they attain a passing score.
3. If the individual is unable to pass the post test, then the team member shall inform their manager or educator. The manager/educator shall work with the employee to ensure comprehension of the material and coach the employee through the post-test. *By completing a post-test, the participant attests that the test was completed independently and reflects their own work.*

Completion of Annual Education In-Services and Assigned Courses

In order to ensure all Naven Health Team Members, remain compliant with the annual in-service program (AIP) education and modules are completed on time by scheduled due date, Naven Health will enlist the following strategy:

1. A completion report will be available from the learning management system (LMS) to provide information for managers of the Naven Health Team Members that have not completed the required training(s) by the scheduled due date(s).
2. If a Naven Health Team Member completes all AIP and required education in the LMS as scheduled, no action will be taken. Naven Health team members will be in compliance with this policy.
3. For new Naven Health Team Members AIPs are assigned upon hire and due 30 days after hire date. Annually, all AIP courses are assigned on April 1 and due September 30 each year.
4. Any additional assigned learning in the LMS shall be completed by the due date in the system.
5. For those Naven Health Team Members that do not complete the AIP/required assigned learning in the LMS as scheduled, the following steps will be initiated within 30 days after the original due date of course:
 - a. A verbal warning will be issued for the first instance of non-compliance, in the past 12-month period, that the course was not completed as scheduled.
 - b. A written warning will be issued if more than one AIP/required assigned learning was not completed as scheduled in a 12-month period, or if a verbal warning was issued in the past 12 months for the same event.
 - c. Further action, up to and including termination, may occur if previous verbal or written warnings have been issued for non-compliance with completion of assigned courses.

Naven Health Education Department and Nurse Manager will track the completion of these competencies and required annual competencies. The Naven Health Education Department will communicate with the Nurse Manager. The Nurse Manager will be expected to follow through with any disciplinary actions.

PURPOSE:

The purpose of this policy is to ensure that all nurses have the necessary skills and competencies to perform their duties safely and effectively. It creates a standard process for validating, assessing, and documenting skills to meet regulatory requirements, support continuous improvement, and maintain high standards of quality and safety.

POLICY:

Nursing Team Members

1. All new nurses shall attend Skills Validation training provided by the Education Team.
2. Clinical education shall be offered & provided routinely, and new nurses are automatically invited to skills sessions based on their hire dates.
3. A skills validation checklist will be completed for each employee. This form shall be used to document the attendance of skills validation for all new nurses. The skills validation checklist should reflect the comprehensive list of skill sets to be reviewed and observed during the skills validation training session.
4. Team members will complete each item on the checklist, as well as, completion of required courses in Workday, and items that will pertain to any service they will provide and carry out while conducting a patient visit and/ or performing their normal job duties. Area Educators will assist and support the new nurses until they are competent to conduct visits and complete tasks independently.
5. The assessment tools and methods used in determining competence may include but are not limited to:
 - a. Direct observation (by area Educator, nurse manager, or a qualified nurse). Workday modules with documented testing. Completion of an exam or quiz.
 - b. Skills Validation Session
 - c. Supervisory Visit
6. Additional training modules are available for the following areas of clinical expertise. These competencies must be reviewed and documented prior to contact with these patient populations.
 - a. Oncology/Chemotherapy
 - b. Vyjuvek patients
 - c. Pneumococcal Vaccine Patients

Nursing Orientation, Competency Assessment, and Skills Validation Checklist

- d. Immune Globulin patients
7. Documentation of completion of the checklist shall be retained in the team member's personnel file in Alayacare.
8. Failure to comply with this Policy within the scheduled time frame may result in disciplinary actions up to and including termination of employment.

All Infusion Nurses

1. Nursing skills validation & competency assessment is based upon those needs deemed "as required" to service the specific patient population.
2. skill levels shall be assessed by direct observation during supervisory visits with an experienced nurse or via process simulation (i.e., virtual setting). Supervisory visits must occur upon hire and annually. Direct observation of competency shall occur prior to independently seeing patients.
3. The area Educator shall evaluate the employee for each competency required using the skills checklists, and supervisory visit checklists available. Specific nursing skills shall be assessed *prior* to the employee making a patient visit independently. This can be done by the area educator, nurse manager, or an experienced infusion RN. (See the Supervisory Visit Checklist).
4. Competency assessment must be performed:
 - a. As part of orientation to determine skill level and what specific training may be required.
 - b. Annually.
 - c. Whenever the employee is using a new piece of equipment, learning a new procedure and prior to the nurse performing new skills independently. No direct care personnel may independently perform a task or skill for which they were not evaluated or evaluated as unsatisfactory during the competence review.
 - d. When trending or reporting systems indicate the team member needs additional training or supervision.
5. The area Educator or nurse manager shall document under the comments section follow-up action or steps to be taken as remedy for any required skill that the employee requires further review or assessment. This documentation shall be included in the employee's personnel file in Alayacare.

