The Tennessee Afterschool network supports children, youth and families by building access to healthy and nurturing afterschool and summer learning experiences. Out-of-school-time programs give parents peace of mind, allow them to work a full schedule, and help them be more productive on the job and successful in their careers, including our essential workers. They also offer social and emotional support and enriching activities that spark kids' interest in school and learning. Research shows that students participating in high-quality afterschool programs are less likely to abuse drugs or alcohol; are more likely to advance to the next grade and graduate from high school; earn higher grades and do better on standardized tests. Some out-of-school-time programs even provide opportunities for youth to gain employability skills, connect with local businesses, and explore possible careers.

With the help of community raised funds, Friends of Radnor Lake recently invested \$350,000 to build three new ADA accessible bridges at Radnor Lake which improve access to the park's most used trail. Founded in 1971, Friends of Radnor Lake is passionate about our mission to protect, preserve and promote the natural integrity of Radnor Lake State Natural Area through land acquisition, environmental education and park support. Founded by a group of concerned citizens when the lake and surrounding hills were threatened by residential development almost 50 years ago, Friends of Radnor Lake partners with the State of Tennessee to protect this ecosystem through land acquisitions which protect the viewshed and watershed; volunteer program which supports community engagement, trail maintenance, trail expansion, waterways cleanliness and invasive plant removal; historic and vegetative research; native grasslands planting to support pollinators, Monarch butterflies and ground-nesting birds; Jr. Rangers Intern Program; and other various needs of the park. This year, Friends of Radnor Lake joins Radnor Lake State Natural Area in celebrating 50 years since Radnor Lake opened as one of the first State Natural Areas in Tennessee. GELF pursues its mission through six key programs: Birth-5 Book Delivery, delivering books each month to children from birth to age five through Dolly Parton's Imagination Library (serves approx. 285K children monthly and has delivered 50.2M+ books); K-3 Home Libraries, delivering quality books and literacy resources to combat learning loss (served approx. 215K children, school librarians, and teachers in 2023); Caregiver Engagement, equipping caregivers to be deeply engaged as a child's first teacher (serves 208K+ caregivers); Book Buses, establishing mobile libraries to provide children access to high-quality literacy resources (serves approx. 60K annually); Storybook Trails, creating outdoor experiences for families to interact through literacy and physical activity (serves approx. 630K individuals annually); and the Statewide Early Literacy Education Collaborative of Tennessee (SELECT), and initiative to unite TN's early literacy organizations to improve outcomes for the millions of children we collectively serve (currently involves 250 individuals representing 83 partner organizations). The mission of RISE is to help people to become self-sufficient by building and sustaining human and financial assets. RISE helps families to budget, save and accumulate assets (GMFEC, Save Up and Common Cents). Our innovations equip youth with financial literacy tools to help them become financially accountable early in life (Goal Card and Goal Card Career Forum), and because elderly citizens are so often unaware of available benefits, they often fall prey to malicious scams that rob them of their finances and dignity, RISE helps protect them (Silver Neighbors). RISE uniquely assists the economically vulnerable in tackling generational poverty by empowering them to move their families toward self-sufficiency. Using tailored curriculum designed to meet them where they are with financial literacy tools and matching incentives, low to moderate income residents can enroll in the RISE Save Up Program and gain knowledge to develop and maintain banking relationships, create business plans, or prepare to embark on secondary educations. Participants build budgets and spending plans towards asset purchases which include accruing \$1k in savings that are eligible for a 2:1 match from RISE; to date \$10.2 million dollars in asset purchases have been accumulated. RISE has now expanded its programming targeting youth, adults and seniors in Memphis to include the Greater Memphis Financial Empowerment Center (GMFEC). GMFEC provides free one-on-one financial counseling to adult residents of Shelby County, regardless of income, for up to one year.
