CALL TO ORDER:

The meeting was called to order at 9:00 a.m. by Mr. Chinn with the following members present: Shaffer, Jordan, Patric, Jerman, Duckett, Scarboro, Pinkney, and Chinn. A quorum was established with eight members being present.

DIRECTOR'S ANNOUNCEMENTS

The December meeting has been canceled because the review cycle would not be completed by the meeting date, so all applications have been deferred to the January meeting.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Mr. Chinn presented the October 26, 2022 minutes for approval.

Ms. Jordan moved for approval with Dr. Patric providing the second.

The motion CARRIED [8-o-o] unanimously by voice vote. APPROVED.

CERTIFICATE OF NEED APPLICATIONS

PC 557 eliminated TCA § 68-11-1616, which had provided that "each decision rendered by the Health Facilities Commission shall include written documentation and explanation of the factual and legal basis upon which the agency grants or denies the Certificate of Need." PC 557 only requires this for applications that are denied.

Therefore, for applications filed on or after the effective date of the relevant portions of PC $_{557}$ ($_{10/1/2021}$), a simple motion to approve an application will suffice, and a motion to deny must include an explanation of the factual and legal basis as to why one or more of the criteria have not been met.

One Certificate of Need application was considered under the regular CON agenda.

Phillip Earhart introduced the application under consideration and it was approved.

Cumberland Medical Center, Crossville (Cumberland County), TN - CN2209-037

Request: The addition of one stationary 1.5T Magnetic Resonance Imaging (MRI) unit located at 28 Hayes Street, Crossville (Cumberland County), TN 38555. The proposed MRI will be located across the street from the main hospital in a building currently used for other diagnostic imaging services. The applicant currently has two (2) MRI units in the main hospital building. The proposed service area includes Cumberland County, Tennessee. The applicant is owned by Covenant Health. Estimated project cost: \$338,000.

Mr. Scarboro moved for approval with Dr. Patric providing the second.

Eight members voted to approve the application— Shaffer, Jordan, Pinkney, Patric, Scarboro, Jerman, Duckett, and Chinn. The motion CARRIED [8-o-o].

Behavioral Healthcare Center of Clarksville, Clarksville (Montgomery County), TN - CN2203-011

Request: The establishment of an acute care hospital located at 930 Professional Park Drive, Clarksville (Montgomery County), TN 37040. The applicant proposes to convert its 26-bed mental health facility licensed by the Tennessee Department of Mental and Substance Abuse Services to an acute care hospital licensed by Tennessee Health Facilities Commission. The proposed service area includes Cheatham, Davidson, Dickson, Houston, Humphreys, Montgomery, Robertson, and Sumner Counties. The applicant is owned by Behavioral Healthcare Center of Clarksville, LLC d/b/a Unity Psychiatric Care. The estimated project cost is \$1,244,726.

WITHDRAWN: 11-3-2022

OPPOSITION: Senator Bill Powers, Tennova Healthcare-Clarksville, County Mayor Jim Durrett, Mayor Joe Pitts, and Representative Curtis Johnson.

Versa Surgery Center, Memphis (Shelby County), TN - CN2207-032

Request: The establishment of an ambulatory surgical treatment center (ASTC) limited to the specialty of gynecology. The ASTC will be located at 3251 Players Club Parkway, Memphis (Shelby County), TN 38125. The proposed service area includes Shelby County. The applicant is owned by Versa LLC. The estimated project cost is \$2,992,357.

WITHDRAWN: 11-11-2022

OPPOSITION: Methodist Healthcare-Methodist Hospitals, Memphis Surgery Center, and Baptist Memorial Hospital-Memphis, Baptist Memorial Hospital for Women, Baptist Memorial Hospital-Collierville, and Baptist Memorial Health Services Inc.