SECTION 2: EMPLOYMENT AND TEAM MEMBER PRACTICES

Equal Employment Opportunity

Option Care Health subscribes to a policy of equal employment opportunity, making employment available without regard to race, color, religion, national origin, ancestry, citizenship or immigration status, sex (including pregnancy, lactation, childbirth or related medical conditions), sexual orientation, gender identity, age (40 and over), physical or mental disability of an otherwise qualified individual, veteran status, uniformed servicemember status, or genetic information (including testing and characteristics), or any other status protected by applicable federal, state, or local law (collectively, “Protected Characteristics”). Our commitment to equal opportunity employment applies to all persons involved in our operations and prohibits unlawful discrimination by any team member, including supervisors and co-workers. Bans on discriminatory treatment cover employment applicants, interns, and team members.

The Company will recruit, hire, train, and promote persons in all job titles, and ensure that all other personnel actions are administered, without regard to Protected Characteristics and will ensure that all employment decisions are based only on valid job requirements.

Employment of Excluded Individuals

Option Care Health will exercise due care to reasonably assure that individuals, physicians, or other entities that have been excluded from participation in federal healthcare programs are not employed by or permitted to do business with Option Care Health.

Team members, vendors, physicians, and other temporary team members or other independent contractors with whom Option Care Health conducts business will be screened against both the General Services Administration (GSA) "List of Parties Excluded from Federal Procurement and Non-procurement Programs" and the Office of Inspector General's (OIG) "List of Excluded Individuals/Entities."

Screenings will be conducted prior to hiring or entering business relationships and periodically thereafter. Team members are required to cooperate in the screening process. Additionally, team members who are aware of their exclusion have a duty to report it to the Chief Compliance Officer.

If an individual's or entity's name appears on either exclusion list, the business dealings with that individual or entity which could result in payment from a federal or state healthcare program will be reviewed and appropriate remedial action taken as necessary to assure Option Care Health's compliance, up to and including immediate termination of employment or contract.

Background Check Screening Policy

Criminal Background Checks

Option Care Health is committed to high standards of integrity. The Company obtains and reviews relevant criminal background information about applicants for employment to select and retain the most qualified team members with the end goal of maintaining a safe and secure work environment. Therefore, a criminal background check is required for applicants and may be required for current team members and others to the fullest extent permitted by law. The purpose of a criminal background check is to protect the Company, its team members, customers, and others with whom Option Care Health does business from events that may threaten the security, safety and/or integrity of the work environment. All background checks will be conducted in strict conformity with the federal Fair Credit Reporting Act, applicable state and local fair credit reporting laws, and state and applicable discrimination and privacy laws. The Company is an equal opportunity employer and will comply with applicable federal, state, and local laws relating to the use of background checks for employment purposes.

Pre-employment Criminal Background Checks

Background checks provide additional applicant-related information that helps determine an applicant's

eligibility for the position applied for and assesses the qualifications and suitability of an applicant for a position.

Option Care Health requires a criminal background check for all job applicants once a conditional offer of employment has been extended to the fullest extent permitted by law. To the extent permitted by applicable law, employment is contingent upon passing the criminal background check, and no applicants shall be permitted to begin working for the Company before they have completed and passed a background check.

In accordance with applicable law, a previous conviction does not automatically disqualify an applicant from consideration for employment with Option Care Health. In the event an applicant's background check reveals that the applicant has a criminal conviction, the Company will give the applicant the opportunity to submit additional information regarding the circumstances surrounding the conviction before determining the applicant's eligibility for employment.

An applicant who withholds information or provides false, incomplete, or misleading information may be disqualified from employment on that basis. Option Care Health will not hire or conduct business with any person or entity that has been excluded or de-barred from participation in any federally funded program. The Company will conduct monthly screenings of all personnel and contractors against government exclusion databases.

Professional Registrations and Membership

Team members are encouraged to secure home state professional registration and membership in professional organizations. Registration fees, membership dues, meeting fees, etc. will be the responsibility of the team member.

Should the Company request that a team member secure additional professional registrations or memberships, all expenses incurred will be reimbursed by the Company. Also, if a full-time team member incurs any fees to take examinations for requested or required out of state licenses or certifications those exams fees will be reimbursed.

Definitions

Professional Registration: A certificate or license issued by a state to denote professional status.

Satisfactory Completion: Is evidenced by the award of a certificate or license to a team member by an authorized state agency upon the fulfillment of all requirements for professional registration.

Actual Expense: Upon showing evidence of satisfactory completion, team members will be reimbursed in full for all fees required to take examinations and receive certificates or licenses. In addition, fees for maintaining registration will be reimbursed, if the Company has requested the team member to obtain additional registrations or memberships.

Home State: In most cases, this will be the state in which the team member's assigned office is located.

Management will be responsible for determining where and when professional registration is necessary and will select the team members to become registered. If a team member is required to register at the Company's direction, the cost will be paid by the Company. Team members selected will make arrangements to obtain, complete and submit all the necessary registration forms and must submit any costs for reimbursement.

Recertification Expenses

Team members who maintain the above certifications through continuing education credits may submit recertification expenses for reimbursement.

Performance Evaluation

Full-time and part-time team members will receive Performance Evaluations and development counseling by their supervisor on a bi-annual basis. Per diem team members will receive Performance Evaluations and development counseling annually.

The purpose of the Performance Evaluation is to provide the Company, the team member's manager, and the team member with meaningful information about the team member's work. The process allows for making decisions regarding training, compensation, promotion, assignments, retention, and long-range planning.

Each year, it is the supervisor's responsibility to evaluate the team member's performance. The supervisor should:

1. Establish performance plans and goals and provide on-going feedback throughout the year to avoid surprises at the annual evaluation.
2. Conduct a formal, scheduled, and engaging feedback and coaching session.
3. Document the performance discussion through the Workday process.

The performance evaluation is intended to:

1. Assess performance over the review period
2. Review accomplishment of goals
3. Set future objectives and goals

Team members are generally allowed to respond to the Performance Evaluation and may do so in the Workday performance management process. A team member who is in violation of Company rules, policies and/or procedures, or has a performance problem requiring corrective action, may be subject to disciplinary action.

A positive performance review does not guarantee a salary increase or a promotion. These decisions are made at the discretion of the Company and depend on several factors in addition to a team member's individual performance.

We reserve the right to make any personnel changes (including termination) before or after performance evaluations.

Attachment 10C: Description of Payor Table

As discussed in response to Question 8C as well as the response to #8 in the Standards and Criteria included as [Attachment 1N](#), Naven does not directly bill payors for its services. Rather, Naven charges its partnering specialty pharmacies a fee for its services and the specialty pharmacies bill the appropriate payors, including various state and federal revenue programs. The specialty pharmacies, as in past home infusion projects the HFC has approved, typically bill payors for the costs of administering the infusion medications and not directly for home health services.

Although Naven does not and will not contract directly with Medicare, TennCare/Medicaid, or other state and federal payor programs, the proposed project will serve patients covered under these programs via Naven's arrangements with its specialty pharmacy partners. The foundation of Naven's service and staffing model is, and will remain, partnering with specialty pharmacies to provide infusion nursing care. These specialty pharmacies maintain existing contracts with Medicare, TennCare/Medicaid managed care organizations, and other programs serving medically indigent patients. As a result, Naven anticipates serving a patient population that reflects the payor mixes of its specialty pharmacy partners — including Medicare beneficiaries, TennCare/Medicaid enrollees, and medically indigent patients who might otherwise face significant barriers to accessing specialty infusion services.

Naven will provide home infusion nursing and care services to any patient referred by a contracting specialty pharmacy, regardless of that patient's payor status or coverage source. In line with this, Naven is aware that many of its specialty pharmacy partners provide charity care for their patients. Indeed, 2025 JAR for Home Health Agencies data support that its partnering specialty pharmacies do so. Because Naven will accept all medically appropriate patients referred from its specialty pharmacy partners, the project is sure to be broadly accessible to Tennessee's most medically vulnerable populations.

Finally, because Naven's revenue is generated through its contractual arrangements with specialty pharmacies rather than through direct payor billing, gross operating revenue by payor classification is not directly determinable at the project level. However, to the extent that payor classification data is available through Naven's pharmacy partners, Naven is committed to ensuring that the benefits of the proposed project extend equitably to Medicare, TennCare/Medicaid, and medically indigent patients throughout the entire 95-county service area.

Response : Yes, Naven’s specialty pharmacy partners hold primary responsibility for seeking and receiving reimbursement from all payors. Naven will charge its specialty pharmacy partners a fee for its nursing services. This structure does not vary by payor. Please see Attachment 10C, included with Naven’s application, for a more detailed explanation of Naven’s arrangement with its specialty pharmacy partners.

2. 5C. License/Certification

It is noted the applicant contracts with over 30 existing specialty pharmacies to provide comprehensive infusion services. Please clarify if the applicant has registered as a temporary health care staffing agency with the Health Facilities Commission. Response : Naven has not registered as a temporary health care staffing agency as this registration does not apply to Naven’s services. For several reasons, Naven does not meet the definition of a “temporary healthcare staffing agency” under Tennessee law, including that it does not provide staffing services to nursing homes or assisted care living facilities.
